



All very sad news, the Washington Irving School has historically been the premier facility in the area. A bit of good news did surface though in that




DOR 2014

The Daphne-Norma Leadership Award

Dick and Irma Halstead started dancing in the early '80s. They met and married many decades earlier.

When Dick was serving in the Armed Forces during the time of World War II, he was stationed in Berlin, Germany. Germany at the end of the war was divided into many sectors, occupied in large part by Russia, England, France and the United States. By June of 1948 the United States and its allies had to go to extreme measures, including the Berlin Airlift, in order to feed the starving Germans and their families. An Army of Occupation, which Dick was an integral part of, helped to feed these people and in particular the children.

Irma was only 13 at the time and a child of the war. Irma tells us of the extreme difficulty the war-torn families encountered and how the Airlift kept them alive. Of course, a few years later when she met this dashing American with a warm

heart and mischievous smile, it was love at first sight for both of them. This marked the beginning of a long and eventful marriage. One article cannot do justice to their service to square dancing and the community over the years.

After Air Force assignments in Korea; at the Cambridge Research Center; at USAFE Headquarters in Wiesbaden, Germany; and at the AF Special Weapons Center in Albuquerque, NM; Dick was, by Presidential Selection (JFK), on the Launch Crew that made the first successful intercept of an object in space: a Soviet Volstock Series Spacecraft; and he also served on the launch crew that put the first satellite in what

is now our GPS System in orbit (SECOR). During these assignments, he completed a BS *Magna Cum Laude* in Vocational/Technical Education, and earned a permanent NYS Teaching Certificate.

Dick was instrumental in the formation of a large Town Park in Marion, and is past president of the Marion Rotary Club, and past master of Marion Lodge 926. Irma is a past matron of Eastern Star. With three sons, scouting was always a big thing in their life. Dick organized the Transatlantic Council of Boy Scouts of America, and together they have over 35 years of service as scout leaders and have also been active in their community and church. Irma taught Sunday School and a Bell Choir, organized the Wayne Community Hospital volunteers, chaired the Womens' Guild, and served on the Board of Trustees of the United Church of Marion.

Dick's first 20-year career was in the USAF; his second 20-year career was with Harris RF Communications in Rochester. At Harris RF, he was supervisor of the Test Dept.; a systems engineer; and when Harris RF got their first NASA contract, Dick moved to the Publications Dept. as writing supervisor, and for a period of about ten years wrote every new product manual.

Dick and Irma both like to think of square dancing as their third "career," where most of you know them as the *Promenader* Roving Reporters.

They have been or are members of the Wayne Westerners, the Southern Tier Wheelers, Shamrock Squares, Finger Lakes Squares, The Circul-8-tors, Copy Cats, and Emerad Squares, as well as other Rochester clubs, and many clubs in Florida, Texas and South Carolina. In 2011 they were named North

East Area Representatives for the NSDCA (National Square Dance Camping Association).

Their willingness to take on assignments and offices on the Federation level is well known. After serving as covice presidents, and co-presidents, they further extended their service by being willing to do the job of Federation historians. Then, above and beyond all of their already documented achievements, they came forward in 2012 and volunteered to help the *Promenader* editors of many years in whatever way they could in order to keep the Promenader going. (At that point, the staff had not yet expanded to the point it is at now, and no candidates had come forth to take over what was then an overwhelming task.) Dick and Irma learned how to log in club submissions, organize them,

and follow up to get missing material in. Their willingness and helpfulness has allowed Rochester's square dance community to continue to have a publication to keep it connected these last few years. Besides serving as Roving Reporters for the *Promenader*, covering square dance events both near and far with articles and photos, Dick can be relied upon to remind people about upcoming square dance events via his extensive email list. And he and Irma always attend as many of these events as possible in person, even while convalescing from surgery. Dick can often be seen carrying his tripod and camera. He captures new dancers and callers, as well as experienced dancers — often in the height of swirling and twirling! Dick and Irma will be wonderful ambassadors of this award. They are truly an inspiration to all who come in contact with them.



A letter of thanks ...

We thank everyone for letting us be so much a part of your lives for our now long history together, including: The Wayne Westerners, The Emerald Squares, The Circulators, The Southern Tier Wheelers, The Shamrock Squares, and most recently, The Copy Cats...and frequent visitors with enough other clubs to feel like, "Almost Members"...and then the Federation Officers posts, including Club Reps, VP's, Presidents, and Historians.

My most work and my most enjoyment, however, has come wearing my Roving Reporter Hat...where I have always seen my job as doing whatever I can to promote and further the best interest of Square dancing ...and that includes al-

Shirts 'N Skirts Celebrate 60th





History of Country Twirlers

In the fall of 1958, Bob and Dorothy Brunshidle and a few couples who had taken Western Square Dancing lessons with the Genesee Dancers decided during one of their basement dance parties to form a club on the west side of Rochester.

Cards were sent out to all their friends and three dances were held in the spring of 1959 at a local firehouse. So successful were these dances that in the fall of 1959 more dances were held at the Chili Grange hall on Chili-Scottsville Road.

In November of 1959 a slate of officers were presented to the yet un-named club, including Ray and Irene Callahan (Mike' parents). Also included in the 32 charter couples were our own Al & Esther Fiege, who have been avid supporters of the club for 55 years.

At one of their meetings in January '60 the name "Country Twirlers" was chosen and the familiar red barn & silo was adapted as the club badge. The year 1960 also saw the start of classes and with the growth of membership dances were moved to Florence Brasser School.

The next few years with the continuance of classes and the practice of bringing in a variety of local and national callers along with special events, picnics and Trail End dinner dances, the membership had grown to 55 couples with 14 couples in class.

In the fall of 1966 the club moved to Washington Irving School with 66 couples and 22 couples in Bob Brunshidle's class. In '68, Jim McQuade, who had been sharing the calling with Frank Davenport of Buffalo, began as club caller and he and Gert drove in weekly from Tonawanda, NY, seldom missing a dance in their 26 years until Jim retired in May '82. Our club membership for 1976 lists 80 couples.

Jack Barnes began calling for us in September '82 and like Jim, he and Joan faithfully drove in from N. Tonawanda weekly until they retired in 1991. (Continued next issue)
