



Dick and Irma Halstead, our new, "co-

presidents," started dancing about the same time that Gail & I did in the early '80s, but other interests dominated much of their time for those years. Dick is past president of the Marion Rotary Club, and past master of Marion Lodge 926. Irma is a past matron of Eastern Star, where Dick served as her patron; with both filling all offices/ chairs in those progressions. Both have been active in their community and church, The United Church of Marion, serving for many years as youth directors and teachers. With three sons, scouting was always a big thing in their life. They have over 35 years of service as scout leaders.

Dick's first 20-year career was in the USAF, where he met and married Irma during the Berlin Airlift; his second 20-year career was with Harris RF Communications in Rochester.

After Air Force assignments in Korea; at the Cambridge Research Center; at USAFE Headquarters in Wiesbaden, Germany; and at the AF Special Weapons Center in Albuquerque, NM; Dick was, by Presidential Selection (JFK), on the Launch Crew that made the first successful intercept of an object in space: a Soviet Volstock Series Spacecraft;



and he also served on the launch crew that put the first satellite in what is now our GPS System in orbit (SECOR).

During these assignments, Dick completed a BS *Magna Cum Laude* in Vocational/Technical Education, and earned a permanent

NYS Teaching Certificate. At Harris RF, he was supervisor of the Test Dept.; a systems engineer; and when Harris RF got their first NASA contract, Dick moved to the Publications Dept. as writing supervisor, and for a period of about ten years wrote every new product manual.

Dick and Irma both like to think of square dancing as their third "career," where most of you know them as the *Promenader* Roving Reporters.

They have been or are members of the Wayne Westerners, the Southern Tier Wheelers, Shamrock Squares, Finger Lakes Squares, The Circul-8-tors, and many clubs in Florida, Texas and South Carolina. They have most recently been named North East Area Representatives for the NSDCA (National Square Dance Camping Association).

Club Insurance Through the Federation

When classes start in September or October, a class list should be submitted to Sharon Meyer, Insurance chairman. This will cover class members until they graduate. When they graduate, an **Additional Enrollment Form** should be submitted with a check for \$4.40 per person (payable to USDA) to Sharon and the insurance will then continue until December 31.

If your club changes where they dance anytime during the year, or if the club wants to add an additional location, a **Request for Certificate** must be sent to Sharon. Three copies of any forms submitted should be sent to Sharon, one for her records and two for USDA.

All insurance forms are on the internet under USDA, Insurance.

Dancers are covered when participating in club or Federation sponsored dancing activities. Liability coverage comes in after your primary insurance. It helps protect club membership from financial loss due to a covered accidental bodily injury.

Each club should have accident forms at all their dances and submit them to Sharon within 48 hours. If you have any questions, please call Sharon at 585-924-8792 or Pat Inglis, USDA Insurance coordinator, at 505-298-6148.

Ken Georger has been maintaining the Rochester Area Federation Master Calendar for as long as any of us can remember, and he has decided: Long Enough!




Roving Reporters ...

Riverfront Park (the legacy of Expo '74) continues to be a popular gathering place for local residents and tourists.


