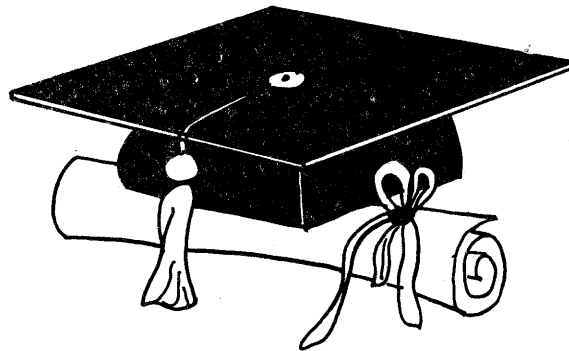

EDITOR'S

NOTE:



It's time again for us to begin looking around for new staff members to work on the PROMENADER, beginning in September. It requires hours of work, but is tremendously rewarding. We feel that each year's issues have a different "personality" as each editors put a little of themselves into the paper.

Here's how the "system" works, for those who are interested:

Helping with the Promenader is normally a two year commitment--the first year is as subscription editors, with responsibility for subscriptions and mailing, address changes, etc. This phase of the operation takes about 8 to 12 hours a month.

The second year, you move up to the copy editors' position, with responsibility for assembling the paper page by page from copy and ads received from the various correspondents and others. This requires about 40 hours a month, with about half that time spent typing.

All the equipment needed comes with the job, someone in the family has to be able to type. Art ability is not necessary...we have a library of prepared art (but original art is always welcome.) As in any volunteer effort of this sort, the more help you can recruit, the easier the work.

If you think you may be interested in keeping the PROMENADER on the move, contact Frosts or Wilcoxs. We will be happy to answer your questions. It's a great opportunity to make a significant contribution to square dancing in the Rochester Area. Think about it!

P.S. - John Fink, our printer, is a super guy to work with (he and his wife Daphne are also round and square dancers) and is willing and ready to provide professional help and advice whenever it is needed!

Editor - Parts of the above were taken from Willers Editors Note. We thought it was worth repeating because after reading it we were caught up in the enthusiasm of a service to the square dance community.

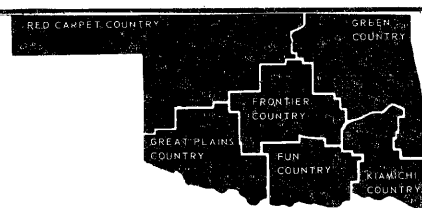

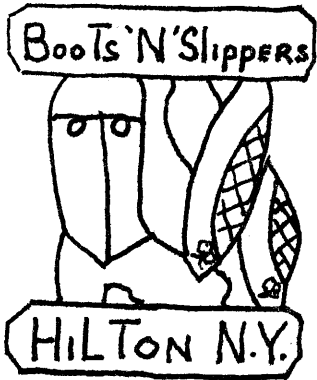
Our thanks to the new class representatives Chuck and Faye Jefferson for keeping the "Kittens" informed of club activities.

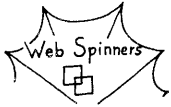
On April 6, we will be celebrating our birthday, - Wayne Westerners are 10 years old! Happy Birthday, Club - may you have many more years of fun and dancing!

Callers' Profile

In New York City in 1953 a church teenage square dance group lacked adult leadership. Bill Bartsch and his first wife volunteered, and soon were experiencing the fun of traditional squares, rounds, and folk dances. Several aspiring young callers shared the mike and allowed guests to call. Naturally, the ham in Bill came out. He bought a record, memorized the call, and one evening called his first number. Learning from books, records, and other callers, Bill was soon calling one night stands in the New York City area and in the Catskills during the summer. Then the Bartsch's discovered Western Square Dancing. They joined several local associations, and Bill enlarged his repertoire, called guest tips and evenings for various clubs.

In 1962 Bill left the New York City School System for an art teaching position in the Brighton Schools. After settling in Rochester, he began calling an open dance at the downtown YWCA. Two Scottsville couples saw Bill there and sought help in starting a club. The Scottsvills Stars were born, and Bill called for them for two years. Other opportunities arose. Soon Bill was calling for Country Twirlers, Boots and Slippers, and Swinging Eights. When his wife passed away in 1966, Bill left calling to raise his children.

Bill remarried in 1968. He and Irene were in and out of square dancing but were highly re-motivated by some Canadian friends almost two years ago. The Bartsch's caught up with current dancing. Took round dance lessons, attended East Farm Caller's School, and now try to dance at least twice a week - Mainstream and Advanced. Bill currently calls Mainstream plus at Easy Does It on Monday nights and would enjoy teaching a class again. Besides calling Bill is involved in painting and community theatre. Irene is employed in an insurance agency. Irene's sons, Marshall and Terry, and Bill's children, Amy and Bill, Jr. have all moved out of the nest. The Bartsch's reside in a small apartment in Fairport.

Contra Corner

Is square dancing a hobby or a recreation? Obviously it can be either, just as bowling, bridge or golf can be either. The difference is whether one does it regularly and strives for continual improvement or does it once in a while just for enjoyment or social companionship.

If people with such different aims are together in the same square, the results are not always pleasant. If one fumes at mistakes and another chuckles at them, the basis for communication is lacking.

Western square dancing includes a great range of such attitudes: (You might be interested to know that the same range and incompatibility also exists among folk dancers, contra dancers and ballroom dancers). Experienced dancers of all kinds will grin and bear beginners for a while (as long as they are serious about it and improve) because they are needed, but they soon want the level back "up". (Folk dancers and contra dancers may be somewhat more tolerant in this regard only because their numbers are smaller, and their need for new converts therefor greater.)

It isn't just a matter of level or number of basics; many mainstream clubs their dancing just as seriously as the challenge dancers do. All formal clubs will tend this way because the officers are likely to be those who take their dancing most seriously and therefor are willing to take the time to be officers. Since the caller is hired by these officers, he will try to please them, not the people who square up in the back and flub around. (They probably won't be back anyway.)

It is not a question of right or wrong, it is a question of recognizing that people come to dances for different reasons.

No one club can possibly please everyone, nor should it try. Let us clearly announce what our clubs are like. What level is danced? Are the recreation dancers who won't "keep up" truly welcome or do they spoil things for others who are more serious about their dancing? Perhaps we should be honest with them and ourselves and steer them to another club where nobody cares about perfection, but all enjoy "breaking down" and laughing about it afterwards.

There are a few such clubs around, and there probably should be more. Let's stand up and be counted. The recreational dancers are not committed enough to help run our clubs nor are they very regular in their attendance, but there are a great many of them. If we really want them to stay in square dancing, we should tell them so, and mean it, but we have to take them on their own terms. As it is now, the recreational dancer joins class and graduates with the expectation of coming to club when they feel like it, only to find that is not possible. Faced with the necessity of coming every week in order just to keep up with changing calls, many drop out, feeling frustrated and somehow cheated. Where can such dancers go? Think about it.

RECOVERY a new basic? Dick Kenyon, Sun City, Arizona, answers that the name of the game is to keep dancing! He suggests the following:

The movement, "recovery", goes like this. When your square breaks down, quickly reassemble at home and watch the rest for a moment. If the caller is working ocean waves, turn and face your corner and step into a wave and take up from there. If the caller is working lines, the heads just slide over to the right and make a line of four and dance some more. If the caller is working thars, the boys back into a thar, girls hang on and there you are. If he is calling circle, join hands and circle. For Alamo style, join hands, make a ring and girls turn back. You will find you are standing less and enjoying it more when you become an expert at this basic "recovery."

Don't worry if you don't have your right corner or partner until the end of the tip. Just dance, that's the name of the game. Learn "recovery well and you will find you have to use it less and less.

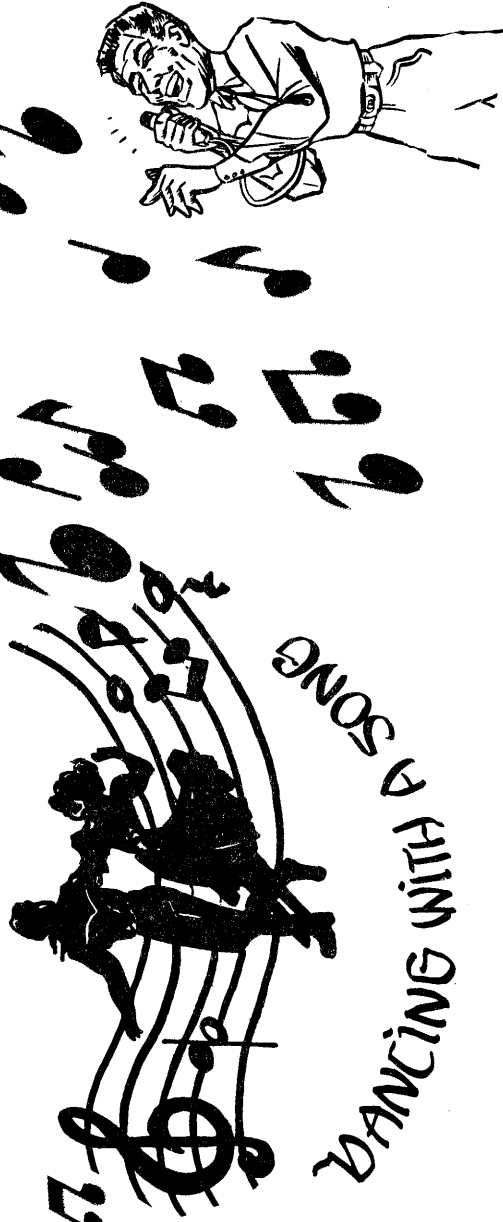
