



THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose 2009 of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS or national associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators initially functioned as permanent Selection Committee members. But because the Salvagios and the Finks are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank Salvagio asked Walt and Sally Baechle, and John & Daphne Fink asked Andy and Betty Ludwick, to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on October 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of

the committee. So currently, the members are Sally Baechle, Andy and Betty Ludwick, Tom and Liz Chrzanowski, Ron and Dorothy Brown, and Eileen Okolowicz.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done

by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Eileen Okolowicz, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, **new or updated information should be sent**. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info, and encouraging others to add their nomination.

- 1) Name and address of recommended couple
- 2) Years of dancing, calling and/or cueing
- 3) Club participation, offices held, etc.
- 4) Participation in local organizations (both dance and other)
- 5) Participation in state organizations (both dance and other)
- 6) Participation in national organizations (both dance and other)
- 7) Other leadership roles (not only dancing but community service)
- 8) Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

And be sure to include your own name, address and phone number (and e-mail, if you wish).

In Memoriam – Hal Abberger

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the loss of Harold Abberger, who passed away on November 12, 2008, at the age of 91.

Hal first appeared in the pages of the *Promenader* in September, 1962 – the very first issue! He was the club reporter that year for the Belles 'N' Beaus, where he and his wife, Fran, were original members. In addition, Hal's column, "A Square A Round Town," ap-



peared in the *Promenader* regularly between Oct. '76 and Jan. '83. He brought a special wit and charm to the publication, and several of his articles were reprinted in later issues.

Hal and Fran "angel"-ed for many of Belles 'N' Beaus' classes, and also traveled with the Circu-8tors. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on July 4, 1998. Hal and Frances loved Belles 'N' Beaus so much that he had the club logo engraved on the tombstone.

Pre-deceased by Fran in 1999, Hal in recent years continued to dance with Belles 'N' Beaus, and also Silver Squares, with Stell Lewis as his dancing partner. A retiree of Bausch & Lomb, Hal was also a member of the Moose Club, the Eagles Club, and the Polish Falcons.

Outlaw Tim and the Border Patrol

On 9/25/08, Tim Crawford notified the Country Twirlers that...

As ridiculous as I believe this is, I will be unable to fulfill my commitment to you as a result of a ruling by a singular border guard, who took it upon himself to charge me

under the U.S. immigration act as an "illegal immigrant"! Until today, it seemed that I would have this turned around in 30 days or less, as it was in 2005 when this happened for the first time. Today at the hearings, all agreed that this is a complete farce and that it will most definitely be fixed, but because of the nature of this one man's charge, it'll take more time. The guess is "as short as 60 days or as long as 6 months"! They offer absolutely no help with expeditious processing of the necessary paperwork! Incredibly maddening!

First I'd like to apologize for delay in getting back to you, but I have been in meetings with lawyers and U.S. consulate people in advance of today's hearing. Today I got good news that it is easily fixed, but I also got the bad news regarding the timing of that fix. I feel pretty pessimistic that this can be fixed before December.

I will call you all shortly to help you, if I can, find a replacement for the event. It is with incredible regret that I am forced to send this email to you. I cannot tell you how helpless and victimized I feel by all this.

If you would, the full true story is below, and I would appreciate you passing the "true" story on to as many people as possible. When this happened in 2005, all the notes of support, the petitions, and the letters went a very long way in getting the result that was just, and I would also be appreciative of those again!

Here's how this occurred:

In 2005 I was calling in Rochester, N.Y., and while crossing the border I was searched and asked specific questions about my calling in the States. I was not about to mislead, so I told them the truth about my calling and that I was the only caller. The border guard then seized my passport, my possessions and threatened me with arrest because I was "illegally entering the USA and working illegally." They denied me entry to the United States and advised me to get a legal opinion on that action, which I did. After \$7000 to an immigration lawyer, a U.S. consulate adjudicator, and a U.S. lawyer for opinion, my reentry and approval to enter the U.S. and call was granted. They issued me a border crossing package that has been consistently accepted by border guards literally everywhere. In mid 2005, I resumed crossing the border without delay.

Since 2007, it has been getting more and more difficult to cross the border. More questions, more searches, more delays. In August this year, I was crossing the bor-

> der to fly from Buffalo to Nashville to call for the Singles Convention. I arrived at the Border at 3 p.m. for an 8 p.m. flight and was detained at the border for secondary inspection. I was escorted to a room where I sat for nine hours, was not allowed to make a phone call, was offered not even a drink of water, and was not allowed to leave. Occasionally they would ask me questions about calling, and told me that I would need to get a Visa. Each time, I explained to them that I had been through this in 2005, and I had the "Border Crossing Package," which they refused to review. Near midnight, a singular border guard told me that I was being refused entry to the United States, and that "this time it would be for five years" as he was taking action under the "Immigration Act." When I asked why he would not consider my package, he replied that "at this border he was Judge and he was Jury." I was

escorted back to my car, then escorted back to Canada across the bridge.

This situation has forced me to repeat my \$7000 legal episode from 2007, except this time the immigration action is different, and the cost will be near \$10,000 and could take up to six months. It makes me incredibly sad that I am being treated like this, and that they would not even consider the action from a mere three years ago.

I am in the process of fighting this action, and I am assured that I will get it overturned, not so much that I want to come back and call, but because I believe that they made a mistake, and have charged me with something that I did not do...I had it all approved!

I am truly sorry that this has occurred and I will surely miss everyone in the meantime. I call because I LOVE to call, not because it's a job or a career or because I make money from it. I call because I love to do it, and I love the people, and that is motivation enough for my fight!

Again, I am sorry for all this trouble and I certainly appreciate your support and understanding.

other fun dancers to venture out with you, and before you know it, you are having as much fun as Irma and I do...well, almost!


