We rescheduled our Nov. meeting to October 29 and had Tim Crawford come in for our session. Tim gave us a lot of insight about what is happening with square dancing around the country. He talked of recruiting successes and spent quite a bit of time talking about "alternative learning situations" ("Blitz" and "Blast" classes where the calls are taught in a very short amount of time) There are quite a few areas of the country that are experimenting with these types of alternative learning programs. He also said that CALLERLAB (the International Association of Square Dance Callers) is encourgaing all callers and dancers to try different types of recruiting and learning programs and is really interested in success stories that they can promote to the square dance public.

Will Herzog read the Federation meeting minutes and we discussed some of the proposed changes to Dance-0Rama. We all unanmiously agreed that the Leadership Award SHOULD CONTINUE to be given at Dance-O-Rama and NOT be moved to the Cabin Party.

At our next meeting in on December 3, a new choreography system for moving dancers (CRAMS: Controlled Resolution \& Mainipulation System) will be discussed.

1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.
3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..
4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.
