#### ROCHESTER AREA FEDERATION MEETINGS

Three copies of the minutes of the meetings of the Rochester Area Federation of Western Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc. (take a new breath) are mailed out to each of the affiliated clubs: one copy to the President of the club and one copy to each of two pairs or couples of club representatives. There's no way that the Corresponding Secretary of the Federation can send mail to somebody whose name & address she/he doesn't know. It is the responsibility of somebody from the club to see that the Secretary is kept informed of the names and addresses of the current occupants of these positions. If somebody out there doesn't know what's going on because he/she isn't getting a copy of the minutes that she/he is supposed to get, better make sure that the Corresponding Secretary knows who and where you are!

Federation meetings are rotated from Monday to Thursday night of the week, so that the interference with club dances is held to a minimum, and doesn't always happen to the reps of the same clubs.

Dance with 25 callers and get their signatures in the Silver Club booklet, to earn the right to wear a very special rich-looking dangle. At least 15 of the callers must be Federation callers. A Federation caller is one who is a regular caller or class teacher for a Federation club, or a member of the Callers' Cooperative of Rochester, which is one of the groups affiliated with the Federation.

Up to 10 of the signatures may be visiting callers at any Federation club or Federation-sponsored dance, for instance Dance-O-Rama. Callers that aren't eligible to go in your Silver Club booklet are any out-of-town callers at an out-of-town dance that you may be visiting on vacation (but we hope you will get their signatures in your Century Club booklet).

Eligible callers were listed on the back cover of the booklet when it was printed, but there have been some changes since then. For instance, Jack Barnes has become the regular caller for the Country Twirlers in place of Jim McQuade, so Jack is OK but Jim no longer qualifies to be one of the 15 local callers.

If you have any questions or want to get booklets, ask your Federation representative, one of the Federation officers, or call 225-2796. If you get your booklet now, you will be all set to get the signatures of three or four of the visiting callers at Dance-O-Rama, and four of the local callers at the CCR Trail-in dance (**2**)on April 28.



Carmen's Column

We are fortunate in this area to have a callers organization that comprises most of the callers in the Rochester area who work reasonably well together. That organization is the Callers Co-op of Rochester otherwise known as the CCR. Many of you are probably not aware there is a callers organization and most probably do not know how we are organized nor what we do.

Basically, our organization is set up to provide fellowship and the free exchange of ideas amoung callers, as well as to promote personal improvement. We want to help develop better callers and leaders which in turn will help sustain the square dance activity we enjoy so much in the Rochester area. Membership is not limited to callers but is available to anyone who desires to improve modern square and round dance leadership

All this is fine, you say, but how can the CCR serve YOU, the dancer, directly? The CCR is not an exclusive group and there are many ways you can have an imput to express your views. Our direct connections to dancers are (1) the individual caller-member, (2) the Rochester Area Federation of Clubs, (3) our monthly meetings, and (4) the U.S. mail. The CCR welcomes constructive criticism and we are eager to promote or discuss any ideas which will improve the square dance picture. Since we are an organisation of callers, ours is an ideal place to contact if you need a caller for a special project or even to interview for your club. Is there something unethical or disturbing that is bothering you? Ours is the place to bring it up. Do you need an opinion on calls, callers or programs? See us. You can approach us with virtually anything you want except personal attacks on individuals. We try not to deal with personalities. Here's some more about our avenues of communication:

(1) The caller-member. Got something you want to say? Discuss it with your club caller who probably is a CCR member. If he feels it is worthwhile, he will be glad to bring up your topic for discussion.

(2) The Federation. The CCR is a member of the Federation and we generally have a representative there. Approach us by that means through your Federation representative.

(3) Our monthly meetings. Our meetings are generally open to anyone who wishes to attend. They are held once a month on a Sunday afternoon. To find out about them ask any caller. To promote communication between callers and dancers, we sponsor a leadership conference in cooperation with the Federation. The square dance community is invited to attend and this would be an excellent time to express your views.

(4) The U.S. mail. Are you better at writing than speaking? The CCR meetings are guided by two elected members called Moderators. At present, Mike Callahan and myself, Jerry Carmen are the CCR moderators. Drop us a line.

The Callerlab Plus Quarterly Selection Committee has announced that the Plus Quarterly Selection for the second quarter of 1984 is

CHASE THE TAG (Right, Left, In, Out) From couples back-to-back, right-side dancers right-face U-Turn Back, left-side dancers Fold. All finish as in Tag the Line, then take the facing command (Right, Left, In, Out) is one is given. Variations would include: Chase the Half Tag, Chase the 3/4 Tage. Note that if no facing direction is given, the movement ends as in Tag the Line, with dancers in single file awaiting the next command.

Timing: 6 beats.
