

keep her in your prayers for awhile. These two do so much, we have to do all we can to support them too.



Daphne-Norma Leadership Award Recipients

George Ahn and Mary Lou Altman are a well-known couple in the square dancing community. Having both lost their respective spouses, they have been square and round dance partners since 1997.

George Ahn began dancing in 1980. He and his wife served as vice-presidents and presidents of Copy Cats, as well as event organizers for them. George volunteered at Penfield Ambulance Corps as an EMT for 17 years, and worked full-time, while bringing up two sons. After his wife passed on, he joined the Cloverleaf Squares, where he actively assisted in finding a new hall for them to dance in.

Mary Lou Altman also lost her spouse and began dancing with Cloverleafs in 1993, after her son was in high school. It was there that she and George formed a partnership. Mary Lou served as vice president, then president, and also as a Federation rep.

She served as recording secretary at Clover, responsible for getting callers and cuers and doing the contracts, as well as recording Board minutes. Mary Lou was also secretary of the RAF and she and George served as Federation presidents for three years, and co-chairmen on DOR committees for several years. Mary Lou was also chairman of the Federation Bylaws Revision Committee, and is currently acting RAF secretary, again. George and Mary Lou were both on the Jerry Junck Committee to bring a name caller to Rochester, and Mary Lou, with George's assistance, coordinated the Volunteer Committee of the very successful DAR 2006. They have attended national square dance conventions in St. Paul, Denver, Portland, and Charlotte.

The Promenader Dance has benefitted from their volunteer help, both with subscriptions, and especially with coordinating the Fashion Sale.

George and Mary Lou have increased their dancing skills by learning Advanced Dancing and Phase III and IV rounds over the last several years. But they still dance frequently at Cloverleafs, Copy Cats, Country Twirlers, many out-of-town plus level callers, and area demos.

The Myth about Advanced Square Dancing

There is a myth among square dancers! I have heard it myself! The myth says that once a dancer "moves up" to the Advanced level they no longer have an interest in dancing with the Plus dancers.

I would like to dispel that myth! First, let me say that in the past there was some partial truth in that statement. Not that they no longer had an interest in dancing with the Plus dancers, but rather that they were not able to do so. Many dancers in the past learned the higher levels of square dancing, both Advanced and Challenge, because they are easier physically than dancing at the Plus level. In the Advanced and Challenge Levels of dancing you do not see the twirling and swinging that is customary at the Plus level.

In the past, mainly the older dancers went on to Advanced and Challenge level dancing because if they were no longer physically able to do the swinging and twirling, they were still able to enjoy their beloved square dancing by switching to these levels. However, that is not so much the case today. Many of us (myself included) enjoy dancing Advanced calls yet still love to dance Plus and swing and twirl. I enjoy having the choice when I go to a festival of dancing in the Plus Hall or the Advanced Hall. I often alternate between them. I find that Advanced is more mentally challenging for me while Plus is more physically challenging. Sometimes I want one and other times I want the other! dancers are no fun...they are much too serious. If you believe that, I challenge you to attend one of Mike's Advanced dances on Tuesday nights and watch...you will soon find out that we have just as much fun and laugh at ourselves just as much if not more than the Plus level dancers!

So what is Advanced and Challenge square dancing? It is merely more calls added on to the ones you already know from Basic through Mainstream and Plus. There are about 50 calls on the Basic list, 17 more on the Mainstream list, and 30 more on the Plus list. There are approximately 50 more calls on the A1 list, 36 on the A2 list, and many more on the Challenge lists. Do we still dance the basic, mainstream, and plus calls when dancing Advanced or Challenge? Absolutely! Remember when you learned Plus? Not every single move that is called is a plus level call. They are interspersed with the basic and mainstream calls, but adding plus calls just makes it more interesting and adds to the enjoyment. The same is true at the higher levels.

So if you have been dancing at Plus level for a few years, the next time you go to a festival and you see an "Intro to Advanced Workshop" on the agenda...give it a try! You might find that you enjoy the challenge of learning some new material. And then, if you decide you'd like to learn more, talk to me, Mike Callahan, or Sid or Toni Marshall and we can get you on a list for the next series of Advanced workshop lessons.

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers

to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.



Emergency Call for Medical Aid

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, according to his-

torical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs - please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.




