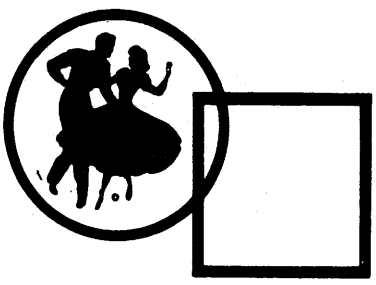

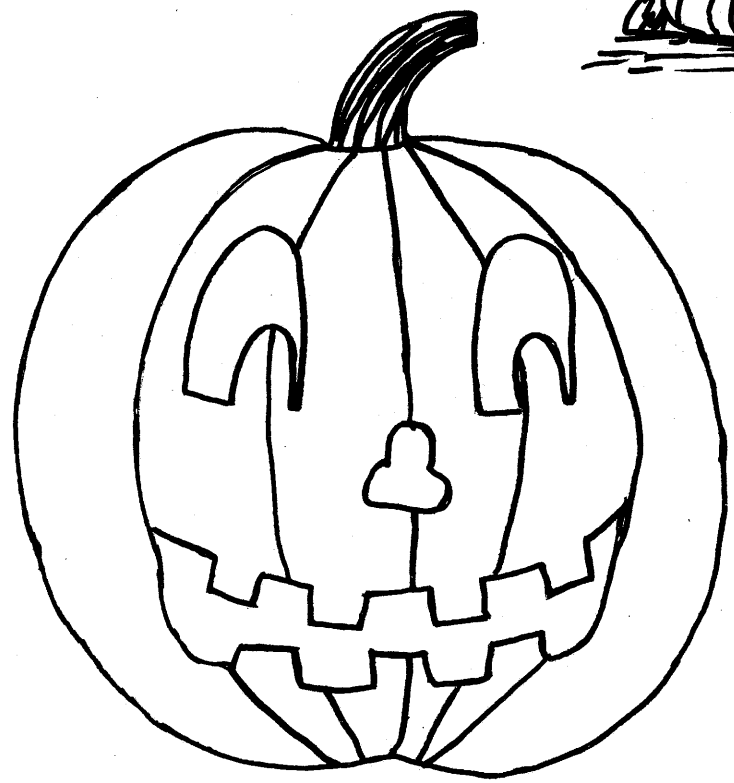

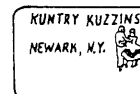


Swinging Eights
