DANCE-O-RAMA SPOTLIGHT SHINES
ON CALLER BEN BALDWIN JR.

"Big Ben" is a 6 foot, 4½ inch Illinois born caller who started in this square dance business as a dancer. The occasion was with an exhibition group in his high school.

Next stop was to do some calling for this group, then outside clubs, and on to his decision to make it a full-time profession in 1960. He also was a partner in the Marex-Benz Co., a retail and wholesale mail order Square Dance Item Shop until 1963. He still has his record company which issues recordings on the "Benz" label.

His lovely wife, Nan, who was also a member of the exhibition group, travels with Ben as much as she can in spite of all the duties at home plus looking after two teenage children. Their son, Craig, is 17 and a high school senior. The daughter, Cheryl, is 15 and a high school freshman.

Ben limits his traveling somewhat to the winter season in order to teach a new class of dancers at home which he feels is every caller's obligation to the square dance movement.

He has called at 8 National, 7 Atlantic Coast and 2 Delaware Valley Square Dance Conventions as well as being the featured caller at many other Festivals and Jamborees. In Rochester, he has called for the Belles 'N Beaus, EKC-O Squares and Rollaways and this year will make his second Dance-O-Rama appearance.

A unique trademark of Ben wherever he calls is his earphones which he uses for a monitor. And, he always makes it a point to sign off for the evening with these words: "No matter where you dance, who you dance with, who you dance to, dance for fun and you'll stay square dancing a long, long time.....Square Dancin's fun!"

DID YOU KNOW THAT Mike Foos reports that some few members of our dancing population think PROMENADER is a privately published paper? It is really a project of our area Federation, all eleven clubs, meeting together and working to promote western dancing. Yes, this leading, No. 1, dance publication in Rochester is owned, supported and read by more than 750 persons.

ETIQUETTE OF THE DANCE - 1885

Human nature being what it is, from time to time PROMENADER has printed rules of "behaviour" to guide dancers. "All persons, whatever their condition in society, are desirous of being in possession of strength, activity and physical beauty. "While dancing, endeavor to wear a pleasant face."...."Sets should be formed with as little confusion as possible. Running to obtain a position should be carefully avoided."...."A lady should never promenade the ballroom alone, nor enter it unaccompanied."

"Dancing furnishes to the fair sex, whose sphere of exercise is naturally more confined than that of men, at once a salutary amusement and an opportunity of displaying their native graces."...."profanity, writing on the wall, using tobacco, spitting.. are glaring vulgarities."

Should you wish to study the handbook in greater detail its title is "Hunting-house Dancing Quadrille Call-Book and Guide to Etiquette", published in Chicago. The date? Oh yes, it's 1885!

FEDERATION DELEGATES MEET

The latest meeting of the Federation Board of Delegates was held on Tuesday night, January 26th, at the Echo Club.

This was the first time for delegates representing the Triggers to attend a Federation meeting and they were introduced to the rest of the board. Leonard and Bernardine DiCesare, who also serve as newly elected president of the club, and Bob and Jo Randall received copies of the constitution and other file information to give them full status on the board.

A letter was read regarding the possible organization of a statewide "federation" or "association" of square dance club federations. This promotion comes from the Mohawk Valley Square Dance Association, Bill Perry serving as Secretary. It was decided that before our Board voice an opinion, we should investigate similar attempts to organize on a state wide level in other states. This matter will be reported on in the near future by the Tuckers.

Through information supplied by Al Manning, Chairman of 1964 Dance-O-Rama, the still outstanding bill for various services supplied at Kodak Park was discussed. It was agreed that the Executive Secretary should write to the Kodak Park Athletic Association and request a statement or letter to the effect that the total amount due be specified as a matter for our own records.

The delegates also decided that it is unnecessary for club presidents to receive a copy of the minutes of the Federation meetings since the two delegate couples should relay this information to their clubs. Also, it was suggested that the delegates assume the responsibility of posting a copy of the minutes on each club's bulletin board so that all club members would have access to these reports.

A request was made on behalf of PROMENADER staff for the delegates to appeal to club officers to promote the selling of subscriptions to members of their instruction classes for the balance of the present subscription year.
