RIGA  MONROE

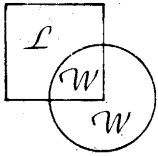

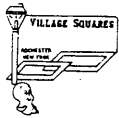
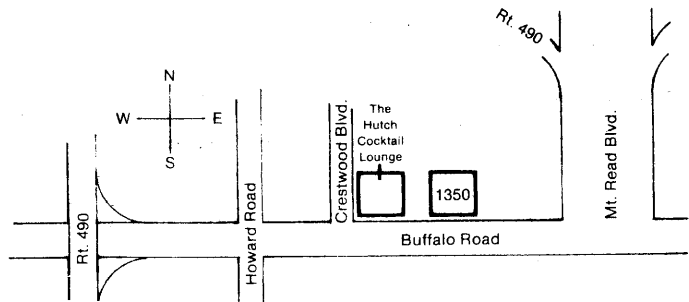

## With Petticoats Swirling, Square Dancing Keeps Fans

ROCHESTER — They were triple-scotching, exploding the line and spin-chaining the gears.

They cast a shadow. They cross-fired. They even loaded the boat and peeled the top.

Yessir.

Across the well-worn wooden floor of the church gymnasium, the six squares collapsed, flattening out only to blossom open again as 24 couples followed the sometimes staccato call of Bob Ellis.

"This is modern square dancing," Mr. Ellis, a former dairy farmer turned full-time caller, said a bit later. A rhinestone-edged, oval silver tag on his checked Western shirt read, "Bob Ellis — Caller."

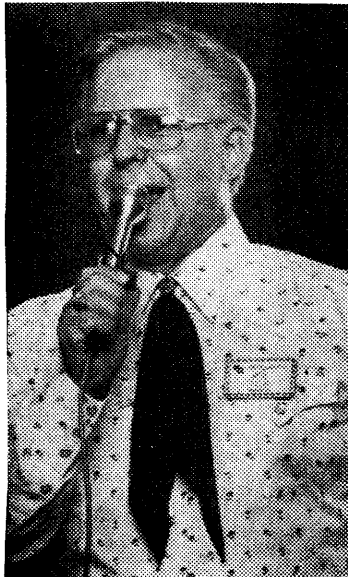
Modern square dancing, or Western dancing, is a far cry from the blocky, repetitive drill that is known as Eastern square dancing and for nearly a century has been bringing groans from school children who had to learn it.

### Eastern and Western Styles

Eastern square dancing is physically rougher. Western dancing, Bob Ellis stresses, is more precise, more practiced and much harder to learn.

"It takes 30 weeks to graduate from the basic square-dance course," Mr. Ellis says of Western dancing. That doesn't include the 11 extra weeks of lessons anyone who is anyone in square dancing also takes.

And to dance with Mr. Ellis in the church, well that's another year of work. Of course, at the end of that time, a couple can peel the top with the best of them.



Across the country, more than 9,000 Western square-dance clubs gather each week to dance, from groups still mired in the basics to those in the rarified world of "challenge" dancing.

There are clubs across Europe. Tasmania in the South Pacific has 14. Tokyo has 13. But one place where no one square dances is New York City, according to the National Square Dance Directory.

### 37 Clubs in Rochester

Here in Rochester, there are 37 square-dance clubs — with as many as 50 couples in each — and on any given night, 6 of them will be holding dances. On Wednesdays, the Diamond Squares gather to dance to Mr. Ellis's call.

Bob Ellis, natty in his tan cowboy boots and black silk scarf, set up a speaker hooked to a special 45-r.p.m. record player in a black case. From another case, he extracted a stack of well-used black records with titles like "Cabbage," by the Bayou Ramblers; "Dottie's Cloggin' Breakdown," by H. Craft, and "Stay a Little Longer," by the Road Runners.

In a lemon-yellow dress, its skirt puffed out by layer upon layer of white petticoats, Joyce Ford sat down after a particularly prolonged tip, as a single dance is called. "I've been square dancing for 15 years," she said, after sipping a cup of water. "It's a cheap night — \$4 a couple for an evening of dancing."

Up on the platform, Mr. Ellis was calling: "Explode and double-star through. Girls run around boys."

Dressing for square dancing, Mrs. Ford said, waving toward the swirl of petticoats, is serious business. "Dresses can cost up to \$80 or \$100," she said. "And then there's petticoats, Pettipants."

For the fervent, square dancing is a way of life.

"I was married in square-dance clothes," said Chris Statts, who was wearing a gray-green, floral-print dress.

She and her husband recently returned from a square-dance camp at Sampson State Park in the Finger Lakes area. "You get up and dance at 10 o'clock, you eat lunch, you dance at 1," she said. "There's a round dance at 3, then cocktails and supper and a dance from 8 to 11." Round dancing is a countrified form of ballroom dancing for couples.

During the tip, squares of four couples each seemed to weave effortlessly around one another, linking arms here, bumping hips there, all in response to the patter of Mr. Ellis.

### 'Off the Top of My Head'

"The dancer has no idea where he is going," Mr. Ellis said. "It's strictly choreography off the top of my head. Everything I call is extemporaneous."

A bit like jazz improvisation in its unpredictability, accomplished square-dance calling seeks smoothness in the dancers' movement from one position to another, through perhaps 150 positions during the course of the evening.

"It ends," Mr. Ellis said of each tip, "when I decide to resolve it. At the end, you always hear 'allemande

left,' and if everything has worked well the couples will be back to the original position. I want them to succeed, because if they don't succeed then I don't succeed."

Western square dancing started to become standardized about 1950, Mr. Ellis said. "When people traveled from one county to the next, they couldn't dance because each county danced differently."

### When Bored, 'You Move On'

Standardization involved determining how each movement — star thru, bend the line, box the gnat, for example — would be performed and at what level of dancing knowledge it would be required. For basic dancing nearly 100 moves must be learned.

"When you feel you're bored at the level you're at, you move on," said Marie Heisler, who drives in from Pittsford with her husband Bud to dance here.

There are 11 levels of dancing, from basic to C-4. The latter is the highest level of "challenge" dancing, a level with moves of such complexity that it is danced in very few places.

Most of the clubs offer dance classes in addition to the regular dance nights. And the callers serve as the instructors.

Callers from across the country belong to an association called Callerlab, which oversees the development of the art. Callerlab sets the rules for square dancing, from the program of movements needed at each level to giving its imprimatur to experimental movements. Experimentals, as they are called, can eventually be incorporated into a program if callers agree that they work well.

### 26,000 Dancers at Convention

Each year, there is a national square-dance convention. At this year's meeting, which was held in Baltimore in June, 26,000 dancers from across the country danced day and night for three days to hash calls — as the patter of calling is referred to — by callers from around the world.

"Your reaction time has to be pretty good," said Cay Jackson, the budget officer for the town of Gates, who dances twice a week with Len Prescott. At the age of 74, Mr. Prescott says, he runs around "looking for quarters for my pacemaker."

"Good callers," Cay Jackson continued, "have good timing, they do their homework, are excellent choreographers and will call to the level of the floor."

After two and a half hours, Mr. Ellis sang, "That's all," and everyone clapped.

"The hardest thing to do," he said, as he packed up his record player, "is to get someone out to give it a try. Once you start, you'll never stop."
