## PRESIDENTS

As the outgoing Federation Presidents, we look back upon the past year with mixed emotions. We feel that there have been definite successes and gains, but yet there have been some distinct shortcomings as well.

On the plus side, we have made distinct gains in membership and membership potential. We have become an organization serving 32 square and round dance organizations. We are now, for the first time in our sixteen year history, in a position to represent and serve all square and round dance organizations and activities in the greater Rochester area. We include organizations in the Counties of Monroe, Wayne, Ontario, Livingston, Genesee and Wyoming. We have taken great and important steps to develop and increase our already fine working relationship with Rochester area callers. We have voted to establish committees for publicity and promotion of square and round dance activities and are in the process of setting these up.

However glowing and exciting the foregoing may sound, all is not entirely well with the square dance community. Attendance at the Federation meetings has been somewhat less than sensational, to say the very least! Less than half of the clubs are represented at any given meeting by either junior or senior representatives and some clubs are never represented at any meeting. So few junior representatives showed up this last year that it was virtually impossible to select even one complete slate of candidates for offices for the forthcoming year. As a matter of fact, as of the date of this writing, no candidate for President has been found!

There are, of course, a number of delegates who are extremely conscientious and hard working. Certainly, the officers of the Federation who have been serving with us this year would have to be included in this category, along with a small hard-core of delegates. However, it takes more than a handful of stalwarts to carry the ball in an organization which does so much and can do so much more for our square and round dance community.

## CORNER



Two committees, to which we previously referred, set up for the purpose of publicizing and promoting square and round dancing in the Rochester area, have yet to receive any volunteer help or members, despite the fact that we have appointed two outstanding leaders of our square and round dance community to head them up. One, but certainly not the only, reason for having good attendance at these Federation meetings is to have a sufficient number of people available to either work on Federation projects or find somebody who can.

To you in those affiliated clubs whose delegates have not participated in the Federation we can only say that you are blowing a wonderful opportunity by not insisting that your delegates faithfully attend Federation meetings, participate actively in them and act as an active liaison between the Federation and your clubs with respect to those matters which concern you. During the seven years we have been active with the Federation, we have seen the number of affiliated clubs rise from 13 to 32. Concurrently, we have seen a drop in attendance and a seeming diminution of interest.

The Federation is YOU, not just for you or about you! What the Federation does is up to YOU. We personally would like to see the Federation develop and expand its activities. It cannot do this, however, unless the Rochester community is willing to get off its collective duff and work for the collective good of the whole as well as its own insular concerns.

In conclusion, we want to thank the Dance-O-Rama Committee for a job well done and the clubs who pitched in to make it a success. We want especially to thank all with whom we have worked this year for the support and help you have given us.

HOW-TO Corner: WHEEL \& MERGE can be done from several starting positions, but the same rules hold for each case From a line-of-four the two couples wheel around, turning toward each other. As they complete the wheelaround, the new centers change places by doing a halfsashay. The one on the left crosses in front of the one on the right. From any two-faced line, the two couples again wheel around. turning toward each other, but this time the new centers slide nose-to-nose as they change places, to end up in an Ocean Wave. If the movement is begun from a wave, neighbors (an end with the adjacent center) turn by their joined hands one-half, and again the new centers change places by sliding nose-to-nose.
The original Ocean Wave is converted into a two-faced line.
