

LES BRADT

"Who is this guy?" a challenge dancer from Buffalo whispered to me during the ceremony at Dance-O-Rama. "He really has the beat. How come we never heard of him?" Those attending Dance-O-Rama know this dancer was talking about Les Bradt. It was a real treat to watch the Swinging Squares, a preteen group, demonstrate what they can do as a result of Les Bradt's teaching. Les and Jan are also getting a teen group started in the Webster area.

Les, who also teaches class for Lima Grand Squares, has been a caller for about seventeen years. One of the most delightful things about being a caller, Les says, is the contact he has with people, giving them a good time. 

## LIMA GRAND SQUARES

On the New Year's Eve that opened the decade of the 60's, a group of friends -- Ollerenshaws, Holmeses, Nunemakers, and Nichols, were gathered at the home of Howard and Joyce Greene to ring in the New Year. They had such a good time dancing to a record called "Grand Squares" that they decided to form a club to dance regularly. Don Stumbo was teaching a class of Eastern square dancing at the Lima High School, but he suggested they try Western square dancing and agreed to be their teacher. With the support of Don and his wife Liz, the Lima Grand Squares dance club was born, named after the record played that fateful New Year's Eve night.

A year later, in 1961, the Lima club went official and rented the dining room at the Lima Town Hall to

accommodate the growing number of dancers.

The Town Hall was too hot for dancing during the summer. In 1962, to insure continuous Friday night dancing, the club rented The Barn, as it was called in those days. It was indeed a barn, owned by Max and Flossie Rainey and located in East Bloomfield. Club dancers from all over the state munched hot dogs at the wiener roasts, ate juicy watermelon and dug into dishes of ripe strawberries at our strawberry festivals. There was a pond outside the barn and many dancers remember the beauty of a harvest moon reflected in the water.

The joy of dancing in a real country atmosphere was not to last. The Barn's floor had been shored up to stand the stress of dancing, but as time went on the gambrel roof began to leak. During one particularly rainy summer, dancers learned to be careful about where they formed their squares. In 1970, when attendance at the summer dances declined and the club could no longer make expenses, they gave up The Barn. The building is still standing, a part of the memories of those people whose faces light up when they tell about the good times they had dancing there.

In 1975, after fourteen years of calling, Don Stumbo resigned as club caller. That September, Gerry Brady was retained as club caller, but due to a serious illness for which he was hospitalized, he resigned in December. Dick Casper stepped thto the breach, and finished out the year. Bernie Hayward cued rounds. Casper remained Lima Grand Squares' caller until 1984. A pressing schedule led him to resign.

That fall, Gary Bubel consented to take over the position. A year later, Alice, his wife, began to cue rounds. Gary and Alice are still with us and contribute much to making our evenings the friendly, fun-filled nights that they are. Les Bradt, Gerry's brother is currently teaching our class. We look forward to welcoming them as club members.

Through the years, Don Stumbo, Dick Casper, Ron Cole, Gary Bubel, and Les Bradt have successfully taught many devoted dancers to square dance. Thanks to these devoted callers, cuers, and teachers, our club has survived the ups and downs of the square dance movement and is still going strong. Thanks go, too, to our 'old timers, who remain faithful to the Lima Grand Squares.

## THE MAILBOX

Dear Editor

Please explain why round dancers have a problem hearing. (See Jim Ross's Letter to Editor, May '87 issue, pg. 4.) I certainly understand that they can't hear, (I've hear "ssshhhh" enough - even over the mike!) but why can't they hear?

In 13 years of square dancing, I (non-round dancer) have never experienced difficulty hearing the caller because of noise from side lines. I've done two square demos, some distance from speakers, completely surrounded by shoppers and lively children, and not experienced the problem. I've been in a square when all the rest of the people were not dancing and never experienced it. So why do round dancers experience it? Is the volume turned down, if so why? Is the cuer less articulate, is it the mix, sound system, singing on the record?

Is it really conversations — even lively ones — in the back of the hall? If so, should we squelch friendly enthusiastic conversations? The social aspect of square dancing is a large percentage of its enjoyment. Fortunately the round dancers in my club have no problem hearing in spite of our chatter. If I had to choose between rounds and sociability, I'd find a club without rounds!

Dear Editor,

In recent issues of the **Promenader** a number of the clubs list their dances as 'MP' or 'PM'. It seems like these clubs are not familiar with the Callerlab definitions of Mainstream and Plus. Callerlab defines Mainstream as a dance where the caller may use any and every call on the Mainstream list, without having to workshop any. In the same way, Plus is supposed to mean a dance where the caller can use all calls on the Plus list and all of the Mainstream calls. So putting both an 'M' and a 'P' on a dance listing is meaningless, and confuses the reader instead of informing him/her.

I suspect that doing this is a try at defining a kind of dance that Callerlab has not seen fit to provide for: Mainstream and using a few of the more popular Plus calls, and some workshopping on Plus and "Quarterly Selection" calls. This type of dancing has been called "Soft Plus" and "Green Plus" (versus "Blue Plus") in other places. There aren't very many clubs in the Federation that dance Plus by the Callerlab definition.

Maybe it would be a good idea to bring up this matter at a Federation meeting, and perhaps decide on a way to label dances that would be understood by everybody in the Federation. An explanation of the label should be printed in every issue of the **Promenader** for the benefit of out-of-town visitors and anybody else who may not have got the word about it the first time around. I'll start the ball rolling by suggesting that "Soft Plus" dances should be labeled 'Mp', using little 'p' instead of capital 'P'.

## Carmen's Column

MAKING THE PLUS PROGRAM PALATABLE -by Jerry Carmen

At the beginning of the dance season, I asked all the local callers I met, "What calls in the PLUS list do you generally expect most of your floor to execute without much trouble and without any walk-thrus". What I hoped to get - and I got - was a curtailed list of calls I will refer to as the "Popular Plus Program". Keep in mind this is not a CALLERLAB program, but a list of selected calls I hope will be useful to callers doing a guest spot and maybe something clubs could provide out-of-town callers when they ask, "What are you

dancing?".

It should be pretty general knowledge by now that most clubs dance a part of the PLUS program, but very few dance it all. This limitation is due to several factors. Primarily, clubs know calls the Caller likes to call. Another reason is, there is simply not enough time to learn the program adequately before we must start accomodating our new graduates. Also, there is a significant number of members who have no desire to workshop more calls and want a change of pace be just doing a little dancing and socializing. I do not think this is bad, but simply reflects the varying reasons why people dance at all.

The list I have formulated is a combination of calls that callers like to call and dancers like to dance (in general). By that I mean, callers and dancers alike enjoy calls that do not have to be perpetually walked thru and present a reasonable amount of challenge

and feeling of accomplishment.

It is my hope that area clubs will look at this list and say, "Yeah, that's what we dance. Let's tell our caller this is what we want to learn FIRST, if he must teach something."

So ladies and gentlemen, without further ado,

here's the list!





## Country Dancers of Rochester

Now that D-O-R is memory, Country Dancers hope that many of you will want to visit us some Thursday night at our regular dance. Remember that you can bring your friends— even the ones that have not had square dance lessons. I guess the main thing to remember is that the dancing is active (we do a lot of swinging) so lots of energy is required.

At our dances we rarely have a chance to give "the rules of the road" unless a problem persists. Now and then we "write up" hints in our newsletter. Experienced contra dancers like being at the head of a line. (Rather like square dancers that like to be in front of the caller). Probably the most important rule when forming a line is to add on the end——not to squeeze into the middle or (heaven forbid) add on the top. It is all right to start a new line if you notice that the one already started is long.

Rule #2 is that once a dance has started, never leave the line. In a square dance, leaving would mean 7 other people could not dance. In a contra line it would mean that 20 or 30 people would be left high and dry. There is one exception. If you find the dance has too much swinging—or you feel ill, wait until you and your partner reach the foot of the line and during the sequence you are waiting out, you can both leave.

Some square dancers have questions about the contra formation. After walking thru a dance, the caller generally will ask you to return to where you started. (This is so you can do the dance to the music with the people you were first with). There is a difference between the beginning of the dance and forming a contra line. Square dances "form up" by establising a square somewhere in the room. Contra dancers "line up" by forming lines up and down the hall--men in the line to the callers right (as seen by the caller) and women to the left. While a "proper" dance will leave you this way, most dances today begin "crossed over". That is, 1-3-5 and every odd couple change places with their partner. When the caller asks you to "erase"--or "go back to the beginning"--this crossed over position in a duple improper dance is the spot where you return. In the "duple" dances you will be dancing across the set from your partner and with other couples--progressing towards or away from the caller. Lines alternate men and women.


