





#### D-O-R 2010 – A Time to Remember for Over 50 New Grads



#### Hernes Named 2010 Daphne Norma Leadership Award Recipients

Mike and Ann Herne embody the attitude of hard work & open-minded willingness to try new ideas for the promotion of square dancing.

Mike's interest in music came very early. He played clarinet in Aquinas Institute's band and marching band. He taught himself to play the guitar, electric bass and other instruments. After graduating from college at RIT, Mike became part of the Rochester music scene in several local bands that ranged from jazz & rock to country. Soon he was singing the lead and found he liked country the best. Because it was not enough to support him and a growing family and Mike went to work at RTS full-time as a city bus driver. He was employed by RTS for 29 years and is now enjoying retirement!

Ann, the daughter of Ralph and Aline Kingsley, is a member of a square dancing family that spans four generations. They have been active for many years in the Victor Swing-A-Longs.

Mike started dancing at the Village Squares class in 1978 when Dick Casper was the caller. One night in November of 1979, Mike did a tip at an Amateur Caller's Night and the rest is history. Mike has been calling for over 30 years! After graduating from square dance class he went on to round dancing lessons. This would come in handy later when he learned to cue round dancing. While a member of Village

Squares, Mike served in the offices of Vice President and President. He was also an active member of Cloverleaf Squares and Genesee Dancers. Even then, Mike was instrumental in helping others learn to square dance. Mike and Ann still enjoy helping anyone learn a call between tips and encourage new dancers to get out and practice their skills at any dance they can get to.

They are always ready to promote square dancing. Mike calls at campgrounds to encourage people to give it a try. He is always willing and enjoys calling for demos. He has filled a spot for many clubs as a caller or cuer when plans changed at the last minute. He has called and taught lessons for free just to keep a class or club together to enjoy this activity. For the past 11 years, Mike has volunteered his time to be the M.C. for the Promenader Benefit Dance.

Mike is also very busy calling at other community organizations. For over 10 years now he has called for the Girl Scouts in Greece and Irondequoit for a fee of only three boxes of cookies! And he calls for a mentally challenged

group of Explorers which is part of ARC. Mike has been calling for 15 years for RIT's Friendship Council's Hoedown for non-English speaking students. His latest endeavor is for the Learning Center at Greece Ridge Mall for people who are in the process of becoming citizens of the United States.

Mike has been a member of the Callers Co-op of Rochester since 1984. He was recently their moderator from 2007-2009 and currently their representative to the Federation. Mike was the chairperson of the 26th Dance-O-Rama and has called during the dinner hour for 20 years. Mike and Ann have worked on the committee for the 49th and 50th events.

In 2008, when the Promenader lost its subscription editor, Dorothy Woodams, Mike and Ann jumped right in to help out and carry on this important work. They handled the challenges of lost mail, changing U.S. Postal rules and

regulations, and creating a new subscription database from scratch.

Mike & Ann really do go the extra mile to help square dancing in any capacity. #### Can the Deaf Square Dance?

by Ed Foote, Pittsburgh, Pa.

We are not talking about one deaf person in a square of hearing dancers — we are talking about a full square of all deaf people. Here is how it is done.

The caller must be fluent in sign language. For the initial lesson, the caller stands in the middle of the square and teaches via sign language.


Instead of everyone having to have their head turned toward the caller, the dance hall has mirrors on all four walls, similar to a ballet studio. So, if the dancers have their back to the caller, all they have to do is look straight ahead at the mirror in front of them. At most, they have to turn their head 90 degrees to see the mirror or the caller.

But this is the old way. The new way is to have a TV camera focused on the caller, with a monitor on each of the other three walls. Now the dancers can see the caller doing sign language no matter which way they are facing.

What about music? Music with a heavy beat is needed. The dancers can feel the vibration of the beat, if it is strong enough. Also, hearing aids have now become so sophisticated that they can be hooked up to an amplifier, enabling dancers to feel the beat directly in their ears via FM modulation.

I learned all this from Rochester area caller Tom Mallory, who has called for deaf people off and on for 30 years.



#### **Dear New Dancers**


By now you have graduated and probably have joined your sponsoring club or another that your friends belong to. Chances are you a great time attending classes and even got a feeling of "family" with the many new friends you made. Now you are graduated and "cast upon the waters" to sink or swim - or so you may feel. You thought you were a pretty good dancer and knew all the calls, but suddenly that caller who has nurtured you along has become a different person behind the mike. It's bad enough you are thrown in with a lot of strangers who seem to be at best tolerating your presence, but the calls are coming fast and furious and there are even a few you can't remember hearing before. You are embarrassed because you lose your direction often and break down the square (or so you think). Someone may have walked up to you after a tip and said, "If you can't dance, you shouldn't be here!" And then you say to yourself, "I'm not having fun."

For whatever comfort it is, we have all been in your shoes at one time. We stumbled, struggled, broke down squares and forgot which hand to use for a star thru. The fun returned as we got to know our fellow club members better and gained experience by getting out there and dancing. There are a lot of folks out there rooting for you to "make it," and by that I mean, to persevere long enough to get the practice to learn the basic calls well enough to react automatically to them. In class you were introduced to the basic calls, but to really learn them you must dance them again and again, until you no

longer have to think about what you are going to do. Your graduation is not an end, but a beginning. Get out there and dance! You must crawl before you walk and only by continuing to dance regularly can you improve your skills. I'm not saying you should go to workshops to learn even more, but travel around and seek out the dances that permit you to practice what you have already been taught. If you then find a group you feel comfortable with, stick with them.

While at a dance, look for experienced dancers who want to help you. We are here in great numbers and look forward to helping you and being your friends. Avoid squaring up with your classmates most of the evening because they can't always help you by being in the right place. Besides, we should mix around and get to know other people on the floor. Try to ignore the occasional sourpusses and confide in us if they bother you. Lastly, don't always assume it's you that are in the wrong place. No matter how long we dance, we are all prone to making an error for a variety of reasons. The real secret is to concentrate on doing your part and recovering if the square should break down. You will learn this as you gain experience. Always remember that we know the future of our activity depends on you, the new dancer. If we have done our job, you will be back with us in the fall and bringing your friends to an open house to share the fun you've had. And that's what it's all about.
