August l(for fall - Sept./Oct./Nov.).

Advertisers: Our advertising rates for now will stay the same. Some of you have already arranged to appear in multiple issues. In order to honor commitments and avoid confusion, we will continue, at least for now, to charge $\$ 30$ for a full-page ad ( $\$ 25$ if appearing in multiple issues), and give you three months of exposure instead of two. We will notify annual contract advertisers prior to the next issue about how this will affect them.

A reminder: Our position of Class/Club Editor is still in need of a willing volunteer wanting to help, but who doesn't have time to be involved on a larger scale.

And while we wait for the next general editors to come to the conclusion that they can take on that responsibility, we will continue to try to "lighten the load" for them by organizing the efforts that are involved. We are especially grateful to all the current staff who work tirelessly to make this publication what it is.

Don't wait to subscribe. If you don't make it to the Promenader Dance, then please send in your subscription right away - the more subscribers/readers we have, the more effective our infomation and advertising efforts will be! It depends on all of us.

After it was in effect, we had numerous people who still didn't know anything about it, or even what it was! This topic was discussed for several months at meetings prior to the beginning of the promotion. The promotion was to help increase the number of dancers visiting different clubs in the Rochester area. If more clubs had been aware of this promotion via their Federation Representatives, it could have increased numbers at more dances. Clubs were the ones to benefit! This gives you an idea of why it is important to have YOUR club represented at the Federation meetings! Meetings are held each month, (with a couple of exceptions) with dates listed in the front of the Promenader. The Federation wants to have input from all clubs. Please ensure YOUR club is represented. If you find that it isn't, please ask to volunteer for this important position with your club!

I hope all dancers will enjoy the dancing opportunities that are coming our way this year! We have several very popular "visiting" callers/cuers coming up, as well as our own very talented and dedicated group of local callers/cuers! Please try to visit other clubs as the dance year progresses. We are loyal to our own clubs, but everyone benefits from new experiences! I hope to see you on the dance floor soon!

## Who are we?

I'm Wayne and I began dancing in 2000 with several members of my family. My aunt and uncle had square danced in the $60^{\prime}$ s, my cousins saw an ad about square dance classes starting in our area and they asked me and my siblings if we wanted to start with them. One brother and my sister and I began with seven of my cousins. Half of the family that began are still dancing. I am a residential construction contractor and mussel shell diver, (I supply the shells for the nuclei used to make cultured pearls). I spent six years in the USAF, attended the University of Arkansas in Little Rock where I received a Bachelor degree in Business Administration, and worked for Wal-Mart as an assistant store manager and store manager for eight years. My business education and management experience has been a great help in organizing and directing activities of the 63rd National Square Dance Conventiona.

I'm Lura and began dancing in 1971. There wasn't a new class starting so I stared in the middle and I finally received my diploma in 1999. I stopped square dancing to have my kids. When my daughter was 3 months old I started back. I held the position of Sheriff and President of the club. When I began Cosmetology school in 1986 I had to stop dancing again. In 1987 I had melanoma in my left hip which made walking difficult and was unable to dance until 1989. By then my kids were old enough to take lessons, so I helped teach them to dance. I stopped dancing again after they graduated from high school and skipped a few years. In 1999 I saw an ad in the local newspaper that they were starting a new class. I thought it had been so long since I had danced that I would go take the classes, but soon found out that I still knew how. My education includes: Business school in 1979 - 1980, Cosmetology School in 1986-1987, Basic college courses in 1994-1995, Commercial Driver License in 1996. I worked in a law firm for a couple of years and became a certified Paralegal in 1999. The fall after getting the Bid for the 63rd National Square Dance Conventione I went back to college and became a Certified Nursing Assistant and First Responder certified in CPR. I thought this might help with working with our Convention. I have found that each of the different fields of education that I have received have helped in some way with preparing for the 63rd National Square Dance Conventione.
