## CARMEN'S COLUMN

OPINION - The Problem With Classes

It seems year after year we ask ourselves, where have all the recent grads gone? This topic seems to crop up among callers and dancers at seminars, meetings, informal discussions, in magazines and newsletters. Everyone has an opinion and I have mine. The way I see it, they leave because they are no longer having fun. They struggle through 30-odd lessons, week after week, steady in attendance, faithful to their class and sponsoring club. As long as they were having fun, they were there. No phone calls were necessary, no letters needed to be sent. What happens after graduation that takes the FUN out of dancing - at least for most graduates?

**POOR PREPARATION** The purpose of classes should be to provide an adequate foundation for them to dance successfully with the club. The general dancing level of

the class at graduation, more often than not, is very different from that of the club and new grads find they cannot dance comfortably. Club and class have different callers and often, calling styles are so different, this alone scares many. The club caller may not know where the class is at, so he may "kill" them on their first dance as club members.

**FEWER "MAINSTREAM" CLUBS** Plus level dancing is the "in" thing today and it is generally accepted - at least among callers - that dancers cannot learn all calls to the PLUS level in 30 weeks. Is it really fair to graduate our dancers at mainstream level into our PLUS level club? How can we tell them to join a class, go through the lessons, and they'll be a full-fledged club member able to dance with the club, then on graduation tell them they're not done yet, but they must go through a series of workshops to be able to dance anywhere?

**WHO IS RESPONSIBLE** I saw a letter a short while ago that stated dancer and caller associations should set up programs to further train dancers. First of all, by then, most of the damage is done. Second, the dancer association and most callers have very little influence on club policies.

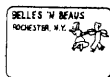
Responsibility for training someone to dance with your club lies solely with your club. If you want that person to stay with your club, your club had better provide him with enough training so he can. Do not tell him he'll be ready when he graduates, and then tell him after he graduates he's really not ready.

**CONCLUSION** Clubs should graduate their classes at the level the club dances or the club should be willing to dance at the level the class graduates. Most people would rather remain with their current class longer than be shuttled about to other workshops.

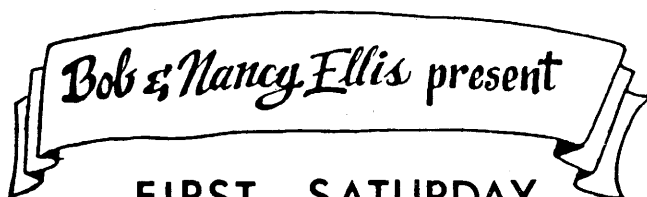
## Letter to the Editor:
