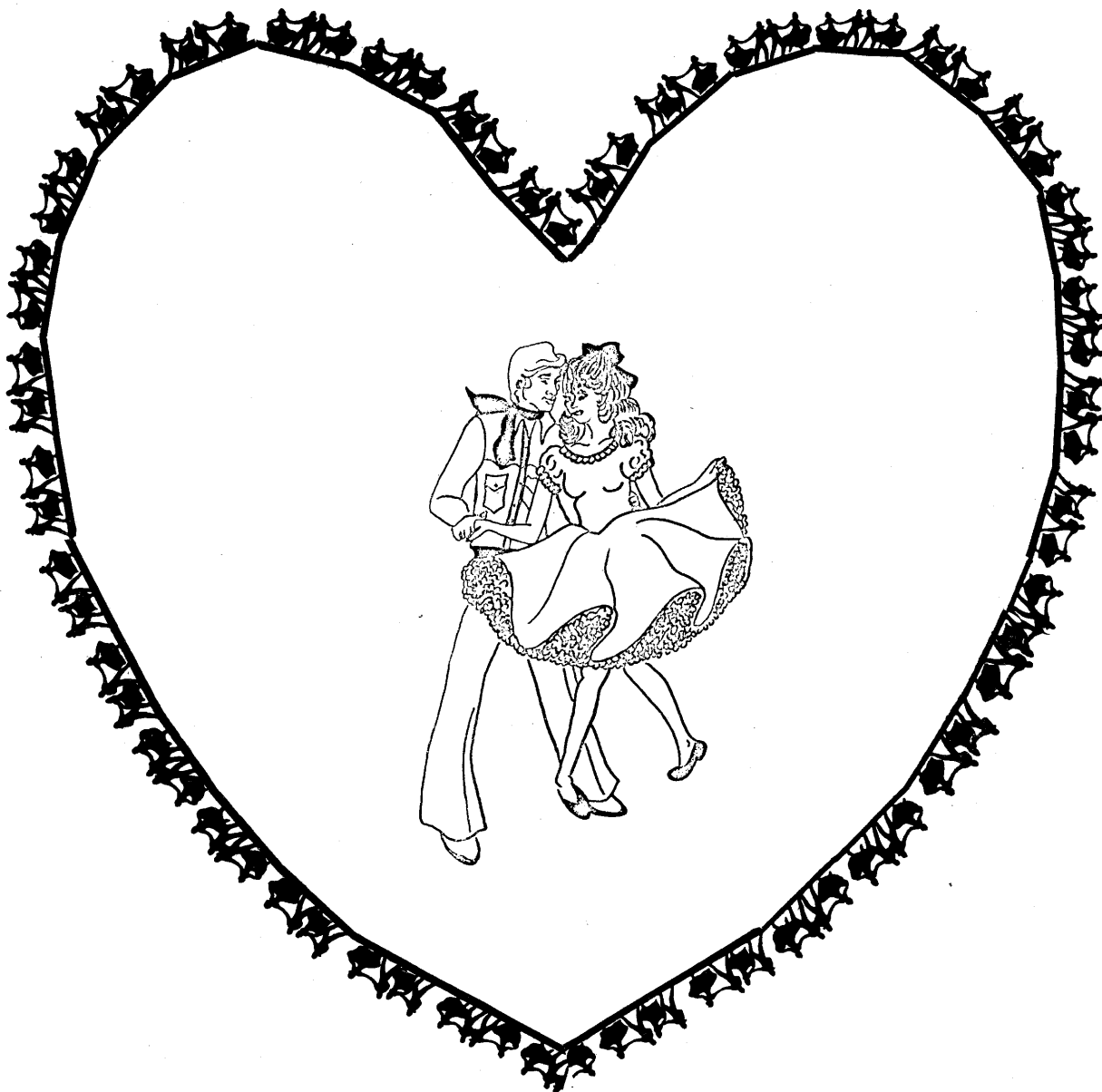

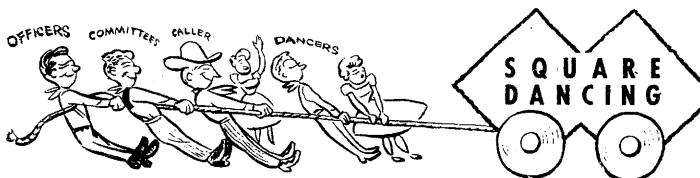

BOB AND JEANNETTE MEAGHER

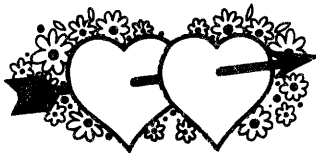

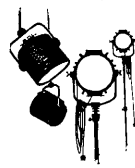

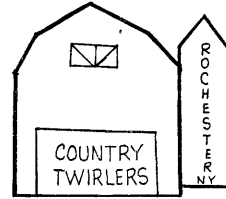

SPOTLIGHT ON



It was the fall of 1959 with "Tink" Tinkler as our teacher and caller. The place of the dance was Chili Grange Hall with twenty couples as members. A nominating committee was formed and presented the first officers for our club. We needed a name. Because we danced in the rural grange hall, the "Country Twirlers" was voted as the most fit name for our club. Mrs. "Tink" then proceeded to design the familiar red barn and silo, which was adopted as the club badge.

The year 1960 saw the start of a tradition - Bob Brunshidle teaching the beginner's class. A total of seven couples graduated from the first class into the Country Twirlers club. We soon outgrew the grange hall and had to move to Florence Brasser School through the sponsorship of Chili Recreation Committee.

In September of 1964, forty-four couples were members with Bill Bartsch calling. In 1965-1966 year, the Twirlers moved to their present home, Washington Irving School.

Jim McQuade and Frank Davenport of Buffalo shared most of the club calling in the 1966-1967 year. Jim continued to call for us. In 1980 we completed twenty years of dancing as a club with about fifty-five couples as members. In 1982, the club got the word that Jim McQuade had decided to retire. Jim and Gert were with us for sixteen years.

Jack Barnes was then invited to be our caller. Jack and Joan were with us as we celebrated our 25th Anniversary, making your club one of the four original clubs to have danced twenty-five years.

The club has enjoyed many activities together: campouts, mystery rides, demonstrations, trail-end dinners, holiday parties, etc. We have about thirty dances a year at the Washington Irving School with both square and round dancing on Saturday nights. All of this experience has helped us to be one of the most popular clubs in the area. Come dance with us.

WHAT IS THE FEDERATION?

Once upon a time there were five regular square-dance clubs in the Rochester area, plus one club for experienced dancers only, one for teen-agers, and one round-dance club. Their names were Genesee Dancers, Belles and Beaus, Swingin' Eights, Country Twirlers, Irondequoit Squares, Rollaways, Teen Twirlers, and Fiddle-A-Rounds.

In 1959 folks from these clubs got together and decided that it would be fun to put on an afternoon-and-evening dance, so that the dancers from the different clubs could meet each other and enjoy dancing together. Thus was born the first Dance-0-Rama. They danced in two halls in Cutler Union, and the dancing in the two halls was labeled Easy Level and Club Level.

The first Dance-0-Rama was very successful: the dancers enjoyed it, even some folks from the Buffalo area, and it made enough profit to have seed money for another one, next year.

Later that year a committee of members from the various clubs and folks that had been active in producing Dance-0-Rama decided that what was needed was a formal organization, to take charge of the funds, to make arrangements for another D-0-R next year, to be a forum where representatives of the clubs could communicate with each other about matters of mutual concern, and to be the means by which the individual clubs might cooperate in any other activities for the good of square dancing. And this was the birth of the Rochester Area Federation of Western Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., known familiarly as the RAF or "the Federation."

The outstanding leaders from this time were Waldo and Bea Westwater, who were active in the formation of the Teen Twirlers, Genesee Dancers, and the Federation. Waldo is still living in Rochester, although no longer dancing nor active in square-dance affairs. One part of the legacy of the Westwaters is that the Federation has always been an organization of dancers, just as the clubs in the area have been mostly dancer-run clubs, rather than caller-run clubs. (To find out which is which, just ask the question "Who can fire the caller?")

Later, in 1962, publication of the **Promenader** was begun. One of its most important purposes was to list the clubs' dancing schedules for the convenience of dancers who wanted to visit other clubs besides their own. The story of the **Promenader** and its development into the fine magazine that it is today is one that will be told at a different time.

One of the outstanding activities of the Federation was the making of a commercial for television in 1982, under the direction of Shirley Shaw. Mike Callahan called and twenty-five squares of dancers sweated under the TV lights at Cutler Union to make the commercial. Other activities have included the publication, in 1971 and 1977, of a booklet "A Guidebook for Square Dancers," and the sponsorship in 1982 of the Silver Club, to encourage dancers to expand their experience by visiting other clubs and other callers than their own.

One of the recent major developments in Federation affairs is the affiliation, in 1984, with the United Square Dancers of America. Through this affiliation the Federation not only has a voice in the doings of a national square-dancers' organization, but also is able to furnish the clubs of the Federation with reasonably-priced liability insurance. In these days, insurance is getting to be more and more important.

By its Constitution and Bylaws the Federation may not have any voice in the affairs of its affiliated clubs, except for the following conditions:

1. To be eligible for affiliation with the Federation, the club must have been actively operating for at least one year; and
2. Federation representatives must be elected by the dancing membership of a club, or appointed by an elected officer. The basic idea is that the representatives must not be selected by the caller of a caller-run club, but by the dancing members.

WHAT IS THE 'CCR'?

In 1962 a group of Rochester-area callers and round-dance teachers formed an organization named the Rochester Callers' Association. Membership was limited to working callers and cuers. The only members of the original group who are still active in local square-dancing are Mike and Mary Prado and Myron and Peg Huss. The RCA had become inactive by the end of the decade.

In 1970 another organization was formed. This one is still in existence, and its name is the Callers' Cooperative of Rochester, usually referred to as Callers' Co-Op. Its membership has always been open to any person who is considering becoming a caller, or even has enough interest in the doings of callers to pay his/her dues and take an active part in the group's activities. Its purpose is to promote mutual communication and education among the callers of the area. Round dance teachers and cuers are also welcome, even though most of those who did not have a direct interest in square dancing dropped their memberships after the first few years.

At the beginning the group had the benefit of advice and teaching by a caller who had more experience than the others, Tom Trainor, and the benefit of the organizing abilities of Chuck and Gerry Prister. The group originally was very loosely organized; all affairs were handled by two persons who were known as Moderators, and the moderators were selected by an informal consensus of the members from those who were willing to take on the responsibilities of the job.

The first two moderators were Chuck Prister and Bill Wilcox. In 1975 the financial affairs of CCR were turned over to a Treasurer, and still later a formal set of Bylaws was adopted, providing for alternating two-year terms for the two moderators. The Senior Moderator this year is Orlo Hoadley, filling the unexpired term of Jon McNally, and Jody Mattice is the Junior Moderator. Rita Hoadley is taking care of the treasury. Myron and Peg Huss are still members, and have taken an active part in CCR doings from the beginning.

Membership in the CCR is strictly voluntary. There are callers for Federation clubs who live within the area of the Federation, and others who live elsewhere, who do not choose to belong to the CCR.

The Fall Fun-Fest was a Sunday afternoon/evening dance festival for giving the Rochester dancers and the CCR callers the benefits of exposure to each other. The first Fun-Fest was held in Irondequoit High School and the proceeds were used to pay legal fees of a state-wide fight contesting a ruling of the State Sales Tax Commission that not only were dance admissions taxable, but taxes for the last three years were collectable from the officers of the clubs during those years. After the first year the Fun-Fest was held at the Al Sigl center, and the profits were turned over to them in return for the use of their building. The Fun-Fest was eventually discontinued because of falling attendance.

Several years ago the CCR started to issue to club officers and leaders invitations to the February meeting, to discuss with the callers problems of square dancing and square-dance organizations. After the first two, the annual Leadership Meeting became a joint project of the CCR and the Federation. These meetings are not restricted to any particular persons, but are open (at no cost) to anyone who is interested.

The current schedule is for the CCR to meet on the afternoon of the first Sunday of the month on October and November, and from January through May (in December they have their own Christmas party). The meeting place is the Covenant United Methodist Church on Culver Road, and the time is 2:00-5:30 pm. Any closed meeting will be announced in advance. Otherwise, if you are interested you are invited to attend, and bring along any questions that you'd like to discuss with the callers.
