NOW CALLING/TRAVELING FULL TIME

A little late but, a Happy New Year anyway!

A new year with more new calls. (Oh, God; more new calls) Last year we had the Relays, Phantoms, and Columns. This year Orlich's Alley is working overtime putting out the "ates"

Motivate went so well that now we have Reciprocate, Coordinate, Concentrate, Refrigerate (that's a cool one) and latest as of January 8 is Desegregate.

The Callers are finding it hard to cover all this new material. Soooooo I thought I would help them out and write the definition of the latest one. So here it is in black and white.

Desegregate: This is a combination call made up of two old calls, Designs and Open the Gate. You must remember that part in Open the Gate where you pass thru to another set. No matter, here is the definition.

Definition: First, check your set, make sure it contains eight people, four of each, men and women. You can tell women, they wear clothes with zippers on the side or

Now this call starts when the set is in two lines of four. One line is facing East and the other West, but if you look at some of the other sets, they may have lines facing North and South. Some may even be facing NN by E or S by WW, etc, Don't pay any attention to them. You are right!

You begin with the man turning to face his left hand lady and takes her right hand in his left. If his left hand lady is right handed, then we will take her left hand in his right hand. So far, simple, huh?

Next, he will walk around the left hand lady, passing right shoulders or pass left shoulders around the right hand lady. Either way will come out OK. Pass all the way around until the man's back is facing back to the ladies front. This part is very difficult if the lady doesn't cooperate. Mine didn't. At this point, the ones who are not getting the first teach will leave the hall. A bus will be waiting to take them to another hall, where they will get another teach and a free lunch.

That's the whole call. Large isn't it?

Socooo you see this call has something for everyone and everyone gets it in the end.

To the Callers: No thanks are necessary. I was glad to help out.



HOW-TO CORNER: PARTNER TAG is a simple movement; just face your partner and pass by right shoulders. It's just like Tag the Line, except that it's done from a small "line" of two people, instead of a Line-of-Four. The tricky part of the movement is to recognize where your partner is when the call is given, and the answer is always alongside of you, on your right or on your left.

If the person next to you is facing in the opposite direction, as in an Ocean Wave or after a Curlicue, he/she is not your partner but your neighbor, and the call will be NEIGHBOR TAG.






