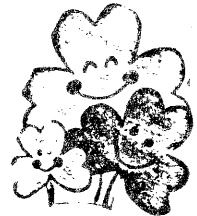
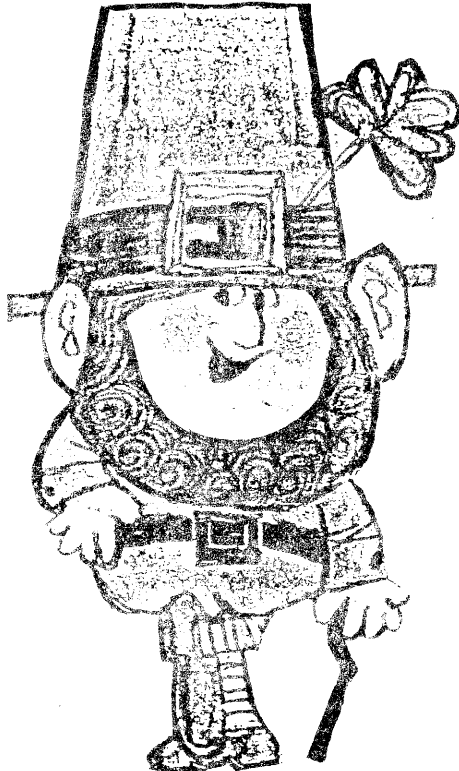
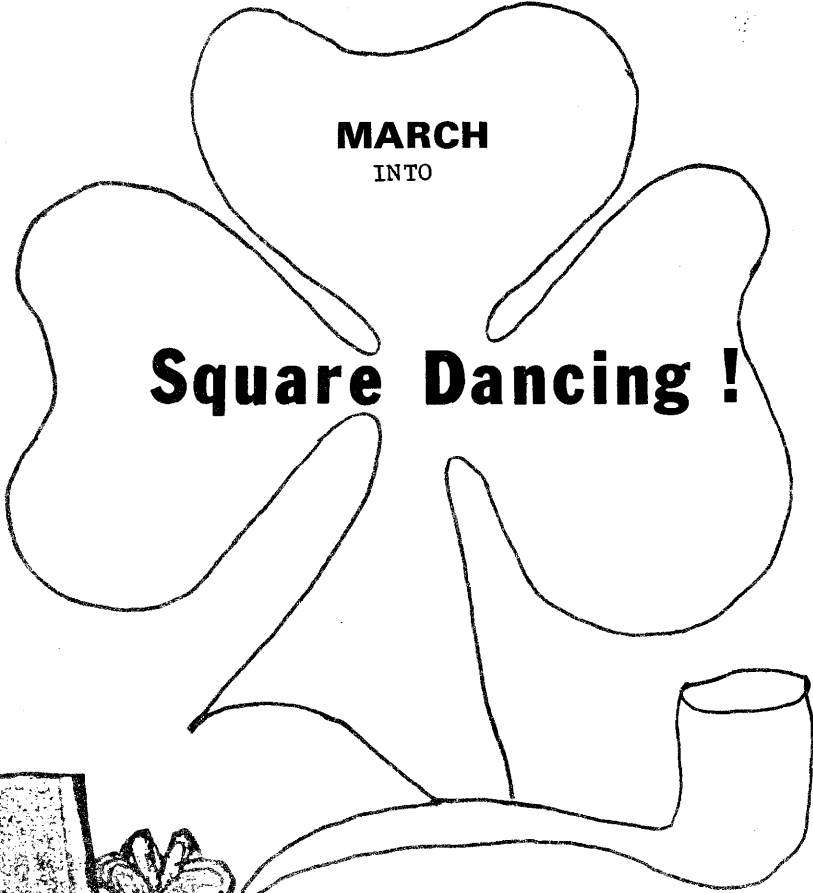

COURTESY IN SQUARE DANCING - WHAT'S HAPPENING TO IT?

(NOTE - This is the first of a two part series. Part I The Problem Part II Solving the Problem)

Is it technical competency of the caller and your fellow dancers, or is it the atmosphere of fellowship and friendship you feel during the course of the evening?

Why is it at some dances you can goof up all evening and come away saying you had a good time -- and others, you did everything "perfectly", but come away wondering why you even bothered to come.

With this introduction, I'd like to discuss courtesy in square dancing and what's happening to it. I was asked to develop this talk by someone who has noticed gaps appearing in our family of square dancing. To begin, I ask the following questions for you to think about:

Is Courtesy disappearing in Square Dancing?

Is emphasis being placed more on individual competency to execute calls than working together as a group for everyone's enjoyment?

Is a square dancer one who likes to square dance, or is he something more than that?

Is square dancing fun only if the level is up and all the "greenies" and incompetents are told to leave or ignored so they can know they're not wanted?

They say to become a caller one must have a "thick skin" and be prepared to weather all the disappointments, frustrations and criticisms encountered while learning. Poor callers are simply ignored and avoided by dancers. Must the road to square dancing be the same?

Why are some clubs known as being friendlier than others?

Is square dancing 60 percent people and 40 percent dancing or vice-versa?

In short, are the attitudes present in many of today's square dancing public discouraging many people from remaining in the activity as they try to match the abilities of those who have been dancing years longer and is courtesy to those of lesser ability disappearing?

Some Unfortunate Experiences

As an example, I cite you the following situations as related to me from the personal experiences of other dancers:

- 1. Three couples on the floor need a fourth to fill a square. An experienced dancer couple walks into the square, looks at the others and says "Oh, new graduates." and walks out again.
2. Class couple "X" is not learning as rapidly as the rest. Apparently, some other class members are complaining and avoiding them so couple "X" is told to leave the class because they are holding it up and will never really be square dancers.
3. A couple attends another club's dance for the first time. The treasurer takes their money and they sit alone until the tip starts. They are the only guest couple in the square and no one talks to them. At the end of the tip, the other three couples talk among themselves and the guest couple returns to sit alone.
4. One couple attends an outside dance and the club caller uses many calls they are unfamiliar with, but apparently, his own club members know well. As a result, the square breaks down frequently during the tip. The guest couple is told by a frustrated dancer -- "if you can't dance, you shouldn't be here!"
5. Two couples attending a club that is known as a "higher level" club remember that their caller told them they should square up at the front of the hall where the better dancers are, and they would help them make it through the tip. The first two tips they are the last or nearly last to fill their squares. The third tip, they decide to square up together in front of the caller, but are forced to sit down because no one is left to fill their square.

These are actual happenings at Rochester Area Clubs. From reading and talking with other callers, this is happening not just here but all over the country. Here is a letter that appeared in a recent issue of AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE MAGAZINE from a reader in Trenton, New Jersey;

"Ever wonder why so many couples drop out of square dancing?

Well, my wife and I loved it for the fun and exercise. But one night our illustrious president asked us to resign from the club, the Jolly Promenaders of Trenton, N. J., because we were always messing up the squares. Is not square dancing for fun and enjoyment, not for perfection? I am age 68, my wife is 65 and we really enjoy square dancing. But when you get old no one wants you anymore."

Relation to Drop-out Rates

And I could go on and on. I didn't mean to broach the problem of drop-outs that we have been discussing in recent years, but the more I think of it, the more it applies. What's happened to the friendship in square dancing we preach when we try to induce new people into the activity? To be certain, we are not all the same and each of us has different abilities and learning rates. Is friendship only limited to the top 10% who can cut the mustard? My experience has shown me people are more likely to stick with a group they feel welcome at.

We would like to extend our deepest sympathy to George Thrash for the loss of his brother and to Bob Weaver for the loss of his sister.

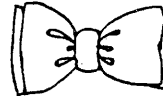

DON'T GET CAUGHT IN A SPEED TRAP

Many of you (dancers and callers) are really caught up in this speed trap. We sometimes think that because the road is there, we must drive on it. Might it not be better if we, as individuals, learned to handle the various road conditions along the way? Can we not enjoy the scenic routes in our own neighborhoods? Can we not enjoy

the beauty of the secondary roads and perhaps even the first four lane highway? Do we all have to travel on the divided highway? Must we pass everyone on the road?

We talk about the scenic highways and byways and yet in square dancing, the scenic portions have to be the people and the friendships established. Just as the forests, the flowers and the shrubs are scenic roadside attractions and the waterfalls add serenity, so do the friendships and people in square dancing accomplish the same things for us in our pursuit of this leisure time activity. We should take the time to enhance these friendships. We should take the time to smell the roses. We should make the effort to be especially friendly to the strangers that attend our club dances. We should enjoy the scenic route for what it has to offer.

Let us all take stock of ourselves and review where we are and where we would like to go. Let us not get caught up in the "Speed Trap" of Square Dancing.
