



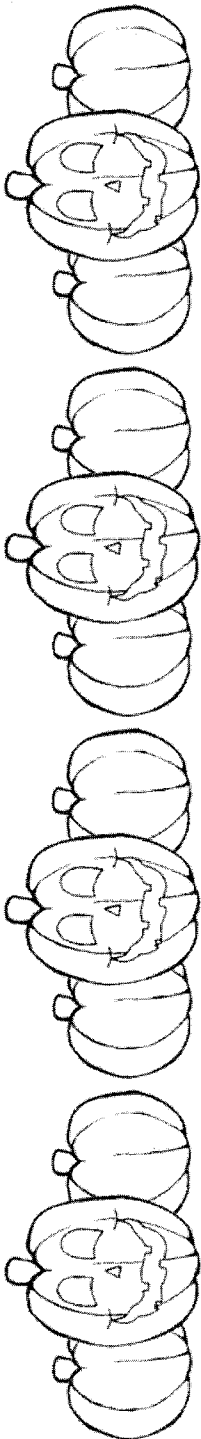

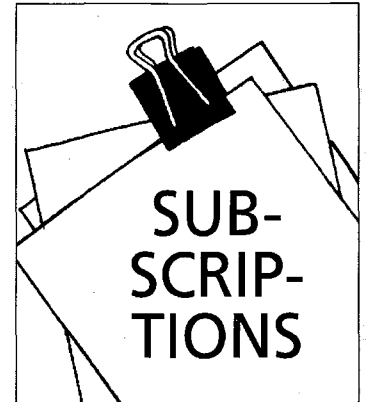

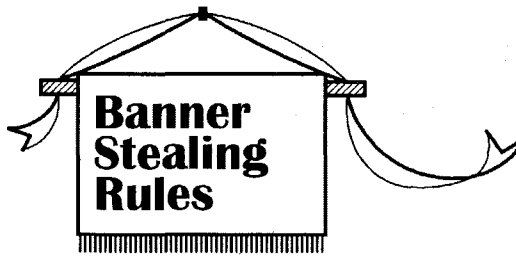
2. The **Club News** section includes reports from the clubs, arranged *in alphabetical order*, interspersed with full and partial page ads

3. In the **Schedules** section, found near the back of the *Promenader*, you can look up dances arranged according to the day of the week. Each entry includes date, club, caller/cuer, location, starting time & symbols indicating additional details.

We hope this publication will keep you as informed as possible about dancing opportunities. Please contact us if you have any suggestions.

1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance.

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.

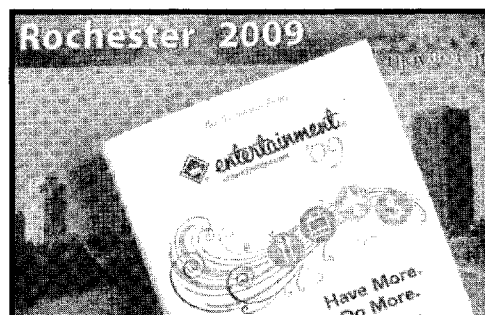

On a happier note, we would like to introduce our new co-vice president of the Federation, Barb Green. "Follow the dancing" has been Barb's motto since learning to square dance during Advanced Officer Training in the Army in San Antonio in 1980. One of the students was a caller and what better time to gather a class but when folks were permanently stationed somewhere for only six months. In 18 weeks she had graduated from Mainstream and joined the San Antonio Swinging Singles. While in Oklahoma for 42 months, she joined the Solo Squares and was introduced to the Texas Area Single Square Dance Association (TASSDA)



and attended several DARs. At her next assignment at Fort Drum, NY, she recruited eight new dancers to join her in a fall class in a club in Watertown. After leaving Fort Drum in 1995, she came to Rochester and joined the Copy Cats and Cloverleaf Squares. She has met wonderful people square dancing and will continue dancing for years to come. Barb has held various offices through the years, and we welcome her to the Board of the Federation.

We also welcome a newly appointed chair of Promotion, Eileen Okolowicz, whom you all have been introduced to as our Daphne Norma Leadership winner. In Memoriam – Dorothy J. Woodams

Dorothy J. Woodams, 80, of Hilton, died on Monday, Aug. 18, 2008, in a three-vehicle accident about a quarter-mile from the intersection of Route 104 and Old Ridge Road, east of the village of Sodus. She is survived by her husband, Robert A. Woodams; her children, Keitha Martin, and Kurt (Robin) Woodams; 5 grandchildren; 9 great-grandchildren; her sister, Helen Lasch; aunt, Margaret Thirtle; several nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her son-in-law, Howard Martin.

Bob & Dorothy Woodams began square dancing with the Boots 'n Slippers in Hilton in the early 1960s. They were intrigued by "higher level" (more intricate calls), attended a lot of square dance weekends, and by 1966 they were dancing with the Rochester Rollaways, the area "challenge" dancing club at that time. They continued dancing with Boots 'n Slippers and a caller-run (Joe Riley) club called the Sing-a-Longs which met on Sundays at the Greece Y. Dorothy and Bob dropped out of square dancing for a time as their children grew into their teen years and beyond. They came back to Boots 'n Slippers in the mid '80s. Bob stopped square dancing, so Dorothy and her daughter, Keitha danced for a while at Boots 'n Slippers and Batavia Silver Stars. Dorothy also danced for years with Silver Squares. But her first love was Advanced and Challenge Dancing. She was a faithful member of Shamrock Squares A-2 club, where she danced either as a "man" or "lady," whichever was needed. She danced for five years as the partner of one of the club members whose husband had passed away. As more singles joined that group, Dorothy would organize them each week and made sure that everyone of them had a partner for every tip. She was also a regular at the Wednesday Night Bunch C-1 group. She joined Challenge tape groups in Buffalo, Rochester, and Syracuse, and would faithfully support them whenever she could. She even went to Challenge Square Dance weekends as a single and danced up to and including the Challenge 3A level.

Not only was Dorothy an excellent dancer but she had a great heart, always had a smile and would always try to get into the square of a struggling dancer to help out and, most of all, give words of encouragement. Whether it was Basic Dancing, Challenge Dancing or anything in between, square dancing was her life and she was truly one of our area's great square dance ambassadors.

Dorothy and Bob began as Subscription Editors with the November 1993 issue of the *Promenader*, and she carried on this work for nearly 15 years. Many subscribers remember her from the annual Promenader Dance, where Dorothy was always ready with prepared sheets for each club's members to sign up and subscribe. Dorothy consolidated this information

and other subscriptions received in the mail onto her computer database, and then throughout the year, kept the database updated with new subscribers (and former subscribers who had forgotten to subscribe in time, but realized it later). She also made address changes for snowbirds wishing to have their *Promenaders* sent South part of the year. And she fielded calls and e-mails from people wanting copies or other assistance.

Prior to receiving each bi-monthly delivery of the publication from the printer, Dorothy prepared mailing labels from her subscriber database. When the printed *Promenaders* arrived, she calculated advertising percentages, subscriber numbers, and other info for the Postal forms (having attended meetings and seminars to keep apprised of postal requirements, she knew more about periodical mailing than many current postal employees). She then quickly labeled and sorted the *Promenaders* into the proper zip-code bundles and mailing sacks, and delivered them to the Hilton Post Office. Most of the time, the delivery went smoothly from that point. Once in a while, as was the case with the Aug./Sept. issue, the postal process broke down, and Dorothy had to pursue additional help from postal and non-postal channels. She was untiring in her efforts. We are going to miss that about her especially. The *Promenader* has lost a devoted worker.

As Dick Halstead noted, "we are going to miss Dorothy's encouragement on the dance floor, and in ways we have not even discovered yet."

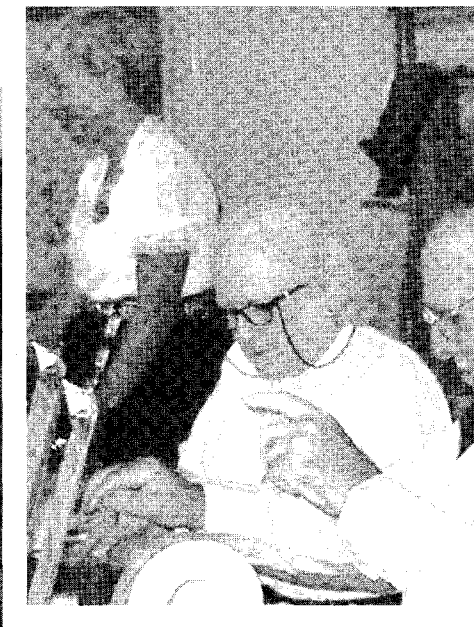
And yet we mourn Dorothy not just because of what she did, but because of who she was. More than just a doer, she was a dancer. Dancing involves an enjoyment of what you are doing, no matter how simple or complex. *Dancing is a perfect metaphor for Dorothy, not only because she was a dancer, but because she enjoyed what she did.* Whether it was needlework, or income tax calculations, working on her High School reunion, or being the subscription editor for the *Promenader*, Dorothy did not hold back, but gave her all. In the case of the *Promenader*, on which she labored for the past 15 years, that all was considerable.

As we said, one of the things Dorothy enjoyed doing frequently was going square dancing. And that was the *last* thing she did — she was on her way home from square dancing when she was called to her final home. May her spirit live on and dance with joy! God Bless You Dorothy, we'll miss you.

Dorothy Woodams delivering sacks of Promenaders to the Hilton Post Office, and taking subscriptions at the Promenader Dance.

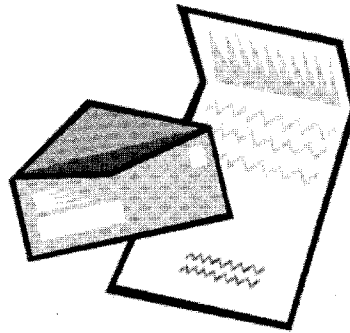

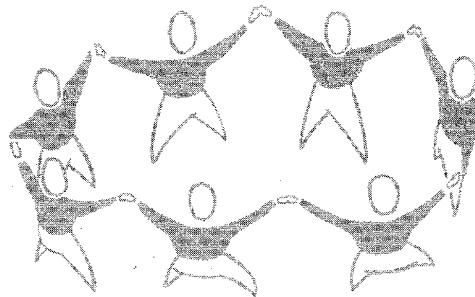

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an **ARCHED CIRCLE** will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.

Emergency Call for Medical Aid

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

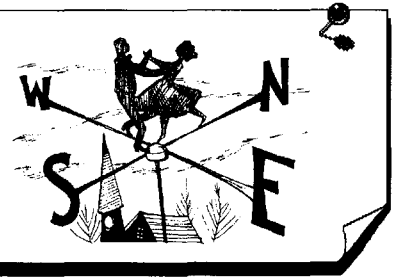
STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, according to historical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.
