I'm sure there have been many times when you have joined your square dance friends, to enjoy your favorite past time, that someone will bring up the Federation.

As the conversation progresses, you might hear such questions or comments like: Just what does the Federation do?, or What good is the Federation? You might even hear someone question why there is a Federation, and generally many aspects of the Federation come under fire.

It might be well for those who question the Federation, to ask themselves, What have I done for the Federation lately? If that happened you might find that it would get very quiet.

Not many square dancers really know what the Federation is, or what it is supposed to do for square dancing and square dancers.

A Federation is usually formed by a group of square dance clubs, sorta banding together. The reason the clubs band together is to help themselves do something that they could not do alone. An organization like this is generally looked upon as a service organization and thus should be of service to its members.

At this time, the Rochester Federation has twenty-five member clubs, and each club has two representative couples in the Federation. The purpose of the representatives is to bring to the Federation any problems, questions, ideas, etc. to make the Federation more affective.

The Federation can only be of service to its members in the same measure each of those members are willing to work for themselves. So really, it's not what the Federation does, rather it is what do the clubs do together for themselves. Once a year the representatives gather in May to elect officers to guide the Federation through another year of square dancing.

If you, your club or your square dance friends are not happy with the Federation, then you must take a closer look at the organization and see where you can help improve it. This goes for every square dancer in the Federation. Ideas and suggestions are always welcome by the board of directors, and the best way to accomplish this is to insure that the representatives from your club attend the Federation meetings, and then take back to their respective clubs the information from those meetings.

To answer the first question, "What is the Federation?", well, it's easy. The Federation is YOU and YOU and YOU and a lot more You's, and to make it work, everyone has to work together for a common goal--that of promoting square dancing.




