



Let's talk about finances of the Federation.

These figures are based on 38 affiliated clubs and 8 meetings per year. Out of each club's dues of \$8.50, the very minimum cost of mailing meeting notices and minutes is \$5.76. Each club's share of the cost of the meeting room is \$4.21. This leaves almost \$1.50 per club, a total of \$56, to come from somewhere else, plus other expenses such as extra mailings and correspondence.

The editors of the PROMENADER have made the subscription price high enough to make the paper self-supporting but no higher. This leaves Dance-O-Rama as the only source of additional funds to cover the expenses that the dues don't, and to finance any other projects that the Federation might choose to undertake.

What all this means is that the affiliated clubs of the Rochester Area Federation are faced with the choice of working hard to make Dance-O-Rama a financial as well as artistic success, paying more club dues, or coming up with another activity that will be reasonably profitable.

I hope that all you members of the Federation-affiliated clubs will choose the first course, and supply the enthusiastic support that will make D-O-R an unqualified success. The small group who are serving as the Dance-O-Rama committee cannot do it without your help.

In other words, buy your tickets now, and see that your friends do too.
