Most of you have probably heard of the Rochester Callers" Cooperative, but we suspect many are unaware of the great contributions it and its members have made to the Rochester square dance community in the few short years of its existence. The co-op was formed in the spring of 1970 by former Rochester cailer, Tom Trainer, and others, for the purpose of coordinating caller activities and training, as well as dealing with other caller-related matters in the Rochester area. The Co-op, with a membership of from 20-25 callers, is currently under the capable leadership of Mike Callahan and Bruce Shaw, both of whom are dynamic and upcoming young callers.

The Co-op cooperates closely with the Federation and other organizations on various projects such as the Danco-o-Rama, Fall Fun Fest for the Al Sigl Center, and various square dance demonstrations at the Monroe County Fairgrounds, shopping centers, and the like. There is little doubt but that the quality of Rochester area square dancing has been measurably improved since the advent of this dedicated organization.
The next meeting of the Federation will be at the First Universalist Church on the corner of Court Street and Clinton Avenue on Wednesday, 13 February 1974. Meetings have also been scheduled for Tuesday, 12 March and Thursday, 11 April for the following two months. Anybody interested in participating in or observing the proceedings is not only more than welcome, but encouraged to attend.

## KEN BOSS

Since February is the month for hearts and flowers the Callers Co Op decided the profile should be on Ken Boss. He is a plumber, father of eight daughters, (and one son in law) and a square dance caller; but not necessarily in that order. Just how that qualifies him for the month of hearts and flowers, dear readers, is your problem.
It was in Sept. of 62 , while living on the west side of the city, that Ken, like every other loving husband, was dragged, coerced, and pushed to square dance lessons at Country Twirlers. Finally in 63 he graduated and became an active and enthusiastic square dancer.
