Locally Mike is active in Callers Cooperative of Rochester, calls for six clubs and one class, and also conducts Plus 1 and 2 workshops.




Notes from the March 16 meeting

Ann O'Gorman, the corresponding secretary, urged clubs to submit up-to-date addresses of the president and federation representatives. New representatives were introduced.

Russ Jenkins announced a new policy for the PROMENADER schedule. Non-Federation club dances will be listed in the schedule for the convenience of subscribers provided the dance is otherwise announced by a paid ad.

DANCE O RAMA details were reported by Cay Jackson and Ruth Harris. Work assignments were completed when various clubs volunteered to host the graduate ball and to work on restoration. Frank Salvagio described the Tucker Award, presented to the club which has done the most to promote DANCE O RAMA that year. The Village Squares won in 1980. A dancer is usually honored for demonstrated leadership over an extended period. Cay Jackson was the most recent winner.

President Jim McCollum announced that our insurance does cover dancer injuries which are the result of negligence by a club or its officers, as requested at the February meeting. The cost to a club is \$1.00 for three couples. Those clubs desiring this coverage should enrol now.

New England is the place to go if you REALLY want to do lots of "country dancing." While the Rochester Country Dancers do about 85% of their dances in contra formation, this does not hold in most of the New England local dances where contras, traditional squares, couple dances (round and folk) and mixers are balanced in the programing.

Perhaps nowhere is this more in evidence than at the New England Folk Festival held in Natick, Mass., each This year the date is April 24-26, and more information is available from NEFFA at 309 Washington St. Wellesley Hills, MA 02181.

This is the 37th year of dancing for everyone of all ages--square, contra, round and folk. There will be international folk dance performances, folk music and song, international foods, folk bazaar, crafts, exhibits of folk art, and daytime sessions of music, song, dance, and crafts for children.

A special jamboree for youth groups is held Saturday morning from 9-12, and several teen Western square dance and clogging groups put on demonstrations alongside the international ethnic children's demos. There is a lot of family dancing--held in the main hall--for the whole festival, as well as "gung-ho" halls for the more experienced dancers who don't need as much instruction.

The interesting feature of this event is that it is a totally volunteer effort. No one gets paid! All the callers and all the musicians GIVE of their time and talents. It is a chance to hear all the bands from around the New England area. The ethnic halls are now beginning to see more live music as more of the musicians learn the necessary music. I understand that there will even be live music in the children's hall.

If any of you are traveling the Boston area April 24, do stop in for this fantastic event.

Of course, you don't have to miss out if April is not your time to be in New England. There is country dancing going on almost every day of every week somewhere around that area. Most of the groups are caller-run "clubs," which are really open dances in the community.



The new editors are doing a splendid job, but they still need all the cooperation they can get. Soooooo I'm going to help them by suggesting some ideas to give the PROMENADER a more interesting format.

My private survey shows that 60% of the readers look at the front page and then turn to their favorite club column. To break up this procedure, I suggest we take a tip from the most popular magazines and put in a centerfold picture. We could start with, say, Orlo Hoadley wearing a bolo tie and cowboy boots. Or how about a Jack Anderson column? Would be something like this: I got hold of some secret Rochester Federation papers. These papers answer some of the unanswered questions about the past editors of PROMENADER. Like, how did Roger and Nancy Dart have a program for DANCE O RAMA before it was printed in the PROMENADER? It was revealed at the Black Light Dance.

These secret papers also contain the answer as to why caller Art Harris was given a schedule that had no class dance on February 25, when there was a dance. Somebody made out on this. I won't reveal who, but ex-presidents Ed and Fran Tongue went to Florida.

Of course, if any court tries to make me testify as to how I got these secret Federation papers, I'll take the fifth, or even a quart. I don't care, they can't make me squeal on my square friends.



A <u>circle skirt</u> is one of the easier ones to make, and only takes 2 1/4 to 2 1/2 yards of material 45 inches wide. A pattern can be made from newspaper according to your own measurements.


Example: 26" waist, cut down 4"

28" waist, cut down 4 1/2"

30" waist, cut down 5"

then add the length you desire, plus 1 or 2 inches for the hem.

The diagram below is for a skirt 22 $1/2^{\prime\prime}$ long with a $26^{\prime\prime}$ waist.



An important thing to remember about a circle skirt is to let it hang a day before hemming. Circle skirts have a tendency to stretch on bias. So after hanging, measure evenly from waistband all around. Then hem it on the machine.

Country Twirlers
