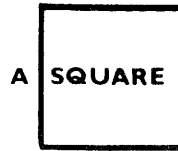
*Unexpected discovery of something wonderful.



When making a square dance dress it is important to get the waistline in a comfortable position. I have found that you can do this by taking a tape measure (or string) and putting it around your waist and marking the bodice at waistline (allowing for a little movement up and down).

If you don't want to wear a belt, a good finishing touch is to put cording (covered with bias strip of fabric) in the waistline. Stitch it to the bodice before attaching the skirt. For a little bit more give and better fit, put the cording just on the front and add elastic to the back. It seems like a lot more work but it's worth it in appearance and comfort. Twenty years! That's how old the PROMENADER will be in September.

Twenty years is also how long I have had the honor of writing for the PROMENADER. Sooooo, in celebration of, the editors have agreed to reprint some of the Hi-lites of this column. Sooooo.....

Where are we now? The holidays are over and the presents all exchanged. Even the bargains on last years Christmas cards are gone. Now is the time that memories of sugar plums, turkeys and egg nogs are coming to life on the bathroom scale.

I though I had come thru the holiday food storm fairly well, until my Taw (in white man's language--wife) said, "Why is it necessary for me to take four extra steps everytime we Do Sa Do?" Well, I can take a hint. So I'm going to lose some weight. How? I hate to cut down on my five meals a day sooooo I guess it will have to be by exercise, and by the most enjoyable of exercises, square dancing.

I went to a nutritionist, a Dr. Lotta Crisco, for information on calories versus exercise. She sent me to a specialist, a Dr. Ima Quack. He wrote that very popular book "How to Lose Weight Through Surgery". Sooooo after forty dollars later, I found the answers in the library. I broke down the amounts and converted the calories used into movements. Maybe you too can use the following table.

CALORIE BURNING TABLE

Allemande Left	burns up...10	calories
Half Sashay.....	15	cal.
Whole Sashay.....	30	cal.
Star Thru.....	5	cal.
Allemande Thar to a Star..	20	cal.
	30	(if you wound up off center)
Ocean Wave.....	25	Cal. (if your partner rocks with you)
	40	(if they rock against you)
Tea Cup Chain	50	cal. for Taws
		½ cal. for Paws
Ahsoo.....	10	cal. (40 if you do Ferris Wheel instead)
Quetch (Yellow Rock).....	5	cal. (double hug...7½)

Each Goof is 15 calories but remember while you are standing you are not losing, soooo jump up and down while you are waiting. Who knows maybe the Caller will call "Jump up and down." Ask your Caller to call high calorie figures to reduce your figures. "Peel off" "Cast off", anything to get it off.

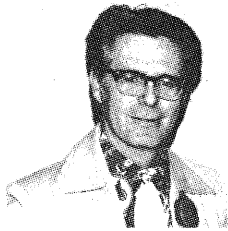
During a complete night of dancing you may burn up about 800 calories but after the dance..

A "Coffee and" after party is about 500 cal. replaced.

A "Foam and Bubbles" after party equals about 790 calories replaced.

Add it all up and see how you make out, as for myself, I can see a loss of 10 calories a week. At this rate I'll be like Twiggy in...oh..1998.

Carmens Column

In the September issue of the PROMENADER, I ran a poll to get dancer opinion on some subjects. I received a total of 32 responses and thank those who took the trouble to answer. Here's the results.

1. For a caller reading his material throughout the evening, 41% minded, 32% didn't mind at all and 27% didn't care one way or the other.
2. When they saw a caller reading his material while calling, 41% thought he really worked hard preparing, 36% thought he didn't do his homework and 18% thought he was a new caller.
3. When their square breaks down frequently, 66% are annoyed, 31% couldn't care less and 3% are happy.
4. When the caller got lost and couldn't get them back to their corner throughout the evening, 84% didn't like it, 10% didn't care and 4% thought it was perfectly o.k.
5. Most important for an enjoyable evening, 45% picked interesting choreography, 20% like music with a good beat, another 20% rated dancing with friends, 9% liked learning new calls and 6% though that not breaking down rated highly.
6. 59% noticed the caller and 41% didn't, sometime during the evening while they were dancing.

In retrospect, this poll has flaws because some questions were vague and it didn't take into account the dance level and dancer experience. For example, one would not expect a caller to read his material at an open house for new dancers, but it is not considered unusual at an advanced level dance. In the former, the caller reads because he is new and hasn't prepared well, but at an advanced level dance he does so because of the difficulty of committing to memory the vast amount of material and variety demanded by dancers at that level. Nevertheless, this does tell something about what a group of dancers think about what goes on at the dance. Next time, I'd like to get some information about people in class to get their opinion before they drop out.

Country Dancers

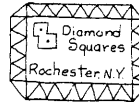
