Caller's Profile - Larry Spaven

Many local dancers have the mistaken idea that Larry is from Newark. When seer at a Rochester dance, Larry is often asked "Did you come all the way in from Newark for the dance tonite?" Hazel and Larry are Rochester residents making their home on Miller Lane in Irondequoit. Larry was another one of those persons who was "dragged" to the first two or three lessons, got "bit by the bug" and later became a caller. In March of 1965 Larry and Hazel graduated from the Henrietta Friendship Squares Class taught by Don Pratt. At a square dance party at the Spaven's summer home in August of that same year, Larry called his first singing call - jokingly done to see if Don Pratt could really dance. Following this, with Don's encouragement, he started in earnest to learn to call and with the reorganization of the Sashav Eights (teen-agers) in Henrietta, an opportunity presented itself and another caller was born. A group of nine couples graduated from Spaven's first adult class and formed the nucleus of the Kuntry Kuzzins of Newark, New York which recently celebrated its sixth anniversary. Larry has twice attended the Al Brundage/Earl Johnson Caller's School and hopefully has put to use some of the knowledge gathered there in his home club calling and in doing many guest calling dates across New York State. The Spavens danced with the Belles and Beaus from 1965 until about a year ago when knee trouble forced Larry to the sidelines. Recent surgery has repaired the knee and they are once again on the dance floor.





PUBLICITY, MOTIVATE - AND DANCE-O-RAMA

Yes sir, that's what it was, the Fight of the Century! Caller, the champion vs Dancers, the contender.

The champion was the first to climb into the ring. He looked very confident standing there in his black and white outfit and high heeled sneex. You just knew he had power to spare, right at his finger tips. Volumes of it. He also had his friend Mike in his corner.

Rounds 3, 4 were rather slow with a lot of tag, spin and dodge.

Rounds 5, 6 started out about the same. The Caller still the aggressor, with the Dancers back tracking. Suddenly the Caller threw a right hand wave at them. Dancers retaliated. First they centered in and then they altered the wave. These were the Dancers best rounds.

Rounds 7, 8, 9 during these rounds the Dancers took a cue from Curley and moved away from the Caller. This worked for awhile but with a little help from his friend Mike, the Champ got to the Dancers again. He gave them a star twirl and had the Dancers spinning like a top, but they managed to wheel and deal out of it. By now the Dancers were soooooo tired they couldn't cast a shadow and were probably wishing for a substitute.

Round 10 The contestants were moving rather slowly when it happened. Caller suddenly whipped out a Boomerang. Zoom! the Dancers folded. They went into a grand spin, tried to pull them selves together but they couldn't do it, they were down for the count.

Winner and still champion, the Caller!

At the after party, both contestants showed badges of the struggle. The Champs upper lip was puffed. This happened when he bumped into Mike. The Dancers had both ankles swollen and one had a bloody nose. This happened when he ran around his end and quetched his corner, Arky style!

Publicity is defined as information intended to promote interest in something, and motivate is to provide with a motive. Both are in regard to Dance-O-Rama.

As to publicity, an all-inclusive "save the date" letter publicizing the dates, callers, cuers and planned improvements for the 1974 Dance-O-Rama was distributed to all Federation Club Presidents in October 1973. The letter also contained detailed requests for assistance from the Clubs, and a supply of flyers for registrations. As there are 27 Clubs the Club Presidents (those in office at the time) were asked on behalf of the Dance-O-Rama Committee to convey the contents of this letter to their members. We trusted that this would be done, and trust that it was, recognizing the purpose and need.

An attempt to provide motivation was also made, in the spirit of good humor and cooperation, and to give members of each Club an opportunity to participate in their Dance-O-Rama, and thereby contribute to its success and everyone's enjoyment. We are so prone to just go to a dance, and afterward just comment on it, whether favorably or unfavorably. It was thought that Club Presidents would especially know the amount of work involved (and why they do it) in running a dance, and project that to the scale and scope of Dance-O-Rama.

Motivation, however, is a personal prerogative, whether of Presidents (or other officers) or members, as to the extent of their participation. The lack of responses far out numbered the responses. Only each one knows how the shoe or slipper fits. We do wish to thank those Presidents (or other officers) or members who are responding with their assistance.

During February we sent out another supply of Dance-O-Rama flyers to the current Presidents, with the request they be distributed both to Club members who previously hadn't picked one up and to members of their upcoming graduating classes. This will be the time the graduates are first introduced to Dance-O-Rama, just as we all were. And, as stated in the first letter, more flyers are available upon request.

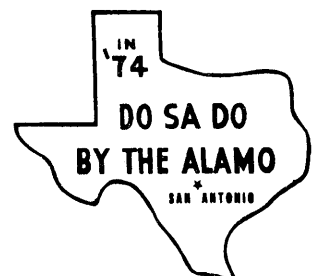

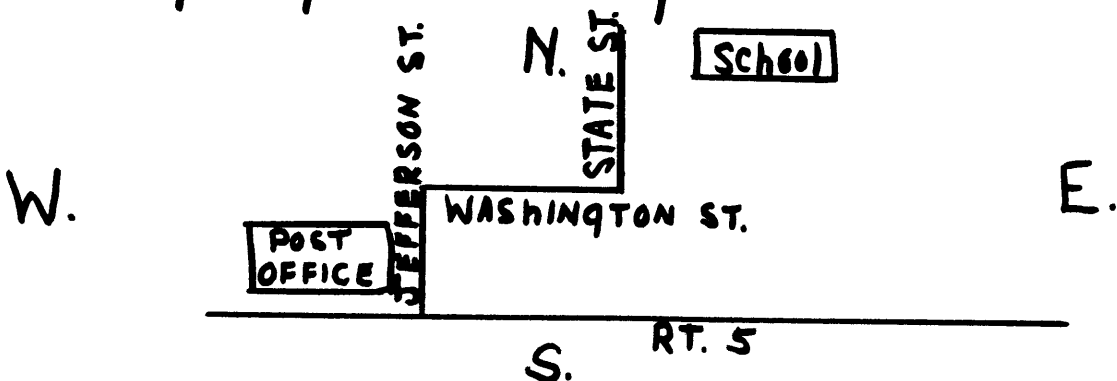

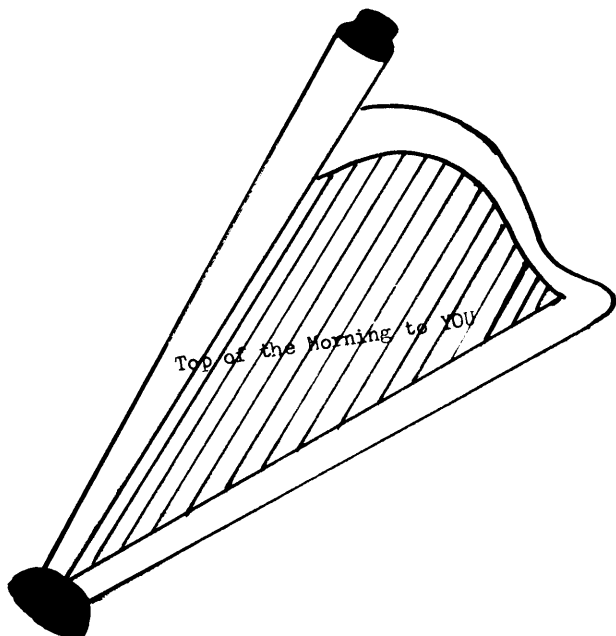

CALLERS PROFILE

ORLO HOADLEY

Orlo is a non-calling member of the CCR, who joined the group because of his interest in writing choreography for the callers to use. His first experience with square dancing came in 1955, with the class that became the Genesee Dancers. After being out of touch since 1961, he and Rita went through Chuck Prister's last class for EKC-O Squares, in 1968-9. Soon after, Orlo started to write choreographic material. A number of new calls that he invented are recorded in the Encyclopedia, and some of his movements and workshop material have been printed in both of the national S-D magazines. In 1971 he wrote a short booklet for the information of new class graduates, "A Guidebook for Square Dancers", that was published by the RAF. He is currently working on a callers' guidebook to using each of the 75 Basic Movements, and preparing workshop material for the Call of the Month. His favorite kind of dancing, whether it's writing choreography or doing it on the floor, uses familiar basic calls that are combined in unusual and challenging ways.
