CARMEN'S COLUMN



When I first began square dancing, one of the things that distinguished eastern from western square dancing was mixing. At eastern style dances, it was not uncommon to come with your own square and only dance with them the entire evening. At the western dance, there were no set squares and everyone danced with different people each tip. The mixer dance, usually done in a large circle, was a regular part of the evening and everyone joined in. As progress set in and western style square dancing grew, so did little groups of people who would only dance with each other. Why, at some clubs you could dance for years and never get to dance with certain people!

Some callers and far-sighted dancers, realizing this was not good for club growth and spirit, devised different ways of encouraging people to mix (as couples) during the evening. By far, the most successful method to evolve has been the NUMBER SYSTEM.

There are different number systems, but the concept of them all is to assign each couple a number and set up squares by grouping four number together, preferably in a random fashion. The groupings are changed every tip. The location of each square on the floor is determined by the caller. Square #1 might be the front square to the caller's left, square #2 in the middle front, etc. So, each tip during the evening you would be assigned a different position on the floor with a different group. This also means you don't have to worry about sitting out because you weren't fast enough to get into a square, you won't insult your friends by not dancing with them all evening and all the beginners won't group together in the back of the hall. There are usually not enough to make even squares, but all will have an equal opportunity to dance and to sit one out. Those who wish to sit one out can always exchange with a couple for that tip. Persons whose partner cannot dance can sign in as a couple and dance with the partner of someone who is sitting out. Usually the first and last tip of the evening are open for everyone to square up as they wish. If you come with friends you can reserve this time for them.

Callers like this because it "evens out the floor", and provides for a more congenial group. Disadvantages are, it's cumbersome with large groups and difficult to compensate for a significant number of early leavers. Complaints have been, "too mechanical" and "can't dance with my friends".

Currently, the number system is popular only with advanced/challenge groups where it has effectively served to mix dancers of different experience and ability and provide a better evening for all.

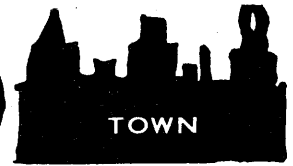
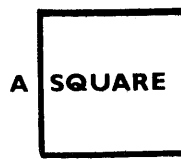
CCR News

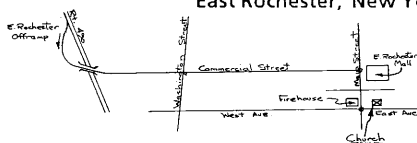

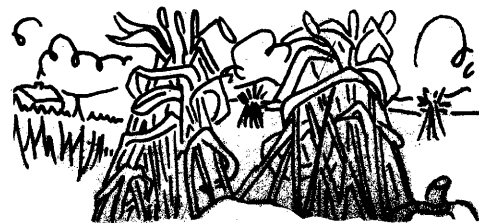

Contra Corner



Last month I mentioned Art Teamerson's square dances in Riga. Art's dances are lots of fun---and he works with his own band. These square dances have been going some 25 years or so and while the dancers have changed over the last couple years---the dances are still the same. Art specializes in the singing calls popular in the 40's and 50's---known to some of us as "eastern squares". Many of the dances were also being called at the time by Floyd Woodhull's group in Elmira, New York. No prior knowledge is really necessary---new people take the #4 position in the square. The action of most of the squares is progressive. Couple #1 leads to the right (or whatever) working with the #2 couple, then the #3 couple, etc. It's a real fun night for couples looking for weekend dancing. Dancing begins at 9 p.m. which gives you time to go out for dinner before the dance. (Ed and I like to have dinner in Churchville.) The other feature of Art's dances that I especially like is the "round dancing". Actually, it's ballroom dancing---with the lights dimmed---between the square dance tips. The music? The tunes of the 40's mostly, but the foxtrot---jitter---bug---waltz and polka.

While dancers usually come as couples and there is not much mixing---Art always does patty-cake polka, or some other "mixer" towards to beginning of the evening before a break. Last year there were some high school students there---but generally it's a 40+ age group.

Riga dances are held at the Congregational Church at the intersection of rounts 36 and 33A from 9 to 12 midnight. The schedule this year is November 6th and 20th; December 4th and 18th; January 8th and 22nd; February and March 5th and 19th and the last dances of the season April 2nd and 16th. Square dance clothing can be worn---but any kind of street clothing is okay. It's for you---and your friends and neighbors. Make up a square and join us in Riga! Try some "Traditional" dancing---just for the fun of it!

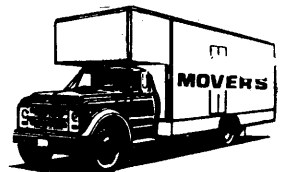

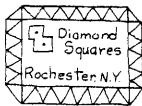
Country Twirlers

There are three squares in the A-1 group on Tuesday nights with Dick Casper. They are all working hard and having fun. All A-1 dancers are welcome.

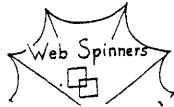
Two special events are on the calendar for this month. On November 1st we'll have our Mystery Ride. We hope to have a good turnout to see where our ride will take us.

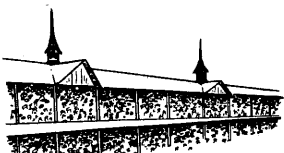

The National Executive Committee of the National Square Dance Convention and CALLERLAB are proud to announce that CALLERLAB will again be responsible for the annual Callers' Seminar to be held in conjunction with the National Square Dance Convention in Louisville, Kentucky on June 23, 24 and 25, 1983.

The National Executive Committee began sponsoring these seminars with the 1974 convention in San Antonio. Each year since that time, the panelists have all been members of CALLERLAB. In Milwaukee in 1979, the National Executive Committee turned over responsibility for the conduct of the seminar to CALLERLAB for the staffing and administrative details associated with the conduct of these seminars. This arrangement has proven satisfactory to all interested parties and the net result has been an on-going quality education program for all callers. These seminars are geared towards all callers regardless of skill level or affiliation with CALLERLAB.

These seminars are staffed with CALLERLAB accredited Caller-Coaches whenever possible. If additional callers are needed, callers actively engaged in caller training are used provided they are members of CALLERLAB. The topics to be covered during the scheduled twelve (12) hours of the seminar are taken from the CALLERLAB approved curriculum and are decided upon by the CALLERLAB Executive Committee based on the expertise of those staffing the sessions.

If you are a caller and plan to attend the National Square Dance Convention in Louisville, plan to attend as many of these panels as possible. Each session is independent from the others and all sessions are geared towards general calling skills. All choreographic sessions are limited to the use of Mainstream figures and terms since this has the widest applicability in the square dance picture. Each session is scheduled for two (2) hours and there are six (6) periods scheduled. It does not provide the same degree of education as a full callers' college but it does bring the expertise of several well qualified Caller-Coaches to various parts of the country at a convenient time.

The NEC and CALLERLAB feel that education forms a large part of their responsibilities to the activity and fully support these seminars as well as all educational topics presented at the various NSDCs.

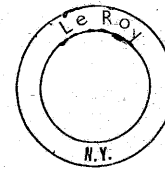

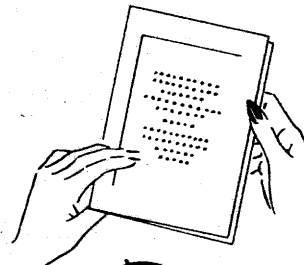
