CCR HOW-TO Corner: HALF-TAG THE LINE starts just like Tag the Line: each dancer turns to face the center of the line he's in. Then do exactly half of a Double Pass Thru. In other words, the centers pass thru and then step up to make a wave with the ones they meet. Like Tag the Line, a Half-Tag can be followed by a call to Face In, Out, Right, Left, or Zig-Zag.

Country Twirlers

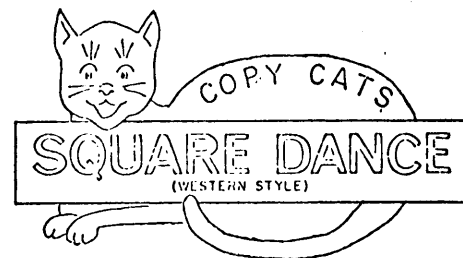

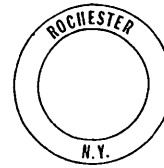
