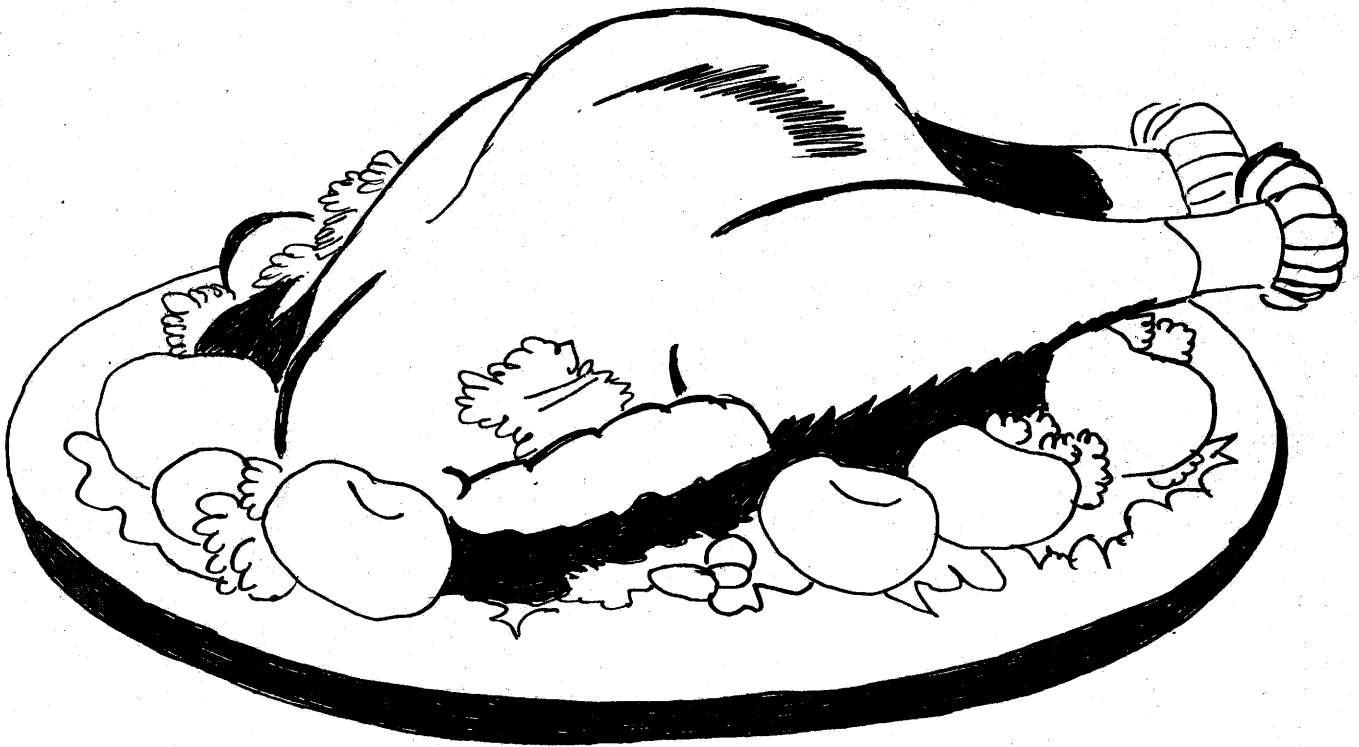

As Thanksgiving approaches we are thankful for many things - our health, families, and friends.

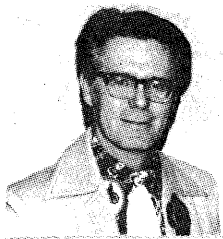
As Promenader editors, we thank Joyce Ford for the cover this month. Joyce has joined our staff to help with paste-ups.

Carmen's Column

Jerry Carmen

Square dancing is one of the few activities where the beginners are mixed with the experienced "players" and not given a handicap. Yet, they are expected to perform with equal agility. With the proliferation of the PLUS and advanced groups, square dancing is becoming divided into plateaus. Too many dancers are becoming involved in workshops aiming toward these specialty groups without having adequate dancing experience or the time to devote to it. We like to say that square dancing is for everyone, but let me tell you - the Plus and advanced groups are NOT for everyone. I wish there were clear guidelines defining who should participate and who should not, both to save the aspiring dancer the embarrassment and frustration of not being able to perform and to save the accomplished dancer the frustration of having to consistently pull certain people through to keep the square from breaking down. This is true especially at the advanced level where everyone is eventually expected to carry his own weight in the square.

If you are a new dancer or someone who only likes to dance once or twice a month you should not take a workshop to a more advanced program just because your friends are. This could lead to confusion and embarrassment to you and probably even cause you to be disappointed enough to drop out of the activity. Too many are doing this and too many are dropping out needlessly because they bit off more than they were prepared to chew. Realizing there are different degrees of complexity requiring more experience to execute, you should analyze where you are and what you hope to get out of square dancing before you make such a step. Most of these programs require several years of dancing experience before the average dancer can comfortably step up. Give yourself this little test:

1. Am I still having fun at my present club?
2. Do I have problems dancing comfortably at any of the area clubs that dance a similar level to mine?
3. If someone in my square becomes confused, does it confuse me also?
4. Do I become completely disoriented if someone calls the basic or mainstream calls from other positions?
5. Do the squares I am in break down often (maybe you are the cause and don't realize it!)?
6. Do I like to dance with the old timers because they pull me through?
7. Have I been dancing under two years since I began learning to dance?
8. Do I forget what I have just learned between dances?
9. Do I sit out two or more tips a night?
10. Do I only dance with my home club and caller?

If you answered YES to most of these questions, perhaps you ought to consider remaining in the present program you are dancing. Your primary concern should be that you are comfortable and happy at the level you are currently dancing - not what you are told or think you are supposed to know to be considered a "good" dancer. One of the major problems with some of the people in the Plus and advanced programs today is they are top heavy. That is, they don't have sufficient experience dancing the BASIC and MAINSTREAM programs. It is ridiculous to watch dancers who can get through LOAD THE BOAT and SPIN CHAIN THE GEARS break down on PASS THE OCEAN, SLIDE THRU and SCOOT BACK.

As a closing note, remain in the program you are now in until you feel you have mastered all there is available for you to learn and only then, consider going on to the next level. This way you will give yourself and those around you a fair shake.

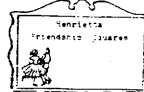
Promenading B's

Dancing is in full swing at Henrietta Friendships, and everyone is enjoying themselves. Ron tells us that the new class members are doing great.

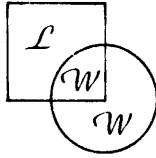

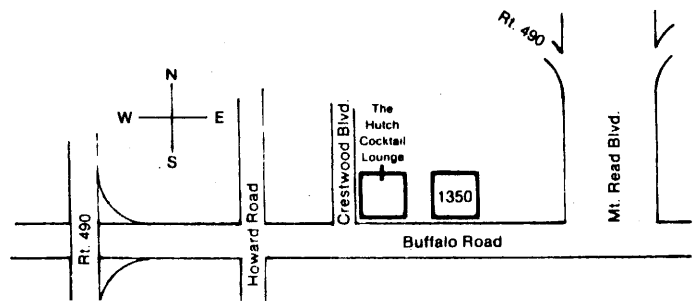

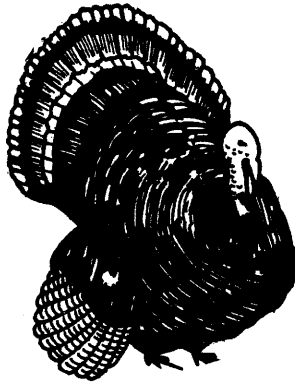
Our Annual Christmas Dinner Dance will be held on December 13th. Mark your calendar now and reserve the date; it's only a little over a month away.
