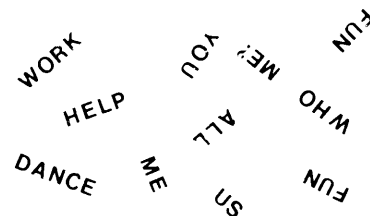
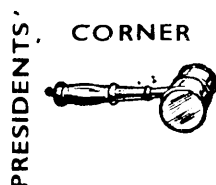

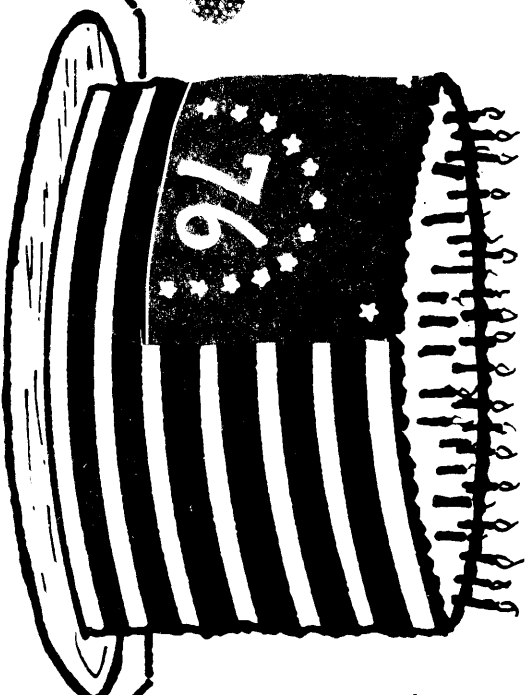

Serge Charbonneau finally has a new "Singing Squares" name tag but is unhappy about the clasp being on it the wrong way. Would standing on your head help any Serge?

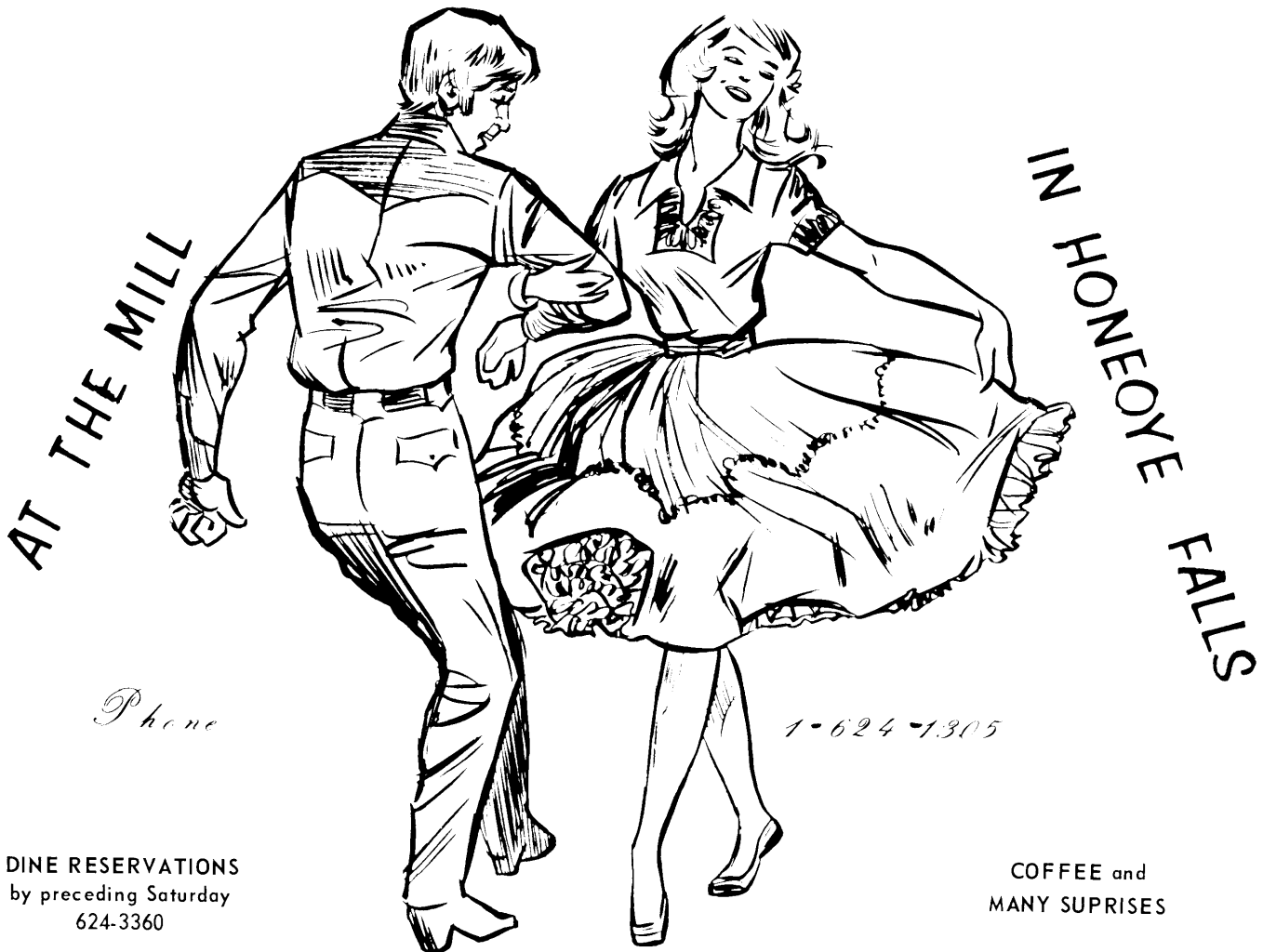

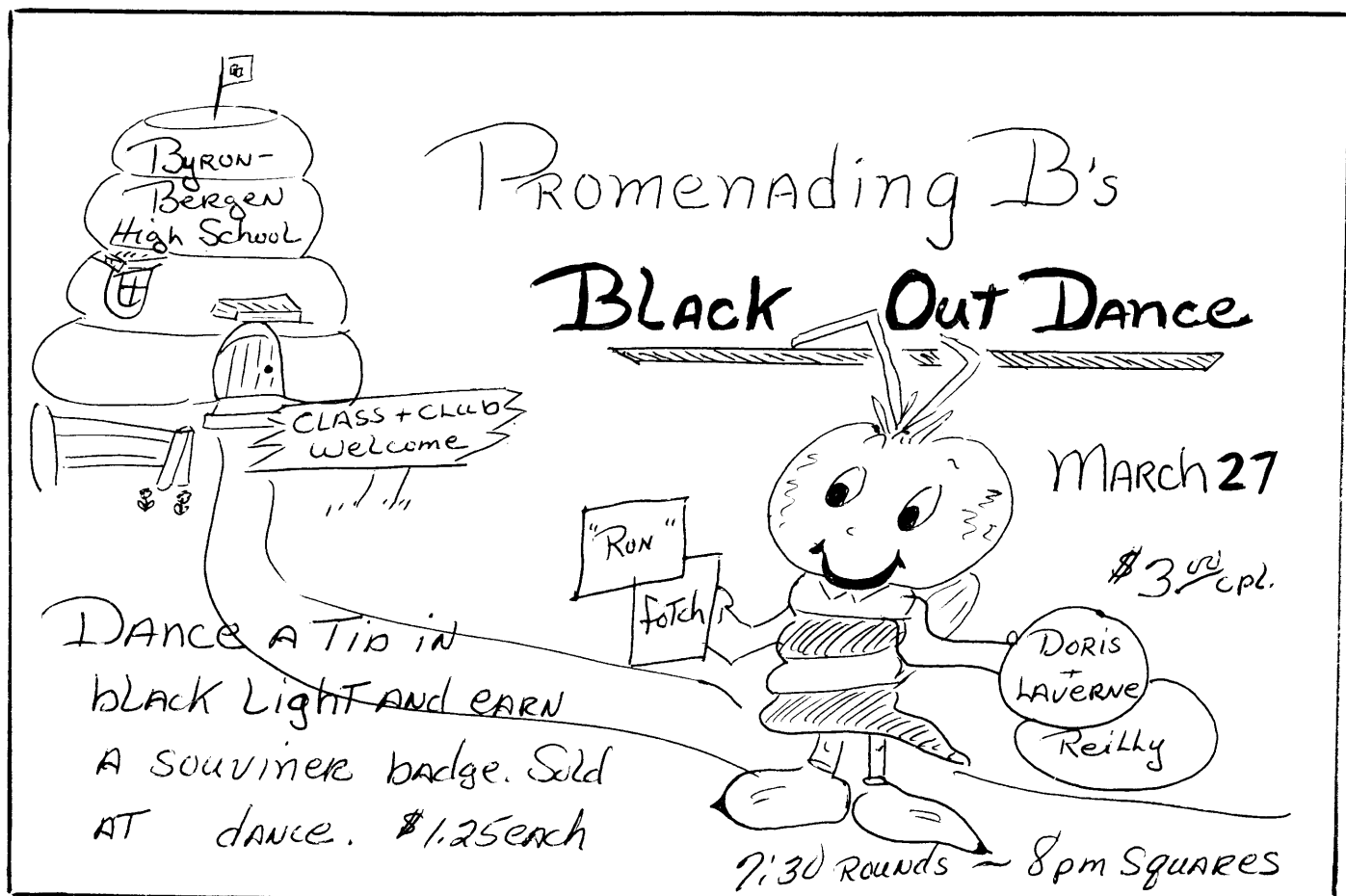

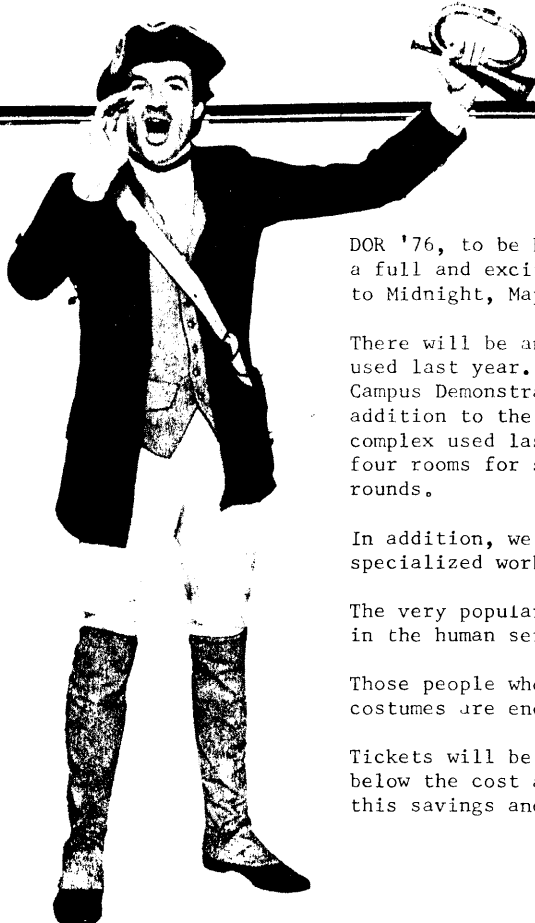
