Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in 1979 was announced as a future convention site as an all-time high 22,052, including dancers from all 50 states, Canada, and several foreign countries attended the 24th National Square Dance Convention in Kansas City, Previous high attendance was in 1970 when 19,542 attended the Louisville Convention. Thirty-one states had 50 or more dancers in Kansas City and seven states had 1000 or more-- another high.

Future Convention dates are: Anaheim, California, June 24, 25, and 26, I976; Alantic City, New Jersey, June 23, 24, and 25, I977; Oklahoma City, June 22, 23, and 24, I978, and Milwaukee, June 28, 29, and 30, I979. The I980 Convention will be awarded at Anaheim during the I976 Convention.


