The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear
 the special Silver Club badge dangle.

## In Memoriam Dean W. Fincher

DEAN W. FINCHER, 81, of East Pembroke, a lover of the great outdoors, passed away on February 5, 2010. Dean was born in East Pembroke May 12, 1928, a son of the late C. Raymond and Florence Burgess Fincher. He enjoyed fishing, camping, gardening, square dancing and keeping the home fires burning.

In his younger days, he was, in addition, an amateur mechanic and built his own tractor. Dean also made maple syrup; snow plowed in winter, cleaned and kept an eye on the local church. He worked at Doehler Jarvis in Batavia for more than 30 years, and five years at Fisher Price in Medina. He was a loving husband and father of five.

He is survived by his wife, Nancy Clute Fincher and his children, Diane (Larry) Risley, Connie (Ken) Golding, John Fincher, Mark (Dawn) Fincher, and Joy (Fred) Bookmiller; also 11 grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren and two step great-grandchildren.

Dean \& Nancy took square dance class and graduated in 1963. Then they repeated class several times as new people wanted to join them. Classes consisted of five to six squares back then. Class was held in the basement of the YMCA with the Batavia Twirlers. Eventually that club became the Batavia Silver Stars. Dean was always a willing "angel" and never missed a class unless he and Nancy were on one of their traveling adventures. He will be sadly missed.

## In Memoriam Kenneth J. Tucker

The Village Squares join the square dance community in mourning the death of Kenneth J. Tucker, who died on Feb. 13, 2010, at the age of 86. Ken and Rita, his beloved wife of 61 years, joined a Village Squares' class in 1980 and were soon dancing nearly every night of the week. For many years they were class coordinators, welcoming each class with enthusiasm and passing on their own love of dancing.

After retiring from RG\&E, Ken continued working his Walworth farm, often bringing fresh vegetables straight from his field to lucky square dancers. Ken always said that his favorite activities were camping and square dancing. Ken \& Rita frequently danced with Kuntry Kuzzins and Cayuga Cut-Ups, and always encouraged other dancers to join them. As members of Circul-8-tors and Southern Tier Wheelers, they rarely missed a trip or a campout. For nearly 20 years they organized a Village Square's summer campout.

In September 2003, Village Squares secretly planned a surprise dance to honor Ken and Rita for their role as square dancing's unofficial goodwill ambassadors. Nearly 200 Federation members turned out to embrace them. Last November, despite his cardiologist's prohibition against dancing, Ken, with his characteristic twinkle and sly humor, greeted his legion of friends at the Country Twirlers/Village Squares Anniversary Dance. Ken is smiling happily in the front row of the Village Squares' anniversary photo (see the Feb./ March 2010 issue of the Promenader), surrounded by the square dancers he loved.

## In Memoriam - Bernard W. Hayward

The square dance community wishes to note the passing of former cuer Bernard Hayward on January 31, 2010, at the age of 80 . Predeceased by his wife, Rita and son, Billy; his parents, Bernard and Esther Hayward. He is survived by his daughters, Christine Patanella, Janice Clements, Gale (Tom Wood) Harrington; 4 grandchildren, Amy and Mark Harrington, Amanda and Matthew Klump; great-granddaughter, Alexis Klump; sisters, Marcia (Mike) Gleber, Jeanette (Ed) Kelly, Alice (Gary) Bubel; several nieces and nephews. He and Rita began square dancing in the early '70s. They began cueing in 1972. He taught out of his basement for a while. He then started his own club, the Twisty Viners. This club danced at the First Presbyterian Church in Caledonia, N.Y., for a number of years. He also cued for Ca-li-co Squares, Lima Grand Squares and Village Squares. He then started the Dancing Feet club in Fairport that he cued at until he retired. He and Rita joined the Country Twirlers after they retired from cueing and danced with them until Rita's illness. Rita passed away in September 2007.

## In Memoriam Joan E. Christman

The Rochester square dance community will feel the loss of Joan E. Christman, who died on January 29, 2010, after an extended hospitalization.

She was one of our most enthusiastic square and round dancers, who always had a smile and a "Hello, love!" for everyone she encountered at a dance. She and her husband, Mahlon, began dancing more than 25 years ago, and were familiar faces at Swinging Singles (where they served as vice presidents when it was known as Lilac Squares), and numerous other clubs in the area through the years. They enjoyed camping with family and friends and had a large trailer. After Mahlon's death, Joanie continued to dance non-stop, with Victor Swing-A-Longs, and most recently with the Cloverleaf Squares and the Bubel Rounds, as well as attending several additional clubs. Joanie was extremely proud of her family that included eight children, 17 grandchildren, and six greatgrandchildren! She talked about them all with smiling eyes. Her energetic presence will be sorely missed. Memorials can be made to the American Diabetes Association.

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be

heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.
STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.
STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid if required.
This system was, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose.

This is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency. Clubs - please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure, and learn about any emergency medical equipment available at your dance site.

## Raaing Reparters ... Mike Callahan, Our "National Treasure," Celebrates His 50th

Now, 50 years after it all started, Mike remembers: "Well, actually it was my Mom and Dad's idea. They were treasurers with the new Country Twirlers and thought square dancing would be a wholesome activity for my sister Karen and me. Bob Brunshide had just started a group for younger dancers, and it sounded like fun."

One night and they were hooked! In fact, before the night was over, Mike was picking his new caller friend's brain on how he did it; and how "He" could do it. When he went home, it was with a borrowed record: "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine"! The next week he was asking for another! At the time there were no callers in Rochester, and like the callers, all records came from Buffalo.

Mike's father Ray worked at Kodak and solved his practice equipment problem by reworking a scrounged sound projector and integrating two oval car speakers, and using a toy turntable. Mike was off and running! He practiced every night in their basement and loved it! Almost immediately Mike is doing guest tips at other area "teen" clubs, and sees that his equipment needs an upgrade. With a $\$ 150$ loan from his father, (hey, he is now earning $\$ 10 /$ week $)$, Mike buys his first Professional Calling Equipment!

Before we go any further, and just to put this in a perspective we all can understand, realize that Mike would not be graduating from high school for four years yet, and that would not be until 1964. We are talking young teenager here! Of course Mike is not a full-time professional caller at this time: after high school he graduated from St. John Fisher college in 1968; found a job at Lincoln First Bank and shortly thereafter was drafted in the Army for two years. Upon his return from military duty, he rejoined the bank as Assistant Branch Manager, but within four years, he does leave all that behind to become a professional caller.

Reflecting again back to the beginning, with his new-found expertise and popularity, Mike was regularly doing one tip a week with the Skirts and Shirts, where he would later be Wanda's teacher in the mid sixties. Mike was soon calling regularly for other "Teen Clubs" in the area. His first "Adult Club" was the Boots and Slippers, and by this time he commanded a weekly wage of $\$ 40 /$ dance. During his high school years, in 1965 and ' 66 , Mike also attended the Callers School in Troy, N.H., with two other "seasoned professionals," Earl Johnson and Al Brundage. Mike had arrived!

While in the Army, Mike called at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and during his tour in Germany. Then, with his return to civilian life, the Cloverleaf's Singles Club hired him as their class teacher. Bruce Shaw was the club caller at the time. Of course the Shaws and the Callahans went on to become fast friends and professional associates, as the many of you that attended their Niagara Falls weekends fondly remember. Their "Fling Fantastic" sold out every year for 25 years!

Now for the love story: Mike claims it was not love-at-first-sight. Nope! Not at all. Knowing Mike, I suspect it was probably more like

second or third sight! Whatever, with all of his travels and adventures, he is barely home from the Army a year when his relationship with Wanda climaxes in Wedding Bells in 1971 ... and their world, and their family, make a mega leap forward.

By 1974 Mike has left the bank and become a full-time caller, teaming with the other big guys of the time promoting dancing at Geneseo, and appearing regularly at the Genesee Dancers, Copy Cats, Boots \& Slippers, Henrietta Friendship Squares, MC squares, Geneva, Shirts \& Skirts, and Cloverleafs. And he is calling regularly at Buffalo, the Skoie Squares, Waterloo, Shamrock Squares, and Silver Squares as well as special festivals and conventions throughout the Northeast. By this time he is also a recording artist with two singing calls. Small wonder he is also on staff at a number of Callers Schools in the Northeast. Then, although he has already called in Germany, he goes truly international with all-expense-paid trips to Australia (ask him about the phone call from Crocodile Dundee!), Alaska, Canada, Tasmania, etc., and a good number of the states in the continental United States.

With all of this fame, there have to come temptations. We have seen it happen with many national callers. Not with Mike! Here is a dedicated family man, and you don't have to talk to him and Wanda long to understand that their children are at the core of their happiness. Small wonder that Mike's adjunct professional career working with area school systems, and his inherent love for children, in combination with



## Bob Ellis Calls Farewell Dance at Silver Squares

Bob Ellis became a caller and graduated his first class in 1961 near Canandaigua with a club called Magic Squares and his last full-time club was Emerald Squares ending in 2008 a total of 47 years. Bob will probably always be in demand as a guest caller, but relocated from western New York to Florida in 2010.

He started eight clubs in the late ' 60 s and early
'70s and was the full-time caller for six more clubs, 14 clubs total. Most of the clubs were four to six squares. One of his caller run clubs (Victor Swing-A-Longs) and one other club (Penn Yan Friendship Squares) are still dancing. The other 12 clubs are closed.

His most successful club was Diamond Squares, an A1 club with 12 to 14 squares in northeast Rochester which closed about '95. Emerald Squares was a Plus club started

in the Green Lantern Inn in Fairport, became all position about 1990, and closed in 2008.

Never certain if you were a guy or a gal, just keep going and Bob will fix it. Once in the middle of a singing call, we were home with new partners and she looked confused. I said " I 'm a girl." - she started squeezing my hand and rubbing my back and she said "If you're a girl l'll act like a guy."

Once we had only three squares when Bob picked up the needle and said "Nobody move - don't fix anything."All three squares were in facing lines, Bob said "Square one has all of the gals on one side and all the guys on the other, you are facing your partner, you're normal. Square two has all of the guys on one side and all of the gals on the other side, you are reversed but you're all with the right partner. Square three has he/she lines, you are also normal." He put the needle back down, made a few calls and we were all home.
