Callers' Profile

ALBERTA WINTERS

This month's caller vignette features the area's only lady caller, Alberta Winters, head teller ar the Liberty National Bank and Trust Co. in Batavia. Her involvement in square dancing started as an unwilling participant at a demonstration dance sponsored by Batavia Twirlers at the Genesee County Fair. Realizing eventually what she had been missing, she joined a class and emerged in May 1967 as a dancer. Cutting her teeth on rounds at the DeGraves' round dance class in 1969, she began doing singing calls for a group of dancers who eventually evolved as the Cloverleaf Squares. Still an active member there, she cues rounds as well as at the Co-op Fun Fest and at Federation/Co-op sponsored fund raising affairs.

Inevitably Alberta developed into a caller-teacher for Kollars and Kuffs teenage square dance club in Batavia. Having attended the Brundage & Johnston callers' school in 1971 and 1972, she plans to go again in1973. She enthusiastically says "Square dancing is a way of life" and regrets that more people do not realize how much square dancing has to offer.

NEW YORK STATE SQUARE & ROUND DANCE FEDERATION NEWS

One of the worst week-ends of the winter marked the first meeting of the Temporary Executive Committee: Dec. 10, 1972. Roland & Lois Down had graciously donated the use of Ponderosa Hall in Scotia, N.Y. for the all-day meeting. Finally, at 10:45 a.m., we called the neeting to order and continued with the work at hand until 4:30 p.m.

Attending were the following people, acting as the Temporary Executive Committee of the New York State Square & Round Dance Federation: Grant & Johnson, Syracuse, N.Y. Temporary Chairman; George & Gladys Ridley, Glens Falls; Charles & Betty Pace, Whitesboro; Chuck Pitzgerald, Binghamton; Bill & Bette Berquist, Falconer; Scheff & Dottie Fierce, Feru; Bill & Mary Fenkins, Olmsteadville; Irwin & Alice District, Write Bott.

Weather prohibited Jerry Carmen of Rochester, N.Y. and Ed & Wilma France of Rhinebeck, N.Y. from attending. A representative from the Long Island Square Dancers Federation was unable to attend because it was the date of their annual Toys for Tots Dance. We received no response to our request for a representative from the Buffalo area.

The work at hand was the creation of a workable set of By-Laws to govern this Federation. The results attached to this bulletin are the work of this Executive Committee (and based on the earlier set of proposed By-Laws which was submitted at the general meeting in Syracuse in October and not adopted.)

These proposed By-Laws are submitted for your approval along with an application for regular membership in the New York State Square and Round Dance Federation. Your approval will be indicated by sending us your completed application for membership along with your check for the Initiation Fee and your first year dues. Hease note that, if your group or an individual in your group has contributed a "Founders Fee", the "Founders Fee" can be converted to the Initiation Fee.

As of December 31, 1972, \$5.00 "Founders Fees" have been received from 82 groups and individuals from all areas of the state. As soon as applications converting 21 of these "Founders Fees" to "Initiation Fees" have been received, the attached By-Laws will be considered adopted.

Individual Founders Fees can also be converted to "Associate Memberships" if you do not wish your contribution used for a particular group's Initiation Fee. And we do invite such "Associate" memberships from individuals and firms engaged in supplying the square dance activity in New York State and elsewhere. A letter stating your desire to become an "Associated Member" will be sufficient (along with your check for \$5.00, of course, or requesting the conversion of your Founders Fees to the annual fee!)

If you know of any club, association or group in the state who have not received this bulletin, just drop us a note and we will be sure that they receive it.

The New York State Square and Round Dance Federation has received a request from Jim & Leah Irvine, General Chairmen of the 22nd National Square Dance Convention to be held in Salt Lake City, Utah on June 28-30, for a 3' x 5' Offical New York State flag to be used in the coliseum during the convention. The flag has been ordered and will soon be on its way to Salt Lake City. We hope that many, many New York State dancers will be in attendance there, too. A WORD ABOUT NEW YORK STATE SALES TAXES:
No further action has been taken by the State Tax
Commission to require the collection and payment of New
York State Sales Tax by square dance clubs in the state.
The two Judgements and Warrants for Collection issued in
1971 are not being pressed ... so just continue as you
have in the past.

Meanwhile, new legislation is being readied for introduction in both houses of the State Legislature this month which, we hope, will be passed and relieve square dancing from past and future taxes. We'll let you know immediately when the new bills have been introduced so you can begin a letter writing and telephone campaign to your Senators and Assemblymen.

We'll be looking forward to receiving your applications for membership in the mail soon.
