

This publication includes information to help Round and Square Dancers stay informed abut dance activities planned for Rochester, NY, and surrounding areas. It is divided into three parts:



THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

ADERS

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or pre-

sent the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor 2010 of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PER-IOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS or national associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators initially functioned as permanent Selection Committee members. But because the Salvagios and the Finks are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank Salvagio asked Walt & Sally Baechle, and John & Daphne Fink asked Andy & Betty Ludwick, to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on October 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder

of the committee. So currently, the members are Sally Baechle, Andy & Betty Ludwick, Ron & Dorothy Brown, Eileen Okolowicz, and Carl & Shirley DeGraff.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Eileen Okolowicz, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, **new or updated information should be sent**. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info, and encouraging others to add their nomination.

- 1) Name and address of recommended couple
- 2) Years of dancing, calling and/or cueing
- Club participation, offices held, etc.
- Participation in local organizations (both dance and other)
- 5) Participation in state organizations (both dance and other)

- 7) Other leadership roles (not only dancing but community service)
- 8) Miscellaneous information (anything else that might be relevant)

HISTORY OF COUNTRY TWIRLERS

It all began in the fall of 1958. The neighbors could hear the western music with a strange background language emitting from the basement of Bob

and Dorothy Brunshidle's home once again, and they knew from past experiences that the Brunchidles were entertaining a group of friends in their new-found love, Western Square Dancing.

For Bob and Dorothy, it had begun in the winter of 1957 as they took up square dancing with their friends Major and Martha Hanson, Fred and Helen Kolb, Fred and Dot Holderly and Red and Ev Wehle. After learning about club dancing, they decided to join a class the Genesee Dancers were plan-



ning at the Gannett Barn, located at what is now the Monroe County Fairgrounds. They became so enthused over square dancing that they went to Buffalo to purchase some records so they could share dancing with their friends

At one of these typical basement parties, the idea was born to form a square dance club on the west side of Rochester. A caller, Tink Tinkler's suggestion to form this club prompted these enterprising, fun-loving couples to send out cards to interested people. Three open dances were held in the spring of 1959 at the Long Pond Firehouse with an average attendance of eight squares. So successful were these dances that in the fall of '59, more dances were held at the Chili Grange on Chili-Scottsville Road.

In November 1959, a nominating committee was formed and presented the then unnamed club with its first officers: Bob and Dorothy Brunshidle, president; Major and Martha Hanson, vice-pres.; Fred and Helen Kolb, secretary; and Ray and Irene Callahan (Mike's parents), treasurer.

Included in the 32 charter couples were the DeGraves, Potters, Vincents, and our own Al and Esther Fiege, who have been avid supporters for 50 years, serving in nearly every office and committee.

At one of their early meetings the name "Country Twirlers" was chosen and Mrs. Tink Tinkler proceeded to design a red barn and silo which was adapted as the club badge.

Bob Brunshidle taught the Country Twirler classes until 1974. Our first club caller was Tink Tinkler, from 1959 through spring 1964. BILL BARTSCH called from 1964 TO 1966. In fall of 1966 Jim McQuade & Frank Davenport from Buffalo shared the calling. Then in 1967 Jim McQuade took over as our caller for 16 years from fall '66 until May '82. Jim died in 1996. Gert died couple years ago. In September 1982, Jack & Joan Barnes, also from Tonawanda, became our club caller. They, like Jim & Gert, were here faithfully every week, driving from Tonawanda, NY. Jack & Joan retired in summer of 1991 after 9 years.

In September of 1991, Gary Bubel took on the calling, with Alice cueing the rounds. After calling for us for 14 years, Gary announced that in May '05 he was retiring. Although he didn't actually succeed in retiring from calling, we have gone on to dance to most all of the local and many national callers.

From those humble beginnings we have survived until today we are the second oldest club in the Rochester Area Square Dance Federation. Over the years we have marched in parades, put on demonstrations at nursing homes, at the original Westgate Plaza, Gates Summer Celebration, Monroe County Fair and the New York State Fair.

We have danced at the many locations in the Gates Chili area. We currently dance on Saturday nights at Washington Irving School where we have danced since the fall of 1966. Ken and Kay Georger have been presidents of the Country Twirlers since the fall of 1995.

The Country Twirlers celebrated their 50th anniversary together with the Village Squares' 35th anniversary at a joint "85th Anniversary Dance" held at Washington Irving School on November 14, 2009.

Anyone interested in Square Dancing is welcome to visit us at any of our Saturday night dances. We dance from 8 to 10:30 p.m. on the second and fourth Saturday of the month from September to May.

HISTORY OF VILLAGE SQUARES

In June 1973, Genesee Dancers sponsored a workshop for some of its dancers who were not yet up to club level. The "Rough Edges" met for a month and, at the end of that time, voted to continue dancing through the summer.

In September '73 the "Rough Edges" decided to go out on their own, no longer affiliating with Gene-

see Dancers. With Dick Casper as their caller, they briefly continued dancing at East Rochester's Presbyterian Church, to which they would return in 1992. Led by Presidents Frank and Norma Salvaggio, the much improved Rough Edges joined the Rochester Area Federation in February 1974 under their new name, "Village Squares." Frank

Salvaggio designed the Village Squares lamp post logo and Norma's contributions to square dancing are honored by the annual Daphne-Norma award.

Chuck and Rita Myers led the club in 1975, followed by presidents Joe and Anna Jean Carracci in '76 and Ray and Frieda Lanning in '77. Until 1989, Village Squares danced at Fairport's United Methodist Church.

As their 1976 bicentennial project, the members of Village Squares made a quilt with a square dancing and bi-

centennial motif. With the square dancers, yellow rocks and daisy chains joining eagles, drums, stripes and stars, it was made a real "Village Squares" quilt when the central square depicted Casper (the Friendly Ghost) sitting by a lamp post. After being on display throughout the community in the spring and summer, the quilt was raffled in -September, 1976, as part of "Square Dance Week."

Caller Dick Casper kept the Village Squares on their toes with his "hammer down" style of all position plus dancing, where every tip seemed like hot hash. Dick's classes enjoyed the challenge but occasionally they retaliated by making him call from inside a casket or having an exotic dancer try to distract him. Bill Saintey began his professional cueing career with the club in the late 1980s. For several years Bill taught the club to round dance and shared calling/cueing with Dick and later, Jon McNally and Jerry Carmen.

After Dick Casper retired in 1987, Jon McNally took over until 1989 when, at a "New Beginnings" Dance, Jerry



Carmen came on board. However, at Village Squares' 15th Reunion Barn Dance in 1989 and at the Silver Anniversary Dance in 1999, Dick returned to reprise a few of his specialties, including "Blue Jeans."

In 1991, after a brief detour to Brighton's Council Rock School, Village

Squares changed villages and moved back to East Rochester's First Presbyterian Church where they still dance every Wednesday night with the indefatigable Jerry Carmen. After Bill Saintey moved out of the area, Jerry, a Renaissance Man of square dance callers, took on cueing, line dancing, Eastern style square dancing, contras and



the occasional reel.

From the beginning, the Village Squares specialty has been theme dances. 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing

Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.

On Tuesday, December 15, a large group of square dancers from Waterwheel Squares attended the last Eight is Enough square dance.





It is obvious the club loves him as Club Presi-




dents Sally and Peter are shown presenting him with some very kind words...and it looks like something he can spend too!

Make sure you flip to the back of your


Promenader and see when these people are dancing...and don't be surprised if you find a lot of your friends there. I think half of the Copy Cats have dual membership.


