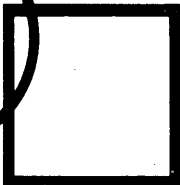

The 9th Annual Muscular Dystrophy Benefit Dance was held April 10, 1976. Over \$7,700 was raised to support muscular dystrophy research. Dancers totaling 2,100 attended from areas surrounding Rochester, Buffalo, Syracuse, and Canada.

This year's theme, Quadra-Centennial, took dancers from 1776 through 2176. Each hall placed dancers in another era.

Congressman Barber Conable attended the dance and complimented dancers on their support of this annual benefit.

CALLERLAB CONVENTION REPORT

This past April 12 through April 14, Bruce Shaw and myself were privileged to attend the 3rd Annual Callerlab Convention which was held at the Marriott Inn in Chicago. Over 800 callers and spouses from all parts of the U.S. as well as Canada and Europe attended the convention.

What is Callerlab? It is the International Association of Square Dance Callers incorporated as a nonprofit organization. It's purpose is to provide leadership and direction for the calling profession while lending strength and direction to the square dance movement as a whole. Members take an active part on committees, convention assignments and making decisions that affect the calling profession and square dancing. Callerlab is a group of professionals working together for the betterment of their profession.

- Some of the decisions and the big strides taken at this convention were the following:
 - The recommendation was adopted that the number of classes be 41 sessions of 2-2½ hours each.
 - A caller accreditation and certification program for all callers is now underway.
 - The Mainstream Basics Program including the actual calls was 100% accepted as well as 4 other levels which were named Mainstream +, Advanced #1, Advanced #2, and Advanced #3. The actual calls were also decided for each of these levels.
 - In reviewing the quarterly movements, the group voted to delete Transfer the Column and Lockit. It was also decided that the Mainstream Program will be reviewed every year for possible deletions.

The next Callerlab Convention will be held April 4-6, 1977 in Kansas City, Mo.

Somewhere it was said, " A journey of a thousand miles begins with the first step. " That first step was taken at the May 12 Federation meeting. Those representatives, presidents, vice-presidents and just interested dancers who attended found it to be a vital, interesting, cooperative and provocative meeting.

With John Fink as moderator, a panel of callers including Mike Callaban, Jerry Carmen, Chuck Prister and Bruce Shaw discussed an innovation in square dancing that is being introduced and tried for the first time throughout the world.

It is the purpose of this Synopsis to inform you of this innovation, and to hope that as a result you will be so enthused (or disturbed as the case may be) that you will invite your caller and/or class instructor to explain this innovation to you face to face. Listen and ask questions.

This is a step in the right direction to improve square dancing for all.

A Synopsis of the May 12, 1976 Rochester Federation Meeting

THIS IS A COMMUNICATION

A panel discussion involving Caller Co-op Members, Federation Representatives and Club Officers responding to the open invitation to attend.

The purpose was to provide discussion and question and answer opportunity concerning the following problems.

- 1. Problems affecting new dancers.**
- 2. Designation of club dance program content.**
- 3. 3. National and local approaches to dancer retention.**
- 4. Club - Caller relationships.**

After a few introductory remarks by the caller panel to establish the purpose and tone of the evening, the following concerns surfaced and were discussed by those present.

1. The loss of dancers due to the frustrations created by unending new vocabulary requirements to achieve "club" dancing expertise. We lose as many dancers as we train each year, forgetting that the "survivors" usually acquire their ability over a longer period of time than 20 to 30 lessons. The new dancer scarcely has begun to digest the basics before he is force-fed another meal of Mainstream and Experimental terms. The prospect of never reaching the light at the end of the tunnel has turned that light off for too many dancers.

2. A need to change the "sell" from the idea that classes turn out a complete, able, knowledgeable dancer after X-many lessons to a realistic pitch that the lessons place them on the threshold of a whole new world of square dance experiences and opportunities.

3. The concern of clubs recruiting dancers to maintain their own financial solvency rather than making a cooperative effort for the activity as a whole. Federation clubs should direct and refer potential as well as trained dancers toward groups having clearly delineated programs defined by the vocabulary groupings published in CALLER LAB listings. These are available on request and appear in the square dance publications.

4. The need to supply dancing opportunities limited to the material covered in the accepted basics program. An opportunity to assimilate that material, gain confidence and THEN move on to the next phase of square dance growth and opportunity WHEN THE DANCER FEELS READY FOR IT. Logistically this means MORE WORK for someone, whether caller or club, to arrange for facilities and coordinators.

5. An APPALLING COMMUNICATIONS GAP surfaced in many ways. Lack of club to caller dialogue; clubs having no feedback from federation reps and said representatives not being included in board meetings. Clubs not taking the time to share information with their dancer members and dancers not voicing their needs to callers. Last but not least a surprising number of dancers do not subscribe to PROMENADER or any other square dance publication and are completely uninformed about the activity, the scope of the activity or the opportunities afforded by it.

The question was raised; what are local and national caller organizations doing to remedy the existing problems; to standardize the teaching sequences and to establish conformance in vocabulary usage.

Obviously at the national level a lot of guidelines have been established and published by way of basics listings, mainstream plus terms, advanced and challenge vocabulary.

Locally we will be striving to use these nationally published norms to the extent our local callers' expertise permits. It takes a while for a caller to mature to where he can include in his singing calls the material he is teaching rather than to teach material appearing in singing calls so he can use that record. We also have several callers working locally who are not CCR members and therefore it is difficult to elicit their cooperation in this attempt at standardization.

All present at the meeting recognized the need to ameliorate (make better) the existing drop out situation. Ideally a cooperative effort on the part of all the clubs to promote the activity for the good of **ALL CLUBS**, an effort on the part of **ALL CALLERS** to standardize and suppress personal gratification for more mutually beneficial goals is required to produce a total concept of **SQUARE DANCING FOR EVERYONE, SOMEWHERE, AT WHATEVER EXPERTISE HAS BEEN ACQUIRED BY THE DANCER.**

Some problems discussed have not changed over the passage of 20 years:

The impatience of mature dancers with the novice or slow learners.

Cliques dancing "up front" and shunning novices.

Callers "playing to the front row".

Unwillingness of **ALL** to participate in the work load (you always see the same few faces).

The lack of published guide-lines or cookbook recipes to assist the new member to understand **WHAT** to do and **HOW** to go about doing it.

The taking for granted those who **DO THE WORK** of keeping a club or organization going.

Inadequate recognition of those who do accept the responsibilities, and worse yet the lack of cooperation in assisting these good people.

It is also recognized that dancers and callers have avoided the issue of identifying their programs according to the color coding suggested in national publications. **IT SHOULD BE EMPHASIZED THAT THE CLUBS THEMSELVES SHOULD ESTABLISH THEIR PLACE IN THIS CODING SYSTEM BY DECIDING WHERE IN THE PUBLISHED VOCABULARY RANGE THEY WISH TO PARTICIPATE.** Visiting callers should be informed of the club's program so that they too can deliver what you pay for, a dance that the majority if not actually **ALL** of the membership can enjoy.

ASK YOURSELVES - are you ready to do something about these problems or are you only willing to remain part of the problem? Are callers willing to provide cannon fodder to overzealous dancers and hot shot callers? Are you awaiting a Messiah to come and solve your problems or are you willing to be an Apostle, one who helps to initiate reforms in our square dance activity?

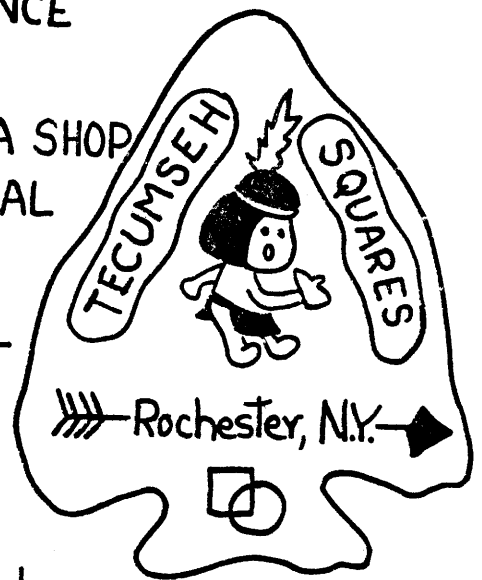

Please note in our June schedule that the 7th is a mystery dance at some undisclosed location. For further information you can contact Jeff & Sally Elmore at 872-6414.

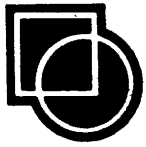
