Check for possible dates BEFORE you sign the contract with the caller/cuer, and take advantage of this service to avoid conflicts! Call (585) 247-7259.

2. SPECIAL EVENTS CALENDAR IN THE PROMENADER - \$5

Especially helpful when you have already contracted a national or interna-

tional caller/cuer, and also any time you want to make sure as many people as possible will know about your special event! This list appears on the front cover of every issue of the *Promenader* except the Aug./Sept.

Open House issue, when it appears just inside on page 3. This list is also put on the Federation web site. You can list even a year or more ahead, as long as you have the event definitely planned! And it continues to appear on the list until it happens! So get your money's worth and LIST EARLY!

Bob Stevens Update

You will recall that in Clearwater, Florida this past April, Bob and Lou Stevens were in a horrific accident when their car took a direct hit on the passenger side by another car which was traveling over 100 miles an hour. Lou died instantly, and Bob suffered injuries to the head, a collapsed lung, and spine, rib, and pelvic fractures. He spent weeks on a respirator, was unconscious for most of that time, but was kept alive with tube feedings. Miraculously, he survived but spent over four months in the hospital. He returned to Rochester August 15, and many of you saw him at Lou's funeral on September 6. We went out for lunch on the 15th, and he gets around amazingly well with a cane. He continues to work hard at physical therapy, and recently he was able to get special glasses which correct the double vision which is the result of the head injury.

Bob has expressed his great appreciation for the caring community of square dancers — "I am overwhelmed" (at the number of cards and notes of caring he received). I am certain Bob would enjoy hearing from friends with their good wishes and welcome home but would suggest that he would like to find out how you are doing rather than answering questions over and over again about the tragedy that befell him and Lou.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PER-IOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS or national associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators initially functioned as permanent Selection Committee members. But because the Salvagios and the Finks are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank Salvagio asked Walt & Sally Baechle, and John & Daphne Fink asked Andy & Betty Ludwick, to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on October 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of

the committee. So currently, the members are Sally Baechle, Andy & Betty Ludwick, Ron & Dorothy Brown, Eileen Okolowicz, and Carl & Shirley DeGraff.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Eileen Okolowicz, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, **new or updated information should be sent**. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info, and encouraging others to add their nomination.

- 1) Name and address of recommended couple
- 2) Years of dancing, calling and/or cueing
- 3) Club participation, offices held, etc.
- 4) Participation in local organizations (both dance and other)
- 5) Participation in state organizations (both dance and other)
- 6) Participation in national organizations (both dance and other)
- 7) Other leadership roles (not only dancing but community service)
- 8) Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

And be sure to include your own name, address and phone number (and e-mail, if you wish).

We began a waltz class in September and it is well attended. The class will run through December 16.


We have many new round dancers. Take a moment and encourage them to continue with their dancing.


Did you pre-register for the 59th National Square Dance Convention®?

The Steamer BELLE OF LOUISVILLE, a National Historic Landmark since 1989, serves as the Western anchor of Louisville's award winning Waterfront Park in downtown Louisville. With the playing of the calliope, the Belle, now in her 95th year, continues to beckon one and all to join her on a journey back to the time when she carried passengers and goods to ports all along the beautiful Ohio River. She was built in Pittsburg by James Rees & Sons Company for the West Memphis Packet Company in 1914. Her original name was the Idlewild. Today, the Belle of Louisville is the last river steamboat operating that was built as a packet (freight boat). No other river steamboat in American history has lasted as long, been to as many places, or traveled as many miles as the Belle of Louisville. Her name and outward appearance have changed over the years, but her steam-powered soul and structure are pure turn-of-the-century paddlewheeler.
