NOTES from the Jan. 14 meeting

Treasurer Jean Macpherson reported that the Rochester Federation now consists of 36 clubs, including one contra dance group. The Hilton Hillbillies, a teen group, joined at the January 14 Federation meeting. WELCOME! Teens pay dues at one-half the regular rate after a recent change to the Bylaws.

Ruth Harris, DOR chairman, announced that clubs are needed to volunteer for many tasks, particularly set-up and clean-up. Frank VanDeusen, ticket chairman, will have DANCE O RAMA tickets available at the next Federation meeting.

The editors reported that almost 800 PROMENADERS are mailed each month. A subscription drive aimed at present class members will be conducted in February.

Maryln Dailey was allocated up to \$400 to print 10,000 flyers promoting square dancing in the Rochester area. They are intended for local clubs to pass out at the fair, demonstrations, one-nighters, and general promotion.

HOW TO FIRE YOUR CALLER

The title may seem a little drastic, but, like it or not, clubs do change callers and all too many times this results in broken friendships, dissention and hurt feelings. I hope this article will assist in reducing all this by presenting a reasonable approach that regards the caller as a human being with feelings who deserves common courtesy.

Callers, to begin with, should be professional enough to realize that they can be replaced for no other reason than the club wants to. The club, specifically the Board of directors, has an obligation to be forthright, honest and timely in their dealings with the caller. It is an unpleasant task to tell someone he is no longer wanted. All too many times I have heard of another caller hired with not even a hint to the current caller or club membership. Perhaps at the last minute a letter is sent terminating him. What little wonder there is bitterness, resentment and hard feelings! What damage has been done to the club and the square dance activity just for failure to act in a gentlemanly fashion!

For future reference to any who may be concerned, I would like to recommend the following steps be taken:

- 1. If there is a problem, discuss it with him. Callers are very rarely replaced as a whim and there is generally a problem, real or imagined, that is at the root. Invite him to a board meeting and be open. Many times the caller can correct a problem he is unaware of or point to a solution and things need go no further.
- 2. Broach the question of replacement with the club membership. The membership should be made aware of an impending change and their approval be sought. I do not believe your fellow dancers are sheep and must be led. The board is there to serve the membership and to run the club smoothly. Such a move requires their approval or you may find your club split in two. Our activity should be open and fair, and to make such important decisions secretly is wrong.
- 3. Be direct and timely when notifying a caller. In the event that differences cannot be ironed out, a caller should never be notified prior to or during a dance, and never by mail. It should be done face-to-face by a selected board member in such a situation where the decision can be discussed if desired. It is unfair to wait until the end of the season because this often ruins the caller's opportunity for an alternate position on that night. Clubs generally hire guest callers, etc. from September to April for the following season. I know a caller who turned down at least two opportunities to call regularly on a certain night. The club didn't notify him he was terminated until June, and by that time the positions were filled by other callers.

The goal of this article is to encourage fairness and courtesy when dealing with callers. I'm sure this approach can be applied to other areas as well.

Helpful hint when making a gathered three-tier skirt: DON'T use pattern pieces, it's a waste of fabric. Measure your skirt length and figure the width of the three tiers, graduating each and allowing for hem and seams. Example: finished skirt is 22"

top tier is 6" wide middle tier 8" bottom tier 14"

Cut the tiers across the width of the fabric. $l\frac{1}{2}$ widths for the top tier

3 widths for the middle tier 5 or 6 widths for the bottom tier.

Four yards of $44^{\rm H}$ material will be enough to allow for extra length or error. Happy sewing and dancing. If you have any questions, or for more help, call me at the Shoppe.

LEGACY QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS ANNOUNCED
As part of LEGACYs long-standing commitment to function as a listening post for the activity, it distributed questionnaires in 36 states last summer. The basic purpose was to determine dancer attitudes on certain things. Additionally, LEGACY was looking for some useful information about how people get started in square dancing.

Oddly, the most important thing learned as a result of mailing out the questionnaires did not come from the questionnaires themselves. It came from the way they were filled out and returned. About 4,000 questionnaires were sent to LEGACY members for distribution to clubs in their area. An amazing 2,077 were returned! That total includes some reproduced locally when there was more demand for questionnaires than were mailed. The surprising return rate of more than 50% said one thing very succinctly: the dancers want a voice in their activity. Another fact that substantiated that conclusion was the 50,000-plus words written on the back of the questionnaires by the dancers, elaborating on their attitudes and desires for the activity.

The informational part of the questionnaire concerned what attracted each dancer to square dance lessons. The national average came out as follows (percentage figures add up to more than 100% because some checked more than one category):

The need for a nationwide means of determining dancers' attitudes and desires was defined at a LEGACY meeting. The questionnaire was the action and the results will help many of the callers and club leaders to be more responsive to the dancers' goals. Arrangements are underway to continue the survey so that attitude changes can be measured. Also LEGACY is working to expand future questionnaire distribution to develop a broader information base and provide statistically valid data for every state. Through the expanded questionnaire program, dancers will have the opportunity to express their needs directly and without cumbersome and expensive government
