Because Norma Twietmeyer is recuperating from surgery, we are writing the news this month. Our thoughts and prayers are with you, Norma.

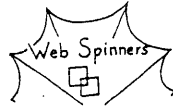

Sid and Jean VanApeldoorn, you and your committees delivered a great production at the St. Patrick's Day Dance. Thanks for a great job!

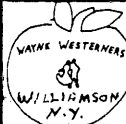

JANUARY 1, 1985

The parade time was blessed with good weather-clear blue skies-temperature of 65 degrees. The dancers for the float were picked by lot at a meeting of the United Square Dancers of America held in Baltimore at the National Square Dance Convention. Four states were represented by the dancers: Kansas, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, and California. The alternates were from California and will automatically be on the 1986 float.

Decorating of the float started in early November and was fully underway by December 26, 1984. All of the time spent on decorating is volunteered by the square dancers from the Los Angeles area.

The float dancers spend most of their time practicing for the judging which takes place a couple of days before the actual parade. The official dress and accessories are all donated by suppliers from California.

The 1985 float was the tenth float sponsored by the Square Dancers of America. These floats have served to bring square dancing to the attention of a minimum of 300 million people in Europe, Africa, North and South America, Japan, Taiwan, India, Australia, and the Philippines. None of this would be possible without the donations from the square dancers and the dedicated efforts of all the committees, associations, clubs, and friends of square dancing.

Sally and Walt Baechle are the local representatives for the Square Dancers of America and will be promoting the sale of the roses to put on your badge. Look for more information in a future issue.
