ALL YOU EVER WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT C.C.R. ---
(AND CALLERS' EDUCATION)
C.C.R. stands for CALLERS' COOPERATIVE OF ROCHESTER. We try to make "Cooperative" mean something.

Once a month, on the first Sunday, between $2 \& 5$ pom. we meet at the Covenant United Methodist Church at 1124 Culver Road near Parselles. Everyone is welcome to attend our meetings as a visitor and anyone interested in leadership or calling and cuing is invited to join C.C.R. We have non-calling members, rank amateurs, and some with 15 and more years of experience plus everything in between. We hire guest speakers, present some programs ourselves and help each other improve as callers and leaders. New members find us willing and eager to instruct, exchange ideas and information but also find us highly individualistic in our approaches.

We do not regulate but attempt to promote high ethical standards. Our two moderators merely guide our activities since there are nothing but chiefs, all with equal influence in making decisions. We also boast a hard working secretary-treasurer who doubles as choreographer and editor of helpful hints for both caller and dancer types.

Weird like to see clubs adopt the CALLERLAB published vocabulary range designations to establish their club programs, color code it if you must, but publish or define your club's dancing vocabulary with lists of calls. Most of cur members have been following the Callexlab sequence for teaching classes so that class dances will not hold unpleasant surprises. Remember. however, that not All callers working in Rochester are members of C.C.R. If a caller does a good job: applaud like crazy; if he leaves you standing or confused and unhappy, tell him so - HISS AND BOO if you must, A caller should be held responsible for what goes on in front of him on the dance flour - BUT don't let him guess at what you want, tell him what you want, like, and expect BEFORE TME NEXT DANCE.

Getting to know each other, our weaknesses and strengths and helping each other grow professionally helps us to become better leaders. Help us by TALKING TO YOUR CALLFR so that he may serve you better. Honestly, he wont bite!!
C.C.R. is a Federation member, just like any other area club: support your Federation and Square Dancing by making sure YOUR Federation representatives attend meetings.

Certain emotions will also rush through my mind and my heart at that moment. A strong sense of admiration for Maria and Jose Bus and the achievements that only a special kind of person could accompilsh. Neverencing astonishment over the untlappable Linda wolf and the eternal optimism and genuine sincerity she radiates. Fond memories of Dance-o-Rama and the Singles Square ijp and the spirit they harbored.

Three hundred sixty six days, Endless as they were counted, fleeting in retrospect. But educational and rewarding from any perspective.

I am proud and honored to have had the opportunity to experience this still largely inexplicable potpourri of sensations, for I know that someday, all of the issues and emotions, all of the people places and things, will solidify and fall neatly into categories to be picked apart, studied, analyzed and maybe understood.

In anticipation of that day, I am able to conclude, without reservation, that every minute was worth it. And I know that in that passing second, the blend of regret and relief will momentarily emulsify with yet another ingredient - satisfaction.

More than that, I could not have asked or expected. Thank you for the opportunity and the experiences. Clearly, they will never be forgotten.
