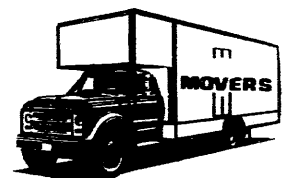

Ed never talked about a commitment's having to be honored. He simply worked steadily and competently toward the fulfillment of any promise he'd made. When Ed said he'd do something, you could relax.

Ed never told me that he thought every person had some merit, but I can remember watching him listen to someone saying something with which Ed totally disagreed. Ed was smiling. I could see that the smile represented an effort for him. It was Ed's gift to that person, his acknowledgement that at some other time on some other topic the smile would be richly deserved.

Reality has forced us to say goodbye to part of Ed Cuthbert. We don't have to say goodbye to the examples that touched our hearts.

When we receive, and we give in return; when we complete well what we have promised to do; when we grant the momentarily unearned smile -- Ed will be here with us. He gave us these gifts, largely unasked for. For us, from now, all we have to do is show our appreciation.

So I finish as I began.

Caller Profile



Mike Harris

Many of you know that I have grown up with square dancing. Art Harris, my father, has been called one of the most versatile, creative and smooth callers in the business. (I have to agree, perhaps I'm biased.) I've had the opportunity to see many of the nationally known callers that my father has hosted at his home, work and call. The talent of Rochester callers is at par, if not better, with many of them.

In 1979, I moved to Rochester and began my association with the Belles and Beaus, Swinging Singles, and the Merry Mixers. Art Harris, Jerry Carmen and Mike Callahan have been very instrumental in helping me along the rocky road of a new caller. A very special thanks to them. I also thank Dick Casper, Chuck Priester, and other caller for their assistance also. Betty Carmen, Mike & Linda Liberti, and Bob Slomsinski have helped both Jody Mattice and myself to develop as cuers. (Jody is my favorite partner in all of the things I do, and is a fine round dance cuer.)

This fall I will be calling for: Merry Mixers, Penn Yan Friendship Squares, and Which Way Whirlers. My classes will be: Merry Mixers, Penn Yan Friendship Squares, and Village Squares. I often call for the Student Union of Buffalo State College, and the Marriott Hotel Chain throughout western New York. On September 25, Jody and I will be guest caller and cuer for the first time for Harris Squares. (That's Dad's large club in Buffalo.) Many clubs have invited us to be their guest caller and cuer this coming season also. Bless those clubs willing to give new callers and cuers the opportunity to develop. We're sure looking forward to meeting more of the most wonderful people in the world, square dancers.

My goal in calling is to never lose sight of the fact that square dancing is fun and the FUN must be kept in!

Contra Corner

Country Dancers is now in it's sixth year. Much of our success is due to one of our members that helped us to organize---and a member of our original band. We owe so very much to Skip Evans, piano and penny whistle member of the Blackthorn Ceilidh Band. Skip died of cancer last month at the young age of 40. We shall truly miss his music and his willingness to be of service to anyone who asked. He had recently taken up calling and had a great future in that line as well. Country Dancers will never again be quite the same. There was only one Skip.

On a lighter note--we will be having a guest caller on Thursday, the 23rd--and for the advanced dance, Saturday the 30th. Roger Wynot calls squares and contras for the New England Square Dance Convention and has called at the Flaming Leaves Festival in Lake Placid. He works with club square dancers very well and if you haven't had a chance to dance with us yet--this might be the right time. The dance on the 30th (Sat.) will have walk-thrus--but no instruction. Dancers are expected to know "contra corners" "heys" and how to progress in "triples". The dance on the 23rd is open to everyone.

Our annual open house (a free dance) will be on the 16th. Dick Bolt (Blackthorn fiddle player) is putting together another band called the All Stars. Ed will call.

For new club members--and those in classes, Country Dancers is something a little different...and you can be part of it. Try us, you might like what we do.

Parking can sometimes be a problem on Rosedale St. There is a fenced in parking lot at the end of the block which the church owns---and until the snow builds up, use it if you can't find "on street" spots.

Be sure to wear casual clothes (men, short sleeves or T-shirts are o.k.)--and wear your dance shoes. You may come as couples--but singles are always welcomed.

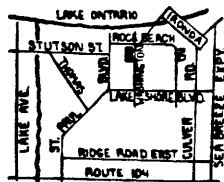

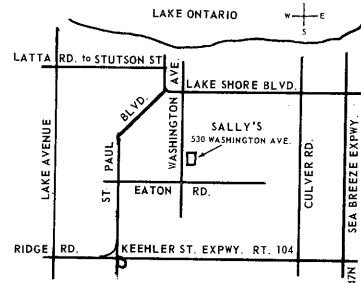

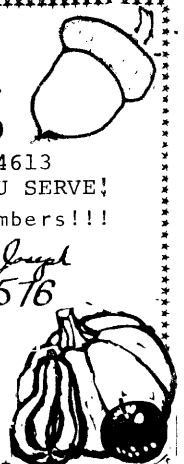

Country Dancers

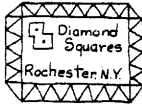
