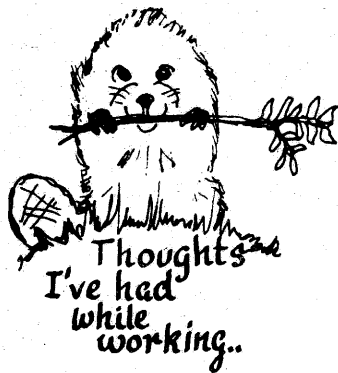

Booklets for the signatures are 25¢ (for an individual or couple) and the dangles are \$1.25 each. Ask your Fed. rep. or any Federation officer about getting either one.

Silver is the color this year. Twenty-fifth Dance-O-Rama! The first one was April 18, 1959. There weren't many clubs or dancers at that time. Another silver anniversary is the Swinging Eights. This club was started by a caller, Tink Tinkler. They became a club in the fall of 1958. Bud and Fran McComber, Russ and Doris Jenkins helped put it all together. Both couples are still helping, dancing, goofing and just plain having fun at the Swinging Eights.

This is also the silver year for Bud and Fran at Dance-O-Rama. If you went this year, you probably heard that they have attended all twenty five O-Ramas. Boy, that's a long time to go without being sick or something. Of course Bud doesn't get too tired at a dance because he stands a lot. In fact I can remember many times we stood together.

More silver anniversaries are coming. Vince and Barb Ferricelli tell me that Irondequoit Squares will be celebrating next spring. The squares were known as the Pizza Promenaders in the old days. This was because when the last Promenade was called (Don Kennedy calling), they would Promenade down to the Pizza Parlor.

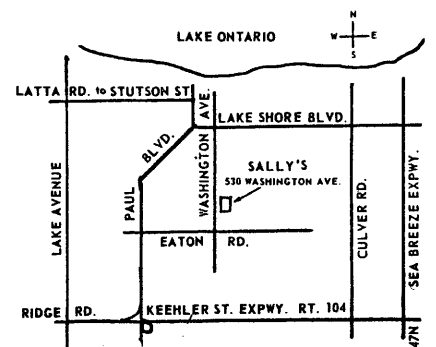

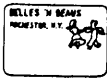

Leadership Award

The Daphne-Norma Leadership Award came into existence at the 1977 Dance-O-Rama. It is named for its original founders, Daphne & John Fink and Norma & Frank Salvagio. This pair of dedicated and active square dance couples spotted a need to recognize outstanding couples or individuals in the Square Dance Community. The Finks and Salvagios contributed the original trophy and initiated a system whereby it would be self-perpetuating.

Each year the previous three recipients meet to choose the next year's recipient. Because of the many outstanding and deserving individuals in this Square Dance Community, to choose but one individual or couple becomes a task indeed!! This individual must have shown unusual dedication to the Square and/or Round Dance life of our community. There is no single requirement that is considered, but the combination of all the individual's contributions is considered.

When the recipient is finally chosen, his name and the year are engraved on the silver tray set, and a small plaque. He will keep the small plaque and will pass the tray set on to the next recipient the following year.

Even though this is a private award, Dance-O-Rama allows its presentation each year during the ceremonies and Rochester Area Federation covers the engraving expense.

SQUARE DANCE PUBLICATIONS

From the club newsletter to the nationally-circulated magazines, square-dance periodicals are a valuable form of communication to everyone. They let us know where dances are, what the clubs in our area and throughout the country are doing, who the traveling callers are, and how to contact them. They publish readers' letters and articles from leaders all over on attitudes, techniques, problems and solutions, and just about anything you can think of concerning square dancing. Let's divide publications into two groups - local and national - and discuss their value to us.

LOCAL Some square-dance friends are visiting us and we want to go to a dance that night. Where are the listings? Why, in our local publication, the PROMENADER, of course. We would be missing out on a lot of fun if we didn't visit other clubs and attend special dances. Do you want to know if your favorite caller is calling on a certain night? Check the PROMENADER. Check your own PROMENADER; don't rely on checking someone else's copy. Publications cannot exist without funds, and their main source of funds is subscribers. To keep them going and alive we need to support them by paying for subscriptions. We are very fortunate in our area to have dedicated individuals who donate many hours of their time each month to get the PROMENADER to us. Without them and you, the subscriber, we would be without the communication link that so many of us rely on.

NATIONAL Do you want greater insight into our square-dance hobby? Do you wonder about what's going on in the rest of the square-dance world? Are you a new dancer or club officer and want to know "how it's done" in club organization? What about caller-dancer relationships? Do you want to buy a record, P.A. system, special apparel, fun badges, or almost anything else you can think of? Are you traveling out of state and want to attend a festival, weekend, campout, etc?... All of these questions and more can be answered by the national publications. Many of our problems result from not being well-informed. I suggest that each club and each person in a leadership position should subscribe to at least one national publication.
