#### TO ALL ROCHESTER AREA SQUARE DANCERS:

The 1972 Dance-O-Rama, scheduled for April 8th, at Greece Athena High School, has been named the "Robert L. Bourne" Memorial Dance-O-Rama, in honor of "Bob" Bourne who died in November of 1971.

Robert L. "Bob" Bourne, along with his wife, Bernice, were the immediate past Presidents of the Rochester Area Federation, and until his death they were General Chairmen for this years Dance-O-Rama. At the November meeting of the Federation, the delegates unanimously voted to name this years dance in Bob's honor.

At the same meeting, Federation President Phil Maine appointed Ned & Barb Hasbrouck, current Presidents of the Henrietta Friendship Squares as the new General Chairmen.

Several things have been added to this years Dance-O-Rama which the committee feels will enhance this years affair, and it is hoped they might increase the participation by local square dancers.

After an absence of one year, the square dance shops will return to this years dance. At press time, affirmative replies have come in from the Ironda Shop in Rochester, and the Ox Yoke Shop of Connecticut.

Square dancers who buy their tickets to this years Dance-O-Rama, will get them a dollar cheaper than after the advance sale closing date. Advance sale tickets will be \$4.00 per couple and at the door they will sell for \$5.00 per couple. Closing date for advance sale will be March 25th, and tickets will be on sale at all clubs in the Federation area by February 1st.

Also arrangements have been made to have a Buffet Dinner at the school, which will be \$2.00 per person. The Menu will consist of Cold Ham, Turkey, Roast Beef, Cold Cuts and Cheeses...A Hot Casserole...3 Salads...Hot Rolls and Butter...Coffee, Tea and Milk, and to top it all off, you'll get Ice Cream and Cookies. Not bad for two bucks!

Decoration theme for this years dance will be "Spring Time, the Birth of New Square Dancers".

Callers this year are Art Harris, Jerry Haag, Duece Williams, and Dave "Hash" Haas. Local callers will call during dinner hour.

#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

We read, with interest, the robuttals on the proposed rating system for Square Dance clubs. This system is in offect in several areas of the country. We found it in Maine when we visited there and it was really helpful to us, since at that time we were recent graduates and did not want to get in "over our head".

Theoretically, the purpose of rating is to a) Help the newcomer to the area find a club with a minimum of shopping and b) to aid the local dancers in adjusting their level or finding an additional club. If this purpose is fulfilled, there are advantages to a rating system.

These theories would automatically eliminate the rating of closed clubs. Why should a dancer need to know a closed club's level any more than he needs to know their dance schedule? He can't get in anyway. If and when an invitation to a closed club is forthcoming, the level of dancing is surely stated by the issuant.

You'll notice, we said a minimum of shopping. Other things besides level influence a decision to join a clubi.e., the members, location, caller. The seeking dancer would normally visit all clubs in his desired level before making a choice. The rating system merely narrows down shopping time. It also helps locate a club for an occasional dance elsewhere than at a "home" club.

Practically, putting a rating system into effect may pose a few problems. Who establishes criteria and who judges whether a club qualifies for a certain level? What happens to present club and graduating class members who do not meet the club level? Often dancers realize they are not meeting the club standard and phase themselves out, but this is not always the case.

Many Rochester area dancers belong to more than one club and often these clubs are of different levels, and are joined for different reasons. Sometimes people enjoy a challenge, and then a relaxing evening, too.

We have encountered few clubs of any level where dancers don't come out to help and encourage beginners. Those dancers who refuse to help wouldn't do so no matter what their level. A class is better off without them. Fortunately, these dancers are few.

Perhaps the closed and high level clubs do skim off the cream, but those invited should be free to make their own choice. If they need and desire this challenge, it should be available to them.

If a rating system would be worth the time and effort to put it into effect, it should be completely voluntary. That is, each club should be allowed to accept or decline to be rated, and no rating forced on any club. We suggest, if a rating system is established, it not be alphabetical or numerical. This attaches a stigma to a relaxed level club and a "holier than thou" attitude can easily be assumed by a high level club. Rather, use a system such as at D-O-R (relaxed, intermediate, challenge) or something similar.

If the initial objective is met, there is no lessening of the hand of friendship, but more satisfied dancers.






