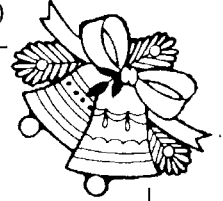

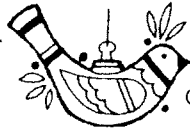

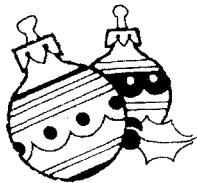

We hope everyone has safe and very happy holidays. Our next Federation meeting will be on Thursday, January 17, 2013, at the First Baptist Church of Rochester.

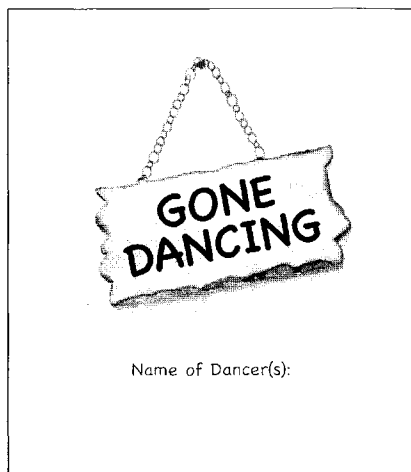

FEDERATION HISTORIAN OFFICERS NAMED

When Irma and I stepped down as presidents of the Rochester Area Federation, someone asked if we would accept the new office of Federation historians; we accepted, and now we are busy "Sporting" and "Sorting": Sporting new badges, and sorting through tons of pictures and records.

What really piqued my interest, immediately, was the difference in the clubs listed in the Minutes of that very first meeting to actually form the Rochester Area Federation, and the clubs now existent. I hasten to also point out that there have been several variations of what we now call ourselves, and the difference in the agendas we busied ourselves with then and now; however, there is a common thread: The Belles & Beaus and the Country Twirlers were both represented at that meeting, and DOR was its major involvement.

The other clubs that met in those first two historic meetings in November and December of 1960, and that are now history, were: The Fiddle Arounds, The Genesee Dancers, The Irondequoit Squares, The Rochester Roll-aways, The Swinging Eights, The Teen Twirlers, and the Tumbleweeds.

Now, my homework assignment for every now exist-



tent RAF Club President, is to ask you to form a committee within your own club, to research your own history... and to subsequently boil it down to a one page narrative, also suitable for our Web Site, and that we can place in a Federation History Folder, under a tab I will develop for your club.

Any more detailed information, including historically relevant pictures, if available, will be placed under that tab as appropriate.

The goal is to maintain this running history and to have it available at all Federation meetings, for the benefit and illumination of all club representatives at the meetings, or other interested individuals.

Make it a fun project for your club, and so that we can all get to know each other, and our proud histories, a little better. Feel free to hand deliver via your club representative to the next Fed meeting, or email it to me; preferably as a Word document.

The Daphne-Norma Leadership Award


Send in Your Nominations Now!

The Daphne-Norma Leadership Award is presented annually within the Rochester-area square and round dance community in order to recognize dancers who have contributed in an outstanding way to the good of square and round dancing, and who have demonstrated this leadership for an extended period of time. Leadership styles vary greatly as each person is different. But going that extra mile for the sake of other dancers, and of dancing itself, is something that should be noted.

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. It is governed by the award's Selection Committee, and is presented each year at Dance-O-Rama, the day-long annual dance celebration held on the first Saturday of May. Your nominations play a major role in the committee's selection process.

A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to):

- years of dancing and club membership(s)
- committee service or officer role in:
 - Square, Round or Contra club(s)
 - Rochester Area Federation
 - Promenader
 - Dance-O-Rama
 - NYS or National Dance Association(s)
- promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching
- other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity
- the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community

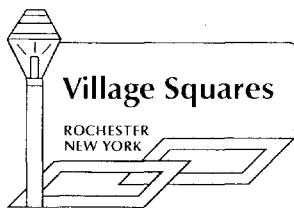
Village Squares

I started square dancing in 1975 at age 12. We had just moved to Laramie, Wyoming the summer of '75 and got started square dancing right away. My parents had danced a year before that (in Colorado) and didn't really like it. They gave it another shot when coming to Laramie and met the nicest people. At the time they had a kids club and I and my 4 siblings were invited to come learn to dance. The kids club was very active and we went dancing all over the state and into Colorado. Some of my best friends in the world are from that group of kids!

I first called a singing call in the spring of 1976 at an amateur callers night. My brother who is 4 years older than me (Brian) got very interested in calling and could pursue it more. I was "too young" ... He started getting bookings and asked me to learn to cue to go with him. So, I truly started cueing (for hire) first. And on those dances, we usually shared a tip. While he took it seriously, I didn't think I was very good, but was in it for the fun.

While in college, I started calling a monthly dance with the guy who taught me to dance (Don Hanson). That dance was not just squares, but rounds, lines, hoedown, etc. This gig lasted from about '82 until we moved to Aurora, CO in '90. Before moving to CO I also called a dance or two with Brian and some guest calling spots in Casper. My first "big" dance was in Casper where I called and cued. I remember we had a great turnout and I got a \$100 and used the money to put a drop ceiling in my boys bedroom. Lenore and I also cued and taught round dancing for two years in Laramie before moving to Colorado.
