Mary Manning, known as "Mirf," passed away on May 8, 2008.

Although short in stature, Mirf was high in energy and the excitement of dancing. She always had a twinkle in her eye. She and her husband, Jack, began dancing in 1982. Jack passed away in 1996.

Over the years, they square and round danced with many clubs, including: Tecumseh Squares, Silver Squares (where they served as social directors), RF Squares, Cloverleaf Squares, Country Twirlers, Dip 'N Twist, Rimon Squares, Merry-Go-Rounds, and Promenading B's. They were Rochester Area Federation representatives in 1990-91.

The Mannings also attended many conventions. They especially enjoyed the annual "Fling Fantastic" in Canada, where they participated in the after-dance skits. Memorable among these was "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs."

In Memoriam

H. Orlo Hoadley passed away on April 17, 2008. He is survived by his wife of 40 years, Rita, and many family members. A 45-year retiree of Eastman Kodak Co. Research Labs, he was an active square dancer and choreographer.

Orlo was a member of the founding committee of the Genesee Dancers in 1956, and the founding committee of the Rochester Area Federation in 1959. He had dancing experience from 1955 to 1961. He

served on the D.O.R. committee, and was a board member and treasurer of EKCO Squares.

Orlo and his wife Rita began dancing in 1968. They received the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award in 1982. He wrote several books for callers on choreography and timing, and articles for *American Square Dance* magazine and callers' note services around the country. He was a charter member of Callers Co-op, organized in 1970. and served as their moderator in 1986-87. Rita was treasurer from 1986 to 1992. They served as program directors, presidents, treasurers, and Fed-



eration reps for Genesee Dancers, and presidents and vice-presidents for the Federation in 1980 & '81.

Orlo served as CCR's representative to the Federation in the mid-1980s, and organized the Federation's Silver Club. He was a member of the Silver Squares, and also a round dancer. CCR co-moderator Ron Brown presented a life member certificate to Orlo at the 2008 Federation cabin party.

Orlo was a big fan of timing and believed the fun could be retained in square dancing by good timing and good flow to well-phrased music, and he wrote choreography reflecting that view. He also insisted that more variety within the Mainstream program — not more calls — was all that was needed to keep the dancers' interest. Some of his choreography is still used to this day. The level rarely exceeds more than basic, but it's plenty challenging. Much of it requires a walk thru even for advanced dancers.

We have gotten involved with raising funds to build a new Habitat Home in downtown Rochester.






