XPERIMENTAL WORKSHOP CALL OF THE MONTH

KEEP BUSY

By Lee Kopman, New York

The action starts from parallel two-faced lines. The couples facing IN will EXTEND to form a two-faced line thru the center. The centers of this two-faced line (girls) will CROSS-RUN while the ends (boys) will flip over like in SCOOT BACK. This results in an ocean wave with boys as centers and girls as ends. The couples left facing out will circulate as a couple to end standing behind one-half of the ocean wave. The dancers in the wave will make a right about-face. In the outside couples, the boys will walk straight across the set and ALL the girls will DODGE to their left to form parallel ocean waves with the boys facing out and the girls facing in.

NOTE: This call came from a write-up by Jack Lasry of Florida, who suggested it only for the very experienced dancers; but the mainstream level dancers in my workshop learned it easily and selected it over three other calls as the one they liked the best. (Jerry C.)



Well, the Dance-O-Rama has come and gone. It will probably be best remembered as the "Gong Show of '77."

Gary Brown was calling when those fire gongs first went off. He stopped and asked, "What's that for?" I told him that in Brockport every time a caller goofs they ring those gongs. I don't think he believed me.

Anyway the gongs continued to clang, socooo I followed the crowd outside. Too cold! went to the Basic Challenge room. There I was challenged at the door. I was asked for my name, rank, and next of kin. Why? Because they said I could get killed in there.

I didn't go in, I would hate to see a Promenader headline, "Marve falls on Hal".

ITEMS OF CURRENT INTEREST TO THE HIGH FREQUENCY DANCER IN THE ROCHESTER AREA

It was a pleasure to see the Advanced and Challenge Halls both full all day and evening with enthusiastic and talented dancers doing their thing.

Many interested observers crowded the doorways to watch and some ventured in to try it a bit. When the Introduction to Advanced Dancing Sessions were held at noon and again in the early evening, the hall was literally packed with people eager to try this level of dancing. The many flyers and pamphlets on advanced dancing which were made available seemed to be looked over with interest and eagerly picked up.

Some of the upcoming opportunities available for those who want to try Advanced Dancing are:

- 1. A position dancing workshop on the 75 basic figures of square dancing. Tuesday evenings this summer (June 14 & 28; July 12, 26, and August 9 & 23.) at Southlawn School, Rawlinson Avenue, Irondequoit. Jerry Carmen will lead this group and prepare these dancers for admission to Advanced Basics classes in the fall. Call 385-1076 for information.
- 2. Workshops in Advanced Basics, sponsored by the Jack of Hearts, for those who want to sharpen their skills or to get back into dancing at this level. See Promenader schedule or call 385-1076 for information.
- 3. Classes in Advanced Dancing Basics starting in the fall with the Jack of Hearts, Jerry's Funshop, and the Shamrock Squares. More on this later.

Challenge level dancing is also very active and growing in Rochester with two clubs: the Rollaways and the King of Hearts dancing alternate Friday nights, and many 'basement groups' workshopping the advanced figures that call for high-frequency dancing to maintain proficiency. Membership in these clubs is offered to dancers who complete the classes in Challenge Dancing Basic Extended Calls....such classes being offered, at this point, via small 'tape' group sessions. 'all 266-2455 for more information.

It might be interesting to close this month's column with a quote from Ed Foote, known as "Mr. Challenge", who writes to say what challenge dancing is NOT......"it is not Hot Hash where the caller speeds up the record and expects the dancers to run through the calls. It is not short-cutting movements, it is not gimmicky choreography, and it is not repetition of the same call over and over again during a tip."

What Advanced/Challenge dancing is...well, that's what we'll tell you more about in the future columns.

DANCE-O-RAMA '77 WRAPUP **NEWSLETTER #5**

The next thing to anticipation of a good time is reminiscing about it. We had such a good time at the 1977 Dance-O-Rama on May 7th that we want to tell you all about it.

The Weather: It couldn't have been better -- cool and sunny! Altogether ideal dancing weather. It did cool off somewhat by midnight and those who lingered to the last had a chilly hike over to their cars. But how *bout that May snowstorm that hit the very next day. Lucky for us but not so nice for Mother's Day.

The Callers and Cuers were superb. Fine calling, good humor, great sound made for good dancing all day and evening long......with one noteworthy exception.....

Noteworthy Exception -- when the fire gong drove the main ballroom full of Mainstream dancers out into the night while a steaming boiler was checked out. The round dancers gave up their hall and moved to a smaller one - a fact much appreciated by the harried DOR staff. This award (called the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award) symbolized by an engraved silver tray and compote dish, was presented by Frank Salvagio to CHUCK & GERRY PRISTER, a couple whose long devotion to square dancing and unrelenting support and enthusiasm have been felt in all corners of the community. Our best wishes to them both! It's fortunate we are to have individuals willing to accept the responsibilities of leadership.

Our Friendship Scroll, awarded to the dancer who had come the greatest distance went to Gerhart Niebel, of the Tamborin Squares of STUTTGART, W. GERMANY! This club is requested to pass the scroll on to their farthest away visitors, and so on; it is hoped it will find its way back for next year's Dance-O-Rama. 
Attendance hit the 1400+ number and all was considered a success. The hard-working DOR '77 staff can stand aside now to the sound of "well done" ringing in their

The CONTRA CORNER

At Dance-O-Rama, many people saw and danced contras for the first time. For those who didn't try them, perhaps a word on what they are - and aren't, would be appropriate.

Contras first of all rely on a relatively few basics, therefore no lessons are necessary. Sure you may stumble a bit at first with unfamiliar formations, but contra dancers will pull you through and they'll smile while they do it. You'll be amazed at the variety possible with those few basics.

Second, contras rely totally on the music - every move is done on the musical phrase. The feel is more like round dancing than it is like modern square dancing. The music is Scottish and Irish reels and jigs - sometimes stately and sometimes fast and wild - music that makes it very difficult to keep your feet still. If you're lucky you may even have live musicians to dance to.

Third, contras are sociable. Because you don't have to concentrate on not blowing the next call, you can relax and flirt with your partner (or somebody else's.) You can meet and dance not just with three other couples, but with as many as may be in your line. After a while the caller may even shut up and let you enjoy the sheer joy of moving with the music. Maybe he or she will even leave the stage and join in at the bottom of the set and dance with you.

Fourth, because of the relaxed atmosphere and no lessons, the whole family can participate - preteens to great grandparents - all enjoying the music, the dancing, and each other.

Well, that's contra dancing. Try it, you'll 6 like it!

And have you seen H. ORLO HOADLEY'S newly published book, "A GUIDEBOOK FOR SQUARE DANCERS"? This is a beautifully written compilation of hints, courtesies, reasons why, and everything else to help the dancer, whether new or old to be smoother, and most important, aware of the reasons things are done as they are ... Could have been called "EVERYTHING YOU WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT SQUARE DANCING (BUT WERE AFRAID TO ASK)".....

Orlo is a member of Caller's Co-op and has been active in the square dance activity in the Rochester Area for many years. The book is \$2.00 each, and is available from H. Orlo Hoadley, 18 Kingsbury Court, Rochester, NY 14618.

Another new booklet, entitled "WHEELING AND DEALING WITH NURSING HOME RESIDENTS" has been written by Mary Jenkins of Minerva, NY and describes ways to set up a program of square dancing on a very simplified scale for those in wheelchairs, and is based on actual programs of this type now in existence.
