CLUB OFFICER: HOW ABOUT YOU?

If you are asked to run for a club office, what is your reaction? No thanks! I couldn't do it! Ask someone else! I'm too busy! Although some people may have a legitimate reason for not accepting nomination, I believe that the general negative response is often due to the attitude and recruiting technique of the present officers and nominating committee.

Because every club must have officers to make the organization function, how can a club entice the best qualified, most enthusiastic, and dedicated people to agree to nomination?

Tell it like it is! Why? If a prospect accepts only after being assured "oh, it's easy it won't take much effort", you can be certain of the quality of leadership your club will receive!

What does it take to be an officer?

- It takes TIME: to meet with fellow officers and plan club activities - new and better ideas for club operation will result.
- It takes EFFORT: to involve members in activities and to deep them informed - increased club spirit will result.
- It takes UNDERSTANDING: to build interest in the club for the newest beginner as well as the most experienced dancer - increased participation in club activities will result.
- It takes DEDICATION: to provide the week-to-week direction that every club needs - the result is a deep personal satisfaction from knowing you gave your best.

When you are asked to run for office, your club is honoring you because they believe you have what it takes to make your club an even better organization than it is now. Since no organization of people ever remains static, we all want our clubs to grow and prosper rather than die.

In school, we learn such ideas as "it's not nice to seek an office", "a person does not vote for himself", etc. NONSENSE! If you would like to lead your club to even better days ahead, call the chairman of your nominating committee and tell him so.

Most committees would love to hear from you because, often lacking the positive approach, they struggle to fill slates.

If you, as a concerned member, want the best officers possible for your club, why not suggest that each person nominated present a list of ideas for making the club better than ever? I would much rather base my choice of next year's officers on such a list than on: 1) Friendships, 2) Years in the club, 3) Dencing level of the nominee, 4) Couple with the best smiles.

Dear Editor;

"LABELS YES, LEVELS NO"

We enthusiasticly endorse the labeling of clubs as a means of retaining square dancers and making sure that each dancer gets what he or she wants from the movement.

Our concern with the level or ladder analogies is that they imply superiority and inferiority, not just difference. While some may think that "Wind the Bobbin" or "Squeeze the Hourglass" represent the current ultimate in square dancing, others dislike them because they seem more like close order drill than dancing and still others simply don't want to be bothered with yet another 75 movements.

To those who say we need these calls to avoid monotony, we say baloney! There is plenty of variety possible within 75 basics (or even 50) for years of satisfying dancing if callers would only use them. There are certainly those who have the time and the interest to learn and dance a succession of ephemeral "latest and greatest", but there are also others who want to relax and enjoy dancing without the eternal stop and go of walkthroughs, reviews, and teaching of new figures every night. We in the Western Square Dance Movement have elevated the learning of new figures into an end in itself — into a measure of dancing ability, which is nonsense. If there are those who want dances with 100's of basics—fine, but for the rest of us, let's have clubs where we can really dance, smoothly, relaxed, and comfortable.

Let's have "hobby" and "recreation" clubs, "red" and "green" clubs, but not "high" level and "low" level or "advanced" and "beginner" clubs.

Lets by all means decide on some meaningful and non-discriminatory labels and lets use them in PROMEDADER and in fliers. Even more importantly, however, lets really have some choice for dancers. If <u>all</u> clubs are "mainstream plus" (because that's <u>higher</u>), where can someone go who is tired of workshopping every tip and just wants to <u>dance</u>?

Each club must decide if it wants to run a <u>dance</u> or a <u>contest</u>. Each can pick a spot on the spectrum and stick to it. Blue, red, green, and yellow all have their adherents and all kinds of dancing have theirs. Labels yes, levels no!

Dear Editor:

With all the talk and discussion about dance "levels" in the past few months, I have come across an article which I think is excellent and worth a reprint in the FROMEWADER ---- Mike Callahan, Hilton, NY

OPEN DISCUSSION....ABOUT LEVELS. How many (area) clubs and/or workshops include a designation of dancing LEVEL in their advertising? How many area clubs do YOU know of that do NOT indicate any LEVEL whatsoever for their dances?

Have you ever stopped to think about this... all the major S/D events, such as the National Convention, State Conventions, etc., provide dancers with printed programs indicating various dance levels in different halls.

This is done for the sake of guiding the dancer into the particular hall where he or she can find the most enjoyable dancing, according to his or her individual dance capability.

BUT - if that same dancer is never given any education on LEVEL by callers and class teachers AT HOME, if that same dancer can just go to a dance from 8 to 11 P.M. and LEVEL isn't even hinted at - HOW, repeat HOW is that dancer supposed to know WHAT his or her LEVEL capability is when looking at the printed program at the major S/D event? That dancer hasn't the foggiest idea of which hall to go to! So what usually happens? That dancer heads for the Advance or Challenge hall, without any idea of what those terms mean. Everyone would like to drive a Cadillac - and everyone likes to think of themselves as a "Hish Level", exterienced dancer. Nobody wants to be seen entering a beginners' hall.

We feel this lack of education toward dance LEVEL at home is one of the major problems in the activity today. We thought the Callerlab "Dance Level Identification" Committee was going to come up with suggestions for resolving this last April. The title of the committee certainly seemed to indicate that would be their study area. Frankly, we were disappointed when the committee only worked on creating NORS LEVELS ABOVE Mainstream, and did nothing to help define existing terms.

There are lists of Basic Novements now in existence which conceivably cover a dancer all the way from Beginner right on up through extended Challenge Level. .....we feel use of LEVEL designation at ALL dances, and dancer education of dance LEVELS are extremely important items for us ALL to work on this season.

We don't want to belabor this issue and we certainly don't want to start any arguments (remember, we're all in this for  $\underline{\text{fun}}$ ), but these two letters are excellent examples of the opinions and concerns that surface whenever levels/labels are discussed.

A common thread runs through both -- the need for action on the part of clubs to DEFINE as best they can, the KIND of dancing they feature, in a way that's understood by both members and non-members. To this we say "AMEN"! - Ed.





Every month at Jerry Carmen's Xperimental Workshop in Hamlin, a group of dancers workshop some of the newer calls that have been published and select the one they like the best of those presented. The dancers' selection in October was CROSS SPIN THE DEUCY.

CROSS SPIN THE DEUCY

by Dave Crissey, Michigan

From parallel waves or two-faced lines the centers cross-run to become ends, then circulate one position. The ends will fold over into the vacated position to become centers and do a FAN CHAIN THRU (cast 3/4, centers trade, then cast 3/4 again). If the figure is started from a wave, the end result is a two-faced line.... if started from a two-faced line, the ending is a wave. A timing hint to smooth the figure out is to have the circulators slow down so they arrive at their position as the centers finish.



And as the days glide swiftly past And our dancing feet glide too,




