In Memoriam

George Betlem, 87 years old, passed away on June 16, 2010. Survived by his wife of 65 Years, Heidi, and their three daughters.

He was involved in countless building projects during his lifetime. He built their home on Colby Street, doing everything — masonry, carpentry, plumbing, heating, electrical work, hardwood floors, installing a fireplace and a flagstone floor, and making his own kitchen cupboards.

In his years working at Kodak, George received many bonuses for making suggestions that improved profitability and safety. He had a wonderful sense of humor, and would send postcards from prior vacations just to confuse people. He loved his Siamese cats, especially when they could outsmart him.

He was an avid square dancer, and long-time member of Mike Callahan's Wednesday Night Bunch.

George and Heidi traveled all over the country by motorcycle to square dance, and made many friends while advocating the joy of square dancing. Their daughter, Joanne, recounts how he



would often ride over to Canada for an evening of square dancing, with her mother's petticoats stuffed in the saddle bags. They square danced at such a high level, it was sometimes necessary to gather three other couples from Buffalo, Syracuse, and Canada to assemble eight people capable of dancing at that "challenge" level.


We will all miss him and send our condolences to Heidi and their family.

Are You a Snooty Dancer?

"Square dancers are friendly." Have you ever heard this phrase? Of course, you have. It is one of the basic slogans we use to sell square dancing to the public. For the most part, we all believe and ascribe to it, but I wonder how much we PRACTICE it. If we are truly friendly, we are courteous, and it is this that enables all who participate to have a good time regardless of their proficiency in executing calls. Just as being technically perfect in developing and delivering choreography is not all there is to being a caller, so executing this choreography is not all there is to being a square dancer. If we become too concerned with the technical aspect of square dancing, we are liable to be concerned with only our own pleasure and hurt the feelings of others who do not have the same proficiency or dedication.


