Presidents' Corner...

Greetings to all of our dance community. As we approach this point in our



dance season, we can review all that we have accomplished during the closing season. We have experienced many wonderful dance events, shared time with friends, hopefully made some new friends, and maybe have had the opportunity to angel, or participate with our club's latest class. As this newest group of "Graduates" makes decisions about joining a club, or more than one, it is also a good time to review the "Dancers Code of Conduct"," (This is something we usually incorporate in practice, but maybe do not discuss.) These are principles set forth by the United Square Dancers of America (USDA), and are followed by most dancers throughout the country. I think we in the Rochester Area Federation, are usually good at demonstrating these, and that is the best way for all of us to learn about them! But review is also good, so we will focus on few that seem especially important.

Wearing of clean and appropriate attire is important to dancers, and to those watching. It is generally recommended that men wear long sleeved shirts, and full or prairie skirts for the women. Of course, local customs and events may warrant different clothing. (Nice slacks have also become acceptable at many events for women.)

Avoidance of alcoholic beverages both before and during dances is recommended to insure the enjoyment for everyone. A single drink can diminish the response time required to execute the intricate moves of the dance.

Courtesy to others is important at all times. This includes interactions that can include many things thought of as "good manners." We should not be squeezing people out of squares, be unfriendly to those in our squares, or leave a square as it is forming. We need to welcome others into our squares. Walking out of a square at any time is considered a severe insult. Don't push or pull people that may hesitate. Be encouraging, not DIScouraging. At the end of a dance, no one should leave the square before thanking everyone who was a part of the square. We must all remember that we consider square dancing as "Friendship set to music."

Our newest dancers will learn from what they experience. We can all be good examples, and that can grow our clubs. We never know who might be watching, it could be someone considering taking lessons in our next class!

I hope everyone will enjoy their summer, and find some fun dance opportunities during the season!

Contributions in Jerry's memory may be made to Lifetime Hospice.


Thank You from the Promenader...

The purpose of this award is to show appreciation for sustained or extensive leadership over an extended period of years in square, round, line or contra dancing. That is how this leadership award came to be.

Last year, Sharon and I were the recipients of this honor. We were hoping to get around to the clubs with the honorary candy dish, but my new work schedule and her two major surgeries in September and December sidelined us. We're going to get around more once she can resume dancing. We are presenting that candy dish to the 2013 recipient of the award, along with some "get started" candy.

This year there were many nominations and all are well deserving of this award. The selection committee, comprised of two advisors and three immediate past recipients, had much discussion after reading all the nominations. The names not chosen remain for consideration for a future year. A big thank you to everyone who took the time to submit their nomination.

This year's recipient attends many dances and clubs throughout Rochester and goes to many national and singles conventions and serves as a representative for the Federation at the conventions. Currently she is learning the "left hand" or man's part in square dancing, so a woman without a partner would be able to dance.

She has served on the Constitution revision committee twice, as well as bringing the box of supplies and coffee pot to all the Federation meetings. She has also been active in her church, sung in her church choir, does volunteer work for the Red Cross, and served in New Orleans after



Katrina. She belongs to the American Legion & Military Officers Association and was a member of Genesee Valley Cho-


