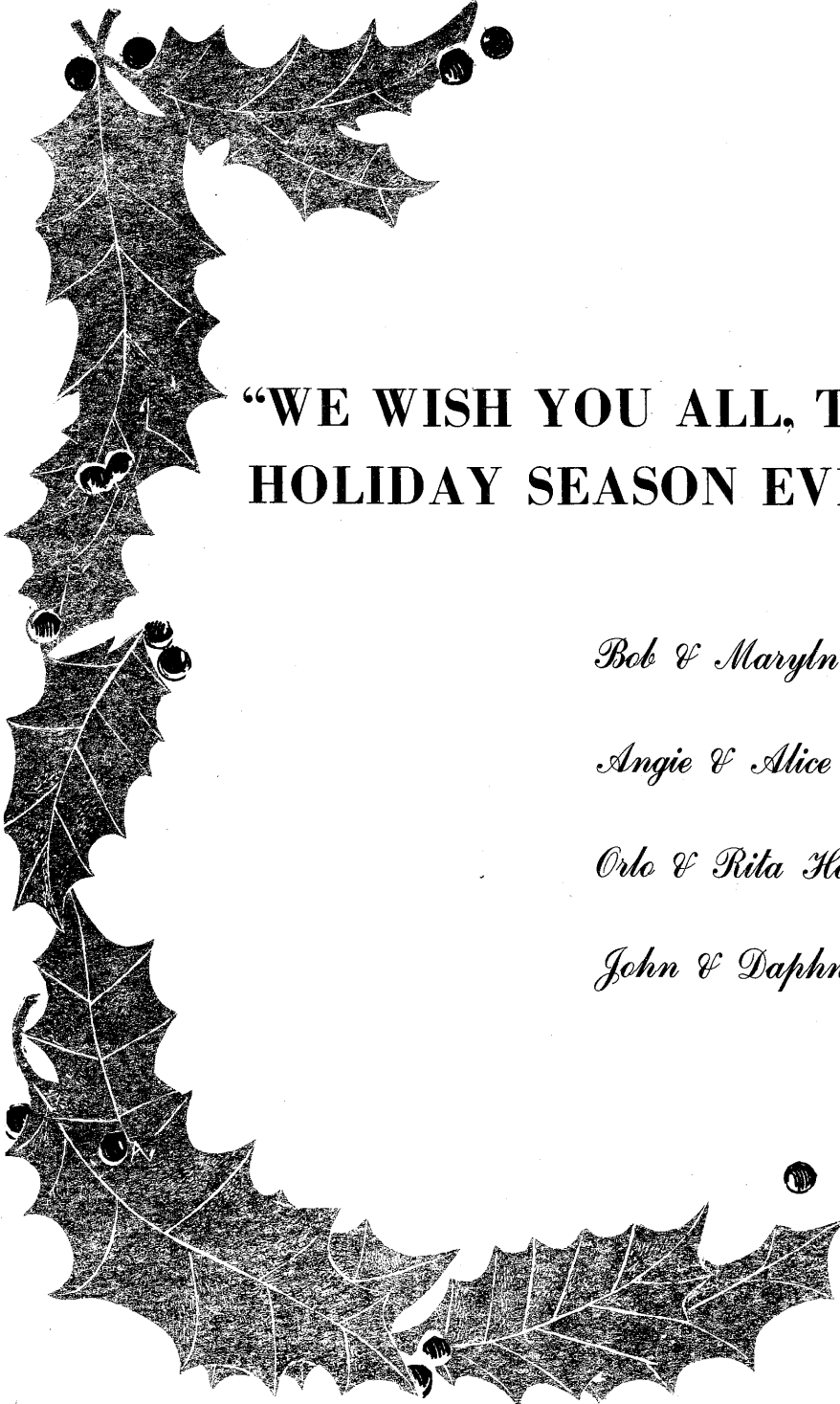

Caller Profile

AL OVERSLAUGH



"As a dancer I never realized what a caller has gone through. That first year was the hardest because there was so much to learn so quickly!" Al Overslaugh also says, "Callers are always learning, no matter how long they have been calling. Right now calling is a hobby, but it will supplement my income after retirement."

Al's greatest enjoyment is starting with new people and watching them develop and gain confidence as they progress. Al feels that in order to keep square dancing alive and healthy we must all (Plus dancers, Advanced, and Challenge dancers) help new people, help new people, help new people and support the home club first.

A successful dance is dancers having a good time and not being afraid to show it. Al's calling goals are to become good at calling and be able to give dancers a good dance so that they would like to come again and again.

Al and Evelyn, his wife of thirty-three years, graduated from square dance class in 1974. Back problems six years ago forced Evelyn to slow up on round dancing. Al had all the equipment and wanted to stay in the activity so he began calling squares in 1983. That summer he taught the Plus movements to a group of graduates, and that fall had the class for Geneva Friendship Squares. Al still does the class for Friendships and this year formed a caller-run club, The Harmony Squares.

Al has attended callers' school and belongs to the Callers' Co-op of Rochester. The Seneca Silhouettes round dance club and two square dance clubs still benefit from the Overslaughs' round dance expertise.



SPOTLIGHT on Village Squares

In 1974, a group of people were having such a good time square dancing together that they decided to form a club. Today member couples of the Village Squares, that group established twelve years ago, belong to a vital, enthusiastic, and growing square dance club...and they are having fun. That's what the Village Squares is all about!

One of the eight couples from the original group is still dancing with the Village Squares. Carl and Ida Bundschuh remember being part of two squares of people feeling a need for a workshop to help them dance at club level. These people, an offshoot of Genesee Dancers, joined Dick Casper's workshop in the First Presbyterian Church at East Rochester and called themselves the "Rough Edges". By the end of that first summer, they elected to establish a Board of Directors and change their name to the Village Squares. In 1978 the Village Squares moved to the First United Methodist Church in Fairport where the club still meets at 8:00 pm each Wednesday night from September through May.

Frank and Norma Salvagio were the first club presidents, starting a succession of couples who helped carry on the spirit of that original group. Among past presidents are Chuck and Rita Meyers, Joe and Anna Jean Caracci, Larry and Ann Bartlett, Al and Joan Siegl, Frank and Linda Laciak. Current membership boasts thirty couples who pride themselves on the versatility of their skills as Dick continues to stress all-position dancing - a technique he emphasizes as early as beginning sessions in each year's fledgling class. His diligence hasn't gone unnoticed in the Rochester area. Three of his graduates, Jeff Elmore, Bud Hands, and Mike Herne, went on to establish themselves as callers in their own right, and many of his graduates have gone on to dance the Advanced and Challenge Programs.

Over the years, the Village Squares dancers have participated in many community demonstrations to promote Western style square dancing. Two of the most notable times were one on the longest running TV talk show in Rochester history, the Eddie Meath Show (an early morning production of Channel 10), and the other a dance held on a barge in celebration of the 1976 bicentennial. In the mid-70's, an article was published about the Village Squares in Upstate Magazine, a publication issued weekly in the Democrat and Chronicle.

Class lessons are given on Monday nights, also in the church hall at 8:00 pm, starting couples on this exhilarating hobby they can pursue upon graduation at any Mainstream program dance throughout the world. People interested in joining the Plus Program dancers of the Village Squares are encouraged to participate in a Summer Workshop to raise their expertise and make dancing more comfortable in the fall. Over the past several years, Dick has made this workshop available in Fairport.

Weekly club dances are open to any couples who dance the Plus Program. Upcoming special events, some of which will include both Class and Club members, are the annual December Holiday Dinner Dance and Auction, Valentine potluck, Class Dance, and Trail's End.

RULES FOR
BANNER STEALING

1. Clubs wishing to take part in Banner Stealing must register with the local Banner Stealing Association of the Rochester Area Federation.
2. Those clubs registering with the Association must have at least one miniature Traveling Banner that will be used for stealing.
3. In order to steal a member club's banner, the Stealing (visiting) Club must have at least four couples (one square), who have paid the visitors fee at the Host Club. A representative of the Stealing Club must then make it known to the President of the Host Club that they are attending the dance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's banner.
4. In the event that more than one club is in attendance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's only available banner, it will be the duty of the President of the Host Club to determine some fair way to choose which of the Stealing Clubs will be awarded the banner.
5. Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve said banner by sending no less than four couples to the Stealing Club's dance and then they can take their banner back home. If a retrieving club also wishes to steal the banner of their hosts, they must then have a second four couples in order to be eligible.
6. At no time can a member club allow any other club to take a banner belonging to a third club. Also, when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the receiving club's duty to safeguard at all times the banner they have stolen. If said banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three months), the banner should be returned to the owning club.
7. Banner stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so designate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than the regular club caller shall be a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated.

A very special rich-looking dangle is available to dancers who dance with 25 callers and get their signatures in the Silver Club booklet. At least 15 of the callers must be Federation callers. A Federation caller is either:

1. One who is a regular caller or class teacher for a Federation club, or
2. One who is a member of the Callers' Cooperative of Rochester.

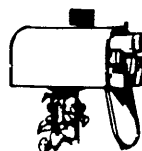
Up to 10 out of the 25 signatures may be visiting callers at Dance-0-Rama, or at a dance of any Federation club. Just any out-of-town caller you may dance to at an out-of-town or non-Federation dance is not eligible to go into your Silver Club booklet (but we hope you will get their signatures in your Century Club booklet).

Eligible callers were listed on the back cover of the booklet when it was printed, but there have been some changes since then. For instance, Jack Barnes has become the regular caller for the Country Twirlers in place of Jim McQuade, so Jack is OK but Jim no longer qualifies to be one of the 15 local callers. If you already have a Silver Club booklet with signatures of callers who used to be Federation callers but aren't any more, their signatures are still good. Here is a list of the currently-eligible local callers:
