DeGraffs Named 2009 Daphne Norma Leadership Award Recipients

An internet search yields the following list of qualities in that represent leadership in an individual: passion, humor, empathy, strength of character, general maturity, patience, wisdom, common sense, trustworthiness, reliability, creativity, sensitivity.

The 2009 recipients of the Daphne-Norma Award, Carl and Shirley DeGraff, have demonstrated sustained leadership in the Square Dance community at a local and national level, and continue to display the qualities mentioned above.

Carl has been dancing since 1962 when he joined Teen Twirlers. He participated in many activities with this group including dancing at New York's World's Fair in 1964. He has also danced with Lima Grand Squares, Swinging Singles, and Cloverleaf Squares and has held offices in the latter two. He is currently president of Cloverleaf Squares.

Shirley has been involved with square dancing for as long as she can remember. She was exposed to the activity at a very early age when her parents were members of Boots 'n Slippers. She took lessons when she was 13 and danced with Hilton Hillbillies teen square dance club, Shirts and Skirts in Chili, and Whisk-A-Ways in Greece. She also danced with her Dad at Boots 'n Slippers.

After earning a bachelor's degree in Music Education, she joined Cloverleaf Squares where she met Carl. Shirley also belonged to Swinging Singles and has held many offices in both clubs over the years, including two years as Cloverleafs' president in 2004 and '05. She also attended a square dance leadership seminar in New Jersey in 2007.

Both Carl and Shirley served on committees when Cloverleaf Squares hosted the National Singles Dance-A-Rama, sponsored by Single Square Dancers USA in 1988 and again in 2006. Carl also serves presently as the By-laws chairman for the national organization, with Shirley as one of his committee members.

Carl and Shirley were married in 1988 and have continued to dance regularly for the 20 plus years of their marriage. They are very active with Cloverleaf squares and both angel consistently for class. At any dance, with any club, both are often found dancing with other partners to ensure that everyone present gets a chance to dance. Shirley dances both the ladies' and men's parts proficiently.

They travel often to square dance festivals and have missed only a few of the National Sin-

gles conventions that are held in a different city each year. Several years ago they added to their square dance skills by learning the Advanced calls and now dance regularly with Shamrock Squares as well.

Beyond square dancing, both Carl and Shirley are very active in their church. Carl has served as deacon, elder and for the last 10 years, has served as the church treasurer. Shirley has sung with the church choir, volunteered in the finance office, has also served as elder, and is currently serving as a deacon.

The 2009 Daphne-Norma Leadership Award committee has chosen Carl and Shirley as this year's recipients. They are true leaders in our square dance community in every respect.

In Memoriam: Lou Stevens

Bob and Lou met at the Silver Squares when they were both single. They married and started dancing with the Belles 'N' Beaus, where they were vice presidents in 1998-2000, and presidents in 2001 and 2002. They were Federation vice presidents in 2000 & 2001, and then presidents in 2002 & 2003, and served on the DOR committee for seven years. Bob and Lou were behind the effort of getting the month of September declared Square Dance Month in Monroe County.

In recent years, the Stevens divided their time between New York and Florida. They usually left for Clearwater, Fla., after they celebrated Christmas with their children who lived in the

Rochester area, and then stayed in Clearwater through April. The Stevens maintained a lovely two bedroom condominium which was situated on a golf course right in Clearwater, and they spent many hours on that course. This year they belonged to a golf league and were taking golf lessons. They often frequented the local YMCA, and Lou was taking line dance classes as well. For the first five or six years that they spent time in Clearwater, they also square danced.

Lou would have been 75 in June, and that was their anniversary month as well. The accident happened on April 14, and despite the fact that they had a substantial car (Lincoln Town Car), Lou was killed instantly when the speeding car (police estimated 90-100 mph) hit her side



of the car. That car then flipped over the top of the Steven's car and rolled several times after that. We know from driving with him many times that Bob is an excellent, careful driver. Their condominium gate keeper who saw the entire accident said they never had a chance to get out of the way. They were turning left into their home driveway, and the speeding car came from behind a slow moving car. The possibility exists that neither of them ever saw it. Lou's passing was instantaneous. Bob was on a respirator and heavily sedated after the accident, hav-

ing suffered broken ribs, punctured lung, broken vertebrae, and a crushed pelvis. It will be some time before any decision will be made on how to honor Lou's passing.

Lou had been Bob's right-hand-woman, in that she was his secretary in his law office, and did specialized work in that area for him. They loved square dancing, and put their whole hearts into the Belles 'N' Beaus and the Federation work. Lou was truly close to her daughters and their families, and often would come home from Florida for a week or so if one of the grandchildren was doing something special in school, etc. They were family people.

Lou was invariably kind and generous, and friendly to anyone who approached her. We will surely miss her.

So next time you dance to your caller or cuer, tell them how much you appreciate the enjoyment that they give you. Above all, encourage the new callers. They are the future of square dancing.


- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- **2**) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner

the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

- **3**) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..
- **4**) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
- **5**) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.
