
Daphne Norma Leadership Award...

The 2012 recipients of the Daphne Norma Leadership Award are **Chuck and Sharon Meyer**.

Chuck started dancing in 1971 with the Teen Twirlers that his sisters persuaded him to join. He joined the Swinging Singles around 1974, and in 1978 joined Cloverleaf Squares, where he met his wife Sharon, and married her in 2003. He held the office of treasurer in both singles clubs, and has participated in the amateur calling/cueing competition held by Village Squares, where he won the "Frog" in 2005. Since then he has attended Caller Labs and has become a CCR member. He calls and cues for clubs and festivals.

Sharon started square dancing in 1987 with Swinging Singles and met her former husband and joined Victor Swing-A-Longs in 1989. After parting ways with her husband, she started dancing with Cloverleaf Squares and met and married Chuck. Sharon has held many offices in all the clubs she has belonged to, including president, vice president, secretary, Banner Stealing chair, and Caller/Cuer Contracts. Sharon and Chuck were co-program chairs for the 36th National Singles Convention sponsored by Cloverleaf Squares in 2006. Previously Chuck had been on the Program Committee in 1988 when Cloverleafs hosted the Singles Convention.

Chuck and Sharon have been co-vice presidents of the Federation from 2006-2008, along with working on the DOR Committee from 2007-2012. They were co-presidents of the Federation 2009-2011 and past presidents in 2011-2012. When the position of insurance liaison became vacant, Sharon stepped into that role without missing a beat, and has quickly become an expert in guiding clubs through the process of acquiring insurance and educating them in how to submit claims.



Sharon has been instrumental in the Cloverleaf Squares' impressive calendar of dances over the years by preparing and executing the contracts for callers and cuers. She continues to act as a liaison/resource to her successor in that role. Sharon quietly and tactfully provides guidance and support to others to help them avoid pitfalls that may befall the inexperienced and unsuspecting.

Sharon and Chuck love to travel, and have attended many out-of-town conventions like WASCA, T&D Canadian dance convention, the Florida Sunshine Festival, the National Singles Conventions in Albuquerque and Columbus, and the Nationals in Long Beach, California.

Whenever volunteers are sought, they are quick to open their home to host out-of-town callers like Jim Reid, Betsy and Roy Gotta, and Tim and Nana Eum.

Sharon and Chuck's service doesn't stop with square and round dancing. Sharon is very active in their church. She sings in the choir and has served as a trustee. Currently, she fills the role of Endowment Trustee. Chuck has been a valued member of the tenor section of two community choral groups — The Genesee Valley Orchestra and Chorus and the Finger Lakes Choral Festival. Groups such as those truly provide a service to the community.

Most recently, Sharon and Chuck were asked to serve on the Nominating Committee for next year's Federation officer slate and Sharon was immediately on the phone to coordinate a meeting so the task would be accomplished before the next Federation meeting. She consistently moves
